### THE PROPHET NAHUM

- All we know: His name was "Nahum the Elkoshite" (1:1).
- "comfort." The message about the destruction of Nineveh would have been a great comfort to Judah.
- "Elkoshite" suggests that Nahum's hometown was Elkosh, but the site of such a city is unknown. (N. Iraq; Capernaum; Judah 1:15)

### THE BURDEN AGAINST NINEVEH


"The burden" - A heavy weight of doom. Several other Old Testament passages refer to Assyria's fall (Isa. 10:12–19; 14:24–25; 30:31–33; 31:8–9; Ez. 32:22–23; Zep. 2:13–15; Zec. 10:11).


Nineveh is first mentioned in the Bible in Genesis 10:11–12.

Nimrod built several cities in southern Mesopotamia (Gen. 10:8–10) and then "went to Assyria where he built Nineveh, Rehoboth Ir, Calah, and Resen."

### THE BURDEN AGAINST NINEVEH

Jonah preached to Nineveh during the reign of Ashur-dan III (772–754).

Shalmaneser V (727–722) defeated Samaria - 722 B.C., (2 Kg 17:3–6; 18:9–10)

- Twenty-one years later (in 701), Sennacherib invaded Judah 46 Judean towns.
- After encircling Jerusalem, 185,000 of Sennacherib's soldiers were killed (2 Kings 18:17–18; 19:32–36; Isa. 37:36)
- Ashurbanipal captures No Amon (Thebes) in 663 B.C.

#### Nahum 1:2 (NKJV)

### THE BURDEN AGAINST NINEVEH

Nineveh was taken by a coalition of former subject peoples, the Babylonians, Medes, Persians, Chaldeans, Scythians and Cimmerians in 612 BC

The city's ruins are still evident today. The city was easily overtaken when the Khosr River, which flowed through it, overflowed its banks (see Nahum 1:8; 2:6, 8).

### LESSONS FROM NAHUM

- The major lessons found in Nahum is in 1:2-8
- These verses teach us about God: His character, His power and faithfulness cf. Rom 15:4
- The rest of the book makes application to Nineveh which also comforts His people.

# Nahum 1:2-8 (NKJV)

<sup>2</sup> God is jealous, and the Lord avenges; The Lord avenges and is furious. The Lord will take vengeance on His adversaries, And He reserves wrath for His enemies; 3 The Lord is slow to anger and great in power, And will not at all acquit the wicked. The Lord has His way In the whirlwind and in the storm, And the clouds are the dust of His feet. 4 He rebukes the sea and makes it dry, And dries up all the rivers. Bashan and Carmel wither, And the flower of Lebanon

# Nahum 1:2-8 (NKJV)

<sup>5</sup> The mountains quake before Him, The hills melt, And the earth heaves at His presence, Yes, the world and all who dwell in it. 6 Who can stand before His indignation? And who can endure the fierceness of His anger? His fury is poured out like fire, And the rocks are thrown down by Him. <sup>7</sup> The Lord is good, A stronghold in the day of trouble; And He knows those who trust in Him. 8 But with an overflowing flood He will make an utter end of its place, And darkness will pursue His enemies.

### LESSONS: THE NATURE OF GOD

- God is JEALOUS 1:2-3a; Ex. 20:5; Josh. 24:19; Zec. 1:14; 8:2
  - As righteous, God is zealous to protect what belongs to Him (Dt. 6:15; 4:24; 5:9; 32:16, 21)
  - God is zealous to protect His people & what is holy (Jn. 2:17)
  - One becomes the object of God's FURY by despising His people & that which is holy (2 Thes 1:7-9; Heb 10:26-30)

#### Nahum 1:2 (NKJV)

### LESSONS: THE NATURE OF GOD

- He is also an avenging God
  - 1:2; De. 32:35, 42; Ps. 94:1
  - This fact is strongly emphasized, for the word noqem ("avenging") occurs three times in this verse (twice trans. takes vengeance).
  - ▶ God said, "It is Mine to avenge" and "I will take vengeance on My adversaries and repay those who hate Me" (Deut. 32:35, 41).

#### Nahum 1:2 (NKJV)

### LESSONS: THE NATURE OF GOD

- He is also an avenging God
  - 1:2; De. 32:35, 42; Ps. 94:1
  - ▶ God's "vengeance" is not malicious retaliation, but punitive vindication in a judicial sense. (1:2,3)
  - ▶ The coming judgment on Nineveh was their just due in return for her terrible atrocities on various nations including Israel in 722 b.c.



