- A Levite, the son of Berachiah, descendant of Gershon the son of Levi. I Chron. 6:39-43
- David made Asaph the chief Levite to minister before the ark of the LORD I Chron. 16:4-6
- Is called a "seer" (prophet) 2 Chron. 29:30



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Asaph's faith was challenged by the apparent success & happiness of the wicked.

Asaph learned "perception" is NOT necessarily reality.

What helped Asaph change his perspective?

How did this change of perspective strengthen his faith and commitment to the Lord?

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### ASAPH's PROBLEM — Ps 73:1-11

#### Psalm 73:1-11 (NKJV)

<sup>1</sup> Truly God *is* good to Israel, To such as are pure in heart. <sup>2</sup> But as for me, my feet had almost stumbled; My steps had nearly slipped. <sup>3</sup> For I was envious of the boastful, When I saw the prosperity of the wicked. 4 For *there are* no pangs in their death, But their strength is firm. 5 They are not in trouble as other men, Nor are they plagued like other men. <sup>6</sup> Therefore pride serves as their necklace; Violence covers them *like* a garment. <sup>7</sup> Their eyes bulge with abundance; They have more than heart could wish. 8 They scoff and speak wickedly concerning oppression; They speak loftily. 9 They set their mouth against the heavens, And their tongue walks through the earth. <sup>10</sup> Therefore his people return here, And waters of a full *cup* are drained by them. 11 And they say, "How does God know? And is there knowledge in the Most High?"

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### ASAPH's PROBLEM — Ps 73:1-11



- He KNEW the truth vs. 1 "Truly God is good to Israel, To such as are pure in heart."— Mat 5:1-13; Psalm 84:10,11
- But yet, he ALMOST LOST his faith vs. 2 "But as for me, my feet had almost stumbled; My steps had nearly slipped"
  - What Asaph believed to be true was NOT what he was experiencing vs. 3-9

# "I was envious of the boastful When I saw ... — vs. 3

- 3b the prosperity of the wicked.
- 4 ...no pangs in their death, But their strength is firm.
- <sup>5</sup> ... not in trouble ..., not plagued
- 6 proud & violent
- <sup>7</sup> eyes bulge with abundance; ...
- 8 scoff & speak wickedly ... loftily
- 9 set their mouth against the heavens, ...

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### ASAPH's PROBLEM — Ps 73:1-11



Psalm 73:10–11 (NKJV)


<sup>10</sup> Therefore his people return here, And waters of a full *cup* are drained by them. <sup>11</sup> And they say, "How does God know? And is there knowledge in the Most High?"

### "I was envious of the boastful When I saw ... — vs. 3

- These wicked men were popular the people drank the waters of sinful pleasure they offered- (10)
- These misled men dismiss God's omniscience. The names of God used here ('El = the mighty one; 'Elyon = supreme ruler) underscore the blasphemy of their skepticism. God doesn't know God will not judge (11)

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### ASAPH's PROBLEM — Ps 73:1-11




Asaph almost LOST his faith. — vs 2

Asaph wondered what the benefit was in being faithful - Because from all appearances - there were no downsides to being evil — and no upside to being righteous — 12-14

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### ASAPH's DILEMMA — Ps 73:12-16



### Psalm 73:12-14 (NKJV)

12 Behold, these are the ungodly, Who are always at ease; They increase in riches. <sup>13</sup> Surely I have cleansed my heart in vain, And washed my hands in innocence. 14 For all day long I have been plagued, And chastened every morning.

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### ASAPH's DILEMMA — Ps 73:12-16



- Asaph thought "This is NOT FAIR!!!" But he also knew if he professed his thoughts he could cause others to stumble vs. 15
  - This dilemma was beyond Asaph's ability to reconcile with what he knew about God vs 16

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### ASAPH FINDS THE ANSWER — Ps 73:17-20



17 "Until I went into the sanctuary of God; *Then* I understood their end."

In order to overcome doubt created by the illusions in the world - we MUST come to see and accept the TRUTH.

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### ASAPH FINDS THE ANSWER — Ps 73:17-20



#### "I understood their end."

- <sup>18</sup> Surely You set them in slippery places; You cast them down to destruction.
- <sup>19</sup> Oh, how they are *brought* to desolation, as in a moment! They are utterly consumed with terrors.
- <sup>20</sup> As a dream when *one* awakes, *So,* Lord, when You awake, You shall despise their image.

