

¹¹ Wisdom *is* good with an inheritance, And profitable to those who see the sun. ¹² For wisdom *is* a defense *as* money *is* a defense, But the excellence of knowledge *is that* wisdom gives life to those who have it.

Ecclesiastes 7:1–14 (NKJV)

¹ A good name is better than precious ointment, And the day of death than the day of one's birth; ² Better to go to the house of mourning Than to go to the house of feasting, For that is the end of all men; And the living will take it to heart. ³ Sorrow is better than laughter, For by a sad countenance the heart is made better. ⁴ The heart of the wise is in the house of mourning, But the heart of fools is in the house of mirth.

Ecclesiastes 7:1–14 (NKJV)

⁵ It is better to hear the rebuke of the wise Than for a man to hear the song of fools. 6 For like the crackling of thorns under a pot, So is the laughter of the fool. This also is vanity. ⁷ Surely oppression destroys a wise man's reason, And a bribe debases the heart. 8 The end of a thing is better than its beginning; The patient in spirit is better than the proud in spirit. 9 Do not hasten in your spirit to be angry, For anger rests in the bosom of fools.


Ecclesiastes 7:1–14 (NKJV)


"THE BETTER LIFE"

Some of these Koheleth now sets forth in proverbial form












HONOR IS BETTER THAN LUXURY (7:1A)




Value of a good reputation – (1a)

- It is good when men think well of us due to our honesty and integrity Prov 22:1; (influence tied to reputation)
- It is more important what God thinks of us!! Heb 11; Luke 10:20;
- An expensive perfume may help you smell better, but good character causes you to be better & do good.





DEATH IS BETTER THAN BIRTH - (7:1B)




The value of death - (7:1b)

- The day of one's birth is the beginning of many sorrows Job 14:1; 3:1-3; Jer 20:14-18
- But for the righteous, the day of one's death is the beginning of eternal bliss! Isa 57:1-2; Ph 1:21-22; Re 14:13
- Of course the day of death for the wicked is not better Mat. 26:24; Mark 14:21;


The value of mourning (7:2)

- What is seen in the house of mourning?
 - Ourselves Heb 9:27; Ps89:48; Eccl 3:20


The value of sorrow (7:3)

- Laughter may have its place, but sorrow is superior to making the heart better Ps 119:67,71; 126:2; Heb 12:11
- Laughter provides a temporary reprieve from the burdens of life but sorrow encourages us to make positive changes


The value of wisdom (7:4)

- The wise CONSIDERS:
 - The frailty of life James 4:14; Job 7:6, 7; Ps. 89:47; 90:5–7; 102:3. Is. 38:12
 - Himself in view of deaths looming reality Heb 9:27
 - What he must do to prepare for death NOW! 2 Cor 6:2; Heb 3:13





REBUKE IS BETTER THAN A SONG - (7:5-6)




The Value of Rebuke (7:5–7)

- Solemn rebuke is not pleasant. No one likes to hear it. Yet Koheleth argues that "it is better to hear the rebuke of the wise than for a man to hear the song of fools." Gal. 2:11
- A real friend helps you see your faults – Psalm 141:5





REBUKE IS BETTER THAN A SONG - (7:5-6)




The Value of Rebuke (7:5–7)

- In that region where wood was scarce, thorns, hay and stubble were used for fuel.
- The song of fools is like that. It is loud short & leaves nothing of lasting value It is therefore "vanity"
- Flattery nor thorns possess any useful purpose! 1 Thes 2:5





PATIENCE IS BETTER THAN YIELDING - (7:7-10)




The Value of resistance (7:7)

- Solomon warns us that adversity and prosperity offer many temptations to abandon a wise lifestyle and to live like a fool.
 - By oppression we may surrender to the PRESENT difficulty & forfeit long term blessings Mat 13:20,21
 - The opportunity for QUICK reward may tempt us to forfeit our principles Prov. 17:8, 23





THE END IS BETTER THAN THE BEGINNING (7:8-10)




The Value of Perseverance (7:8)

- The end of a thing is the 'goal' set out to be reached in the beginning! Ps. 126:5,6
- Understood when applied to building a house, Training for a sporting event, any undesirable task! Lk 14:28-33
- Anything of value takes time, effort and patience to gain! Jame 5:11


The Value of Contentment (7:9,10)


The Value of Contentment (7:9,10)

- Fools aren't willing to do the hard stuff to gain the valuable prize instead they lose their cool James 1:19; Prov. 16:32; Est. 3:5,6
- It is not wise to live in the past (not to disparage the value of memories, but cannot change past)
- We must live in the present and be content Num 11:5; Phili 4:11; 2 Cor 4:18





WISDOM IS BETTER THAN WEALTH (7:11-12)




The Value of Wisdom (7:11,12)

- Both wisdom and inherited wealth are good BUT wisdom is far better (Prov 8:11)
 - Wisdom & money are said to be a defense – (having money when needed is important)
 - But only WISDOM can give life!!! — Prov 3:13-23





RESIGNATION IS BETTER THAN INDIGNATION (7:13-14)




The Value of Humility (7:13-14)

 - We need to learn & understand the difference.




