



Luke 10:38–42 (NKJV)


³⁸ Now it happened as they went that He entered a certain village; and a certain woman named Martha welcomed Him into her house. ³⁹ And she had a sister called Mary, who also sat at Jesus' feet and heard His word. ⁴⁰ But Martha was distracted with much serving, and she approached Him and said, "Lord, do You not care that my sister has left me to serve alone? Therefore tell her to help me." 41 And Jesus answered and said to her, "Martha, Martha, you are worried and troubled about many things. 42 But one thing is needed, and Mary has chosen that good part, which will not be taken away from her."




- Mary & Martha were sisters of Lazarus & lived in Bethany. Close friends with Jesus —John 11:1,2,5,35,36;
- Martha opens her home to Jesus & is busy providing for her guests
 Luke 10:40; John 12:2
- Mary is always found at Jesus' feet Luke 10:39; John 11:32; 12:3



- Luke 10:39 "And she had a sister called Mary, who also sat at Jesus' feet and heard His word."
- John 11:32 "... Mary came where Jesus was, and saw Him, she fell down at His feet, saying to Him, "Lord, if You had been here, my brother would not have died."
 - John 12:3 "Mary took a pound of very costly oil of spikenard, anointed the feet of Jesus, and wiped His feet with her hair."




- Martha's complaint to Jesus about what Mary was not doing was met with a gentle rebuke Luke 10:41,42
- "Martha, Martha, you are worried and troubled about many things. ⁴² But one thing is needed, and Mary has chosen that good part, which will not be taken away from her." Luke 10:41,42
- Martha was NOT a bad person - Not immoral - Not lacking in love for the Lord



- Martha was a genuine
 BELIEVER but
 misguided John 11:26
 - "This needs to be done and Mary is not helping me ...
 Jesus, you have authority, make her help me ..."
 - "Jesus, if you had been here ... BUT, whatever You ask of God, God will give You." John 11:21,22
 - "Lord, by this time there is a stench, for he has been *dead* four days." John 12:39

We Can EASILY Be Distracted



- Many are TOO distracted by the things of this world to TAKE time to listen, worship & serve the Lord!

 Jn 4:24; 1 Jn 2:15-17; Rom. 1:25; Mat 13:19-22
- If God is NOT FIRST in our lives, even the greatest services rendered to our fellow-man do us no real good! Mk 12:29-31




"... among those whose attendance has waned, the most commonly offered reasons have to do with practical concerns, including many who say they are too busy to attend ..."

 - Even in our zeal to serve the Lord, we can focus on things & not on Him! Rom 10:1-3




Could it be we are so dusy "serving" that we do not take the time & effort needed for genuine spiritual growth?


But One Thing is Needed



2 Timothy 4:2-4 (NKJV)


² Preach the word! Be ready in season and out of season. Convince, rebuke, exhort, with all longsuffering and teaching. ³ For the time will come when they will not endure sound doctrine, but according to their own desires, because they have itching ears, they will heap up for themselves teachers; 4 and they will turn their ears away from the truth, and be turned aside to fables.

But One Thing is Needed



- Those who TRULY COME to CHRIST are those who LEARN of Him Mat 11:28-30
- Jesus' sheep HEAR His voice and FOLLOW Him John 10:27; Mat. 16:24; Lu. 9:23.
- Spiritual growth CANNOT occur apart from learning what Jesus teaches in His word! Mat. 28:19; Rom 10:17; John 6:63; Lk 6:46



John 12:48 (NKJV)


He who rejects Me, and does not receive My words, has that which judges him—the word that I have spoken will judge him in the last day.



Mary Has Chosen That Good Part




- Mary Made her choice She valued the words of

Mary Has Chosen That Good Part




- Like Peter, when he & the other apostles were asked by Jesus, "will you also go away?" May we respond ...

We CHOOSE That Good Part When ...




- We take the time to hear & do what Jesus says Mat. 7:21-27

Martha, Martha, you are worried and troubled about many things.




Externals lose their power over us when we, through the eyes of faith, focus upon the things of God!