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### ASAPH FINDS THE ANSWER — Ps 73:17-20



#### "I understood their end."

- Asaph LEARNED the WHOLE truth in the Lord's HOUSE 17a
- He learns God will JUDGE the wicked in the end 17b-19
- God allows the wicked to confidently pursue their evil ways, building up for themselves certain & eternal condemnation 18,19; Rom. 1:18-32; 2:5-11; 2 Thes 1:7-9; Jam 5:3; 2 Pet. 3; etc.

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### ASAPH FINDS THE ANSWER — Ps 73:17-20



#### "I understood their end."

Asaph LEARNS the TRUTH about what will ultimately happen to the wicked and all the things they pursue in life — 20; [parable of the rich fool - Luke 12:13-21; story of the rich man and Lazarus —Luke 16:19-31]

God will AWAKE and justice will be served upon the wicked!! — Mat 25:46; 2 Thes. 1:9; Rev 14:10

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### ASAPH FINDS THE ANSWER — Ps 73:17-20



"I understood their end."

Galatians 6:7–8 (NKJV)

<sup>7</sup> Do not be deceived, God is not mocked; for whatever a man sows, that he will also reap. <sup>8</sup> For he who sows to his flesh will of the flesh reap corruption, but he who sows to the Spirit will of the Spirit reap everlasting life.

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#### ASAPH's REACTION To The TRUTH — Ps 73:21-24




"Thus my heart was grieved, And I was vexed in my mind." — 21

- Asaph suddenly shifts from selfpity & discontentment to humility and godly sorrow! — vs. 22,23
  - He confesses his ignorance & admits he had allowed himself to sink to the level of a beast who had no understanding or knowledge of God vs. 22

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#### ASAPH's REACTION To The TRUTH — Ps 73:21-24




"Nevertheless I am continually with You; You hold me by my right hand" — 23

- Asaph NEVER turned away from God's guidance but RATHER turned to it for understanding HE then found the truth! vs. 23,24
  - The end of the faithful is FAR DIFFERENT from the end of the wicked "And afterward receive me to glory" 24; Rom 2:7,10; 8:18

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#### ASAPH's RENEWED DEVOTION — Ps 73:25-28



#### Psalm 73:25-28 (NKJV)

<sup>25</sup> Whom have I in heaven but You? And there is none upon earth that I desire besides You. 26 My flesh and my heart fail; But God is the strength of my heart and my portion forever. 27 For indeed, those who are far from You shall perish; You have destroyed all those who desert You for harlotry. 28 But it is good for me to draw near to God; I have put my trust in the Lord God, That I may declare all Your works.

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#### ASAPH's RENEWED DEVOTION — Ps 73:25-28



"Whom have I in heaven but You? And there is none upon earth that I desire besides You." — 25

- If GOD IS ALL I NEED!!! Phili 3:7-11
- If GOD IS ALL I DESIRE!!! Col. 3:1-3
- If GOD IS ALL I SEEK Mat. 6:33
- THEN I WILL HAVE EVERYTHING THAT WILL EVER TRULY MATTER!!!—
- AND I WILL HAVE IT FOR ETERNITY!
- NOTHING perceived with our natural senses can be kept forever!

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#### **PERCEPTION**

vs. 1 — **TRULY** God is GOOD to Israel, those pure of heart

vs. 2,3 — Asaph was envious of the wicked

vs. 4-12 — The wicked are successful, prosperous & go unpunished ...

vs. 13-16 — TRULY I AM
RIGHTEOUS IN VAIN!
This troubles me / Contradicts
what I perceive about God

#### REALITY

vs. 25-28 — **TRULY** God is GOOD - I will TRUST Him

vs. 21-24 — I was ignorant and foolish to question GOD!

vs. 18-20 — In the end - the wicked will be destroyed - and they will lose it all!

vs. 17 — Until I went into the sanctuary of God;
Then I understood their end.

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
### From All APPEARANCES:

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
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- First and foremost in order to overcome doubt created by the illusions in the world we MUST accept the TRUTH.