#### Nahum 1:2 (NKJV)

### LESSONS: THE NATURE OF GOD

- He is also an avenging God
  - 1:2; De. 32:35, 42; Ps. 94:1
  - ▶ God avenges His people in that He vindicates their cause (Romans 12:14-21; 1 Thess. 4:6).
  - ▶ Judah's enemies were God's enemies (Deut 32:43; Ps 94:20–23; Is. 49:26. Zec. 2:8).
  - Now much more the enemies of His Son Jesus and those redeemed by Him? (Mt 23:31 -39; 2 Ths. 1:7-9; Rv. 6:10; 16:5,6).

#### Nahum 1:2 (NKJV)

### LESSONS: THE NATURE OF GOD

- God is slow to anger 1:3a; Ps. 103:8; Joel 2:13; Jon. 4:2
  - Although God is slow to anger, and desires men repent, (as in the book of Jonah, around a century earlier), the time of Hispatience has limits (cf. Rom. 2:5-11; 2 Pet 3:9-14)
  - ▶ God will indeed PUNISH the wicked - God "will not at all acquit the wicked." (1:3a; Nu. 14:18; Job 10:14; Lk 13:3,5)

#### Nahum 1:2 (NKJV)

### LESSONS: THE NATURE OF GOD

- The POWER of God 1:3-6; Ps. 66:3; 147:5; Ep. 1:19, 20.
  - He controls all aspects of nature (1:1-5; Job 38:1. Ps. 18:7-15; 50:3; 97:2-5; 104:3)
  - He is the Creator and outside the laws of nature (Gen 1:1ff; Ps 18:15; etc.)
  - Who, therefore, can stand against God?

<sup>3</sup> The Lord *is* slow to anger and great in power, And will not at all acquit *the wicked*.

### LESSONS: THE NATURE OF GOD

- The POWER of God 1:3-6; Ps. 66:3; 147:5; Ep. 1:19, 20.
  - Rhetorical questions "Who can stand before His indignation? And who can endure the fierceness of His anger? 1:6
  - Similar to Sennacherib's field commander (2 Kings 18:17) asked Hezekiah "Who of all the gods of these countries has been able to save his land from me? How then can the Lord deliver Jerusalem from my hand?" (2 Kings 18:35)

#### Nahum 1:3a (NKJV)

<sup>3</sup> The Lord *is* slow to anger and great in power, And will not at all acquit *the wicked*.

### LESSONS: THE NATURE OF GOD

- The POWER of God 1:3-6; Ps. 66:3; 147:5; Ep. 1:19, 20.
  - All those who persist in rebellion against God and boast, thinking they have nothing to fear from God, will one day learn how wrong they are! (Je. 10:10; Mal. 3:2; Re. 6:17; Ac 5:38,39; Ro 9:17)
  - ▶ The MANY examples of God's judgment testify to both His willingness and ability to hold men accountable for their sins (Rom. 2:5-10; 2 Cor. 5:10; 2 Pet. 3)

<sup>3</sup> The Lord *is* slow to anger and great in power, And will not at all acquit *the wicked*.

### LESSONS: THE NATURE OF GOD

- God is good and reliable 1:7; Ps. 25:8; 100:5; 136:1; 145:6–10; Ro. 11:22. 1 Jno. 4:8–10.
  - ▶ He is faithful and merciful, protecting (a refuge in times of trouble), helpful, and caring for those who trust Him. (Ps. 27:13, 14; 55:22; 56:3,4; Heb. 13:5,6)
  - ▶ God can and will provide for His people, His people are only those who trust and obey - and the Lord knows who we are (Ps. 1:6; Jn 10:27; 2 Ti. 2:19)

### Nahum 1:7 (NKJV)

<sup>7</sup> The Lord *is* good, A stronghold in the day of trouble; And He knows those who trust in Him.

### LESSONS: THE NATURE OF GOD

### 1 Peter 5:5–11 (NKJV)

5 ... be clothed with humility, for "God resists the proud, But gives grace to the humble." 6 Therefore humble yourselves under the mighty hand of God, that He may exalt you in due time, <sup>7</sup> casting all your care upon Him, for He cares for you. 8 Be sober, be vigilant; because your adversary the devil walks about like a roaring lion, seeking whom he may devour. 9 Resist him, steadfast in the faith, knowing that the same sufferings are experienced by your brotherhood in the world. 10 But may the God of all grace, who called us to His eternal glory by Christ Jesus, after you have suffered a while, perfect, establish, strengthen, and settle you. 11 To Him be the glory and the dominion forever and ever. Amen.

<sup>9</sup> What do you conspire against the Lord? He will make an utter end *of it*. Affliction will not rise up a second time. <sup>10</sup> For while tangled *like* thorns, And while drunken *like* drunkards, They shall be devoured like stubble fully dried.

3:19 <sup>19</sup> Your injury *has* no healing, Your wound is severe. All who hear news of you Will clap *their* hands over you, ...
