New research shows there's been a sharp spike in cases of major depression in the United States in recent years, especially among teens and millennials.

The Blue Cross Blue Shield Association analysis of medical claims data showed that the overall rate of major depression was 4.4 percent and that diagnosis rates rose 33 percent between 2013 and 2016. Those rates increased 63 percent among teens and 47 percent among millennials. ... "Major depression diagnoses are growing quickly, especially for adolescents and millennials," said Trent Haywood, senior vice president and chief medical officer for Blue Cross Blue Shield.

- Solomon has said to enjoy life by eating & drinking (2:24; 3:13; 8:15; 9:7), enjoying marital bliss (9:9), & finding satisfaction in one's work (2:24; 3:22; 5:18).
- Now "follow the impulses of your heart & the desires of your eyes," 11:9; nasb). BUT REMEMBER God will judge.

- Nothing here is encouraging a young man to engage in sinful or irresponsible activities. In fact, such activities deprive life of real and true joy (Titus 3:3).
- If God's will governs our desires & goals then joy will be the result of our labor & efforts.

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

- "remove sorrow" from his "heart." (ka'as) refers to low spirits or discontent with existing circumstances.
- These feelings are to be put away from the mind by a deliberate act of the will. One must force himself to think positively.


Get RID of Things That Destroy TRUE JOY (11:10)

- Second, he must "put away" evil from his "flesh." it is moral evil which is in view here.
- In his enjoyment of life the youth must not defile his body with carnal sins which arouse God's anger.
- Foolishness in youth can follow you for the rest of your life!!!

- "For childhood and youth are vanity." This time of youth soon passes away; the capacity for enjoyment is soon curtailed.
- Therefore one should use these years aright, remembering they are short. "Vanity" here means "fleeting" as in 7:15 and 9:9.

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- Remember now your Creator in the days of your youth
 - Youth is often known for demanding 'rights', resisting & questioning authority, including God's authority.
 - There is great temptation to concentrate on earthly goals careers, possessions, & the quest for fun & excitement taking young people away from God.

Remember now your Creator in the days of your youth

- Young people, (people in their 20's, 30's and 40's), need to remember that all they are and all they have is due to the fact that there is a God.
- The days of strength and vigor are when you can really accomplish something for God, spreading the gospel, doing good deeds, etc...(Titus 2:14)





THE FUNDAMENTAL ADMONITION (12:1A)

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- Remember now your Creator in the days of your youth
 - Youth is THE ideal time to commit ourselves fully to God:
 - Youth is when self-surrender is easiest, but a life lived for self can harden the heart.
 - Will we squander the days of our strength? Or will we give God the best of our youth?
 - The time of strength ends!





THE TIME OF OLD AGE (12:1B-7)

Ecclesiastes 12:1b,2 Before the difficult days come, And the ears draw near when you say, "I have no pleasure in them? While the sun and the light, The moon and the stars, Are not darkened. nd the clouds do not return after the rain

- General Description of Old Age (12:1b–2)
 - The reference is to the grievances, inconveniences and afflictions of old age.
 - As time marches on the bad days outnumber the good days. Bad days become bad years ...
 - Older people find it more difficult to find pleasure in life.





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- General Description of Old Age (12:1b–2)
 - NO PLEASURE Especially, if one hasn't chosen to serve God, the supposed "golden years" can turn out to be very depressing.
 - One cannot be a miserable and selfish child, teenager, 20,30,40, etc., year-old and then expect to enjoy the final years of your life on earth.





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- General Description of Old Age (12:1b–2)
 - "The following metaphors all describe the deterioration of the body as old age comes on" (Garrett p. 341).
 - Our productiveness might end a good number of years prior to our actual death. How long will you be productive? How long really do you have to serve God effectively?





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- General Description of Old Age (12:1b–2)
 - The picture is of darkened days - not just the loss of sight, but the loss of effectiveness, of vitality -
 - Symbolic of trouble. "one storm succeeds another" (P. P. Comm. p. 297). - old age brings one complication or problem after another.





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- (1) "the keepers of the house shall tremble." metaphor for the hands and arms In old age they tremble.
- (2) "The men of power shall bow themselves." These are a metaphor for the legs which become feeble and bent.
- (3) "The grinders cease because they are few." the teeth can no longer perform grind the food.





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- (4) "Those that look out of the windows be darkened." The eyes are impaired with age. (12:3).
- (5) "The doors shall be shut in the streets." loss of hearing or loss of participation w/ outside.
- (6) The old man "rises to the bird's voice." This is usually taken to be a reference to the light sleep of the old man. or the voice becomes weak





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- (7) "And the daughters of music shall be brought low." — "these cheerful evidences of a living world about us grow remote and faint; one feels no longer fully part of it" (Kidner p. 103).
- (8) Also they are afraid of height, And of terrors in the way; (vs. 5) The aged are often afraid of falling & feel unsafe, incapable of self-protection.





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- (9) When the almond tree blossoms, [5] Hair turn white
- (10) The grasshopper is a burden, — "the body being bent and one's walk being slowed" BKC -
- (11) And desire fails all desires, physical and mental, die down, - loss of appetite, whether for food, or a loss of sexual desire.


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- Even aged Christians can feel that they are isolated from the world and even other believers.
- The time to serve God is NOW!
- "For man goes to his eternal home, And the mourners go about the streets." 12:5c

The Finality of Death (12:6)

- Serve God now while you have youth, energy, and vigor! "Seize the day—not for self, but for God" - cf. 12:1
- "silver cord, and golden bowl"
 the reservoir of oil in a lamp When this is broken it becomes useless, the light is extinguished.
- "pitcher by the well" is easily broken Man's life is not only precious, it is fragile.


The Finality of Death (12:6)

- The fourth figure is that of the broken wheel at the cistern.
 - The picture is of a deep well or cistern with an apparatus for drawing water. This apparatus consists of a wheel with a rope upon it, to which was attached a bucket. The wheel fails and falls into the well, the bucket is dashed to pieces, and no water can be drawn.

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2 CHRONICLES 34:1-7 (NKJV)

¹ Josiah was eight years old when he became king, and he reigned thirty-one years in Jerusalem. ² And he did what was right in the sight of the Lord, and walked in the ways of his father David; he did not turn aside to the right hand or to the left. ³ For in the eighth year of his reign, while he was still young, he began to seek the God of his father David; and in the twelfth year he began to purge Judah and Jerusalem of the high places, the wooden images, the carved images, and the molded images.

2 CHRONICLES 34:1-7 (NKJV)

⁴ They broke down the altars of the Baals in his presence, and the incense altars which were above them he cut down; and the wooden images, the carved images, and the molded images he broke in pieces, and made dust of them and scattered it on the graves of those who had sacrificed to them. 5 He also burned the bones of the priests on their altars, and cleansed Judah and Jerusalem. 6 And so he did in the cities of Manasseh, Ephraim, and Simeon, as far as Naphtali and all around, with axes.
