Introduction To The Book of Philippians

- Those IN CHRIST can HAVE TRUE JOY & PEACE:
 - Regardless of our past (our sins or what others have done to us)
 - Regardless of our circumstances (Our physical or material condition or how others are mistreating us)

Philippians 1:3–11 (NKJV)

³ I thank my God upon every remembrance of you, 4 always in every prayer of mine making request for you all with joy, 5 for your fellowship in the gospel from the first day until now, 6 being confident of this very thing, that He who has begun a good work in you will complete it until the day of Jesus

Philippians 1:3–11 (NKJV)

7 just as it is right for me to think this of you all, because I have you in my heart, inasmuch as both in my chains and in the defense and confirmation of the gospel, you all are partakers with me of grace. 8 For God is my witness, how greatly I long for you all with the affection of Jesus Christ.

Philippians 1:3–11 (NKJV)

9 And this I pray, that your love may abound still more and more in knowledge and all discernment, 10 that you may approve the things that are excellent, that you may be sincere and without offense till the day of Christ, 11 being filled with the fruits of righteousness which are by Jesus Christ, to the glory and praise of God.




- Found memories: (3)
 - ▶ Lydia: Acts 16:14,15
 - ▶ Imprisoned: Acts 16:16-24
 - ▶ Jailor: Acts 16:25-34
 - No details of later visit
- Fvery prayer: (4) Paul frequently and joyfully prayed for those with whom he had labored in the past 'making request for them vs. 4; cf. Col 1:3; IThes. 1:2




- For their fellowship in the gospel: (5)
 - Includes the "giving and receiving" when he first left Macedonia, and also in Thessalonica Phili 4:15-16
 - And now in Rome, w/ the gift sent by Epaphroditus -Philippians 4:18
 - Sharing together in spreading the Word, by teaching or by supporting those who teach.

THANKFUL FOR THEIR FELLOWSHIP (3-8)




Being confident: (6)

- ▶ God began a good work in them at their conversion.
- Their past (and up to the present) indicated they were serious about serving God and would continue to do so, especially in the light of the fact that this faithful service had been given even during a time of persecution (1:27-30; cf. Hebrews 6:9-10)




- Will complete it: (6)
 - Paul was confident that the Philippians would never waiver in their generosity, and would never cease sharing their good gifts to help spread the gospel
- Until the day of Christ: (6)
 - With God's help, their efforts would bear fruit until Jesus comes again 2:16; 1 Thes 5:2; 2 Pet 3:10



- It is right for me to think this: (7)
- ▶ I am justified in having this confidence - They were dear to Paul for they had been a great help & encouragement to him in trials - cf. Phili 1:29,30; 2:25; 4:14-19)
- You all are partakers with me of grace: (7)
 - ▶ Paul's main concern was the spreading & defense of the gospel - same with them. /\

THANKFUL FOR THEIR FELLOWSHIP (3-8)



How I long for you: (8)

- Some relationships are due to common interests and sympathies. However, those which are most sacred and abiding are those which are due to a common relationship with Christ, and to an earnest cooperation in work undertaken for His sake I The. 2:8; 2 Tim. I:4
- ▶ Paul's affection for them was patterned after the love of Jesus - Col. 3:12-14

PRAYER FOR THEIR FAITHFULNESS (9-11)

Philippians 1:9-11 (NKJV) 9 And this I pray, that your love may abound still more and more in knowledge and all discernment, 10 that you may approve the things that are excellent, that you may be sincere and without offense till the day of Christ, 11 being filled with the fruits of righteousness which are by Jesus Christ, to the glory and praise of God.


- And this I pray: (9)
 - ▶ The apostle continually prays (present tense)
 - Paul was a praying man.
 his brethren were ever in his petitions to God. -Rom. I:9. Eph. I:15; Col. I:9,10; I The. I:2; etc.
 - ▶ The substance of the prayers mentioned in 1:3-4 is now disclosed.


PRAYER FOR THEIR FAITHFULNESS (9-11)

- Approve the things that are excellent (10)
- That you may be sincere [genuine, pure] (10)
- Without offense (10)
- ▶ Filled with fruits of righteousness (11)

Acts 16:11–15 (NKJV)

¹¹ Therefore, sailing from Troas, we ran a straight course to Samothrace, and the next day came to Neapolis, 12 and from there to Philippi, which is the foremost city of that part of Macedonia, a colony. And we were staying in that city for some days. 13 And on the Sabbath day we went out of the city to the riverside, where prayer was customarily made; and we sat down and spoke to the women who met there.

Acts 16:11–15 (NKJV)

14 Now a certain woman named Lydia heard us. She was a seller of purple from the city of Thyatira, who worshiped God. The Lord opened her heart to heed the things spoken by Paul. 15 And when she and her household were baptized, she begged us, saying, "If you have judged me to be faithful to the Lord, come to my house and stay." So she persuaded us.
