


#### JESUS ARRESTED


Judas had agreed to betray Jesus for 30 pieces of silver — (John 12:4–6; Matt. 26:14–16)

A multitude of armed Roman soldiers (600) & temple guards were led by Judas to the place where Jesus often prayed — Mat 26;47; Mk 14:43; Lk

22:47; Jn 18:3



#### JESUS ARRESTED



Jesus was in complete command, gave Himself up — 'went forward and said to them, "Whom are you seeking?"' (Jn 18:4)



#### JESUS ARRESTED


- Judas betrays Jesus with a kiss (Mt 26:48; Mk 14:44,45; Lk 22:47,48)
- When the soldiers attempt to arrest Jesus, Peter strikes Malchus w/ his sword cutting off his ear / Jesus heals him (Mt 26:51; Mk 14:47; Lk 22:50,51; Jn 18:10)
- This was all according to The Father's sovereign plan — Acts 2:23

#### Matthew 26:52-56 (NKJV)

52 But Jesus said to him, "Put your sword in its place, for all who take the sword will perish by the sword. <sup>53</sup> Or do you think that I cannot now pray to My Father, and He will provide Me with more than twelve legions of angels? 54 How then could the Scriptures be fulfilled, that it must happen thus?" 55 In that hour Jesus said to the multitudes, "Have you come out, as against a robber, with swords and clubs to take Me? I sat daily with you, teaching in the temple, and you did not seize Me. <sup>56</sup> But all this was done that the Scriptures of the prophets might be fulfilled." Then all the disciples forsook Him and fled.

Luke adds: "But this is your hour, and the power of darkness."

#### JESUS ARRESTED

- Taken to Annas first John 18:13-14, 19-24
- Then to Caiaphas & SOME of the elders John 18:24; Mat 26:57-68; Luke 66-71
- Sent to Pilate Mt 27:1,2; Lk 23:1,2; Jn 18:28-38
- Sent to Herod "tetrarch of Galilee" Lk 23:6-12
- Herod sends Jesus back to Pilate – Lk 23:11; Jn 19:39-16

- Before dawn (illegal)
- Father-N-Law to Caiaphas, the high priest - Former high priest removed by Rome (13,19,22)

#### Jesus Before Annas (John 18:12-14,19-24)



"Annas had been appointed high priest by Quirinius, governor of Syria, in a.d. 6 and remained until he was deposed by Valerius Gratus, procurator of Judea, in a.d. 15.

"Evidently Annas remained the power behind the throne; a preliminary investigation was carried out by him before Jesus' formal religious trial. Caiaphas was the high priest that year, that is, that fateful year of Jesus' death. John reminded his readers of Caiaphas' unconscious prophecy (John 11:49-52)."

- Jesus struck by officers (20-23)
- Sent to Caiaphas (24)

#### Matthew 26:62–64 (NKJV)

62 And the high priest arose and said to Him, "Do You answer nothing? What is it these men testify against You?" 63 But Jesus kept silent. And the high priest answered and said to Him, "I put You under oath by the living God: Tell us if You are the Christ, the Son of God!" 64 Jesus said to him, "It is as you said. Nevertheless, I say to you, hereafter you will see the Son of Man sitting at the right hand of the Power, and coming on the clouds of heaven."

#### Jesus Before Caiaphas (Mat 26:57-67)




#### Matthew 26:65–68 (NKJV)

65 Then the high priest tore his clothes, saying, "He has spoken blasphemy! What further need do we have of witnesses? Look, now you have heard His blasphemy! 66 What do you think?"

They answered and said, "He is deserving of death." <sup>67</sup> Then they spat in His face and beat Him; and others struck *Him* with the palms of their hands, <sup>68</sup> saying, "Prophesy to us, Christ! Who is the one who struck You?"

#### Jesus Before Pilate – (John 18:28-38)




- Early in the morning (28)
- Roman governor of Judea (Mat 27:2)
- Jews change charges (30; Luke 23:2)
  - Perverting the nation –
  - Forbidding to pay taxes –
  - Self proclaimed king -
- Questions Jesus but finds no fault (33-38)

#### Jesus Before Herod – (Luke 23:6-12)



- Tetrarch of Galilee (3:1)
- Was glad to see Jesus (8)
- Questioned Jesus but Jesus did not answer - (9)
- The Jews accuse Jesus (10)
- Treated Him with contempt (11) (Mocked Him Put a gorgeous robe on Him)
- Sent Him back to Pilate (11,12)


Jesus Before Pilate Again – (John 18:39-19:16)



- Warned by his wife (Mat 27:19)
- Tried to strike a deal (18:39,40; Luke 23:13-18)
- Jews demandBarabbas (40; Mat 27:20-25; Luke 23:18-25)



Jesus Before Pilate Again – (John 18:39-19:16)





### John 19:1, They Scourged Jesus



#### Matthew 27:23–26 (NKJV)

<sup>23</sup> Then the governor said, "Why, what evil has He done?" But they cried out all the more, saying, "Let Him be crucified!" <sup>24</sup> When Pilate saw that he could not prevail at all, but rather *that* a tumult was rising, he took water and washed *his* hands before the multitude, saying, "I am innocent of the blood of this just Person. You see *to it.*" <sup>25</sup> And all the people answered and said, "His blood *be* on us and on our children." <sup>26</sup> Then he released Barabbas to them; and when he had scourged Jesus, he delivered *Him* to be crucified.

# ESUS ON IRIA JOHN 19:5,6 (NKJV)

<sup>5</sup> Then Jesus came out, wearing the crown of thorns and the purple robe. And Pilate said to them, "Behold the Man!" <sup>6</sup> Therefore, when the chief priests and officers saw Him, they cried out, saying, "Crucify Him, crucify Him!" Pilate said to them, "You take Him and crucify Him, for I find no fault in Him."

<sup>7</sup> The Jews answered him, "We have a law, and according to our law He ought to die, because He made Himself the Son of God." <sup>8</sup> Therefore, when Pilate heard that saying, he was the more afraid, <sup>9</sup> and went again into the Praetorium, and said to Jesus, "Where are You from?" But Jesus gave him no answer.

10 Then Pilate said to Him, "Are You not speaking to me? Do You not know that I have power to crucify You, and power to release You?" 11 Jesus answered, "You could have no power at all against Me unless it had been given you from above. Therefore the one who delivered Me to you has the greater sin."


12 From then on Pilate sought to release Him, but the Jews cried out, saying, "If you let this Man go, you are not Caesar's friend. Whoever makes himself a king speaks against Caesar." 13 When Pilate therefore heard that saying, he brought Jesus out and sat down in the judgment seat in a place that is called The Pavement, but in Hebrew, Gabbatha.

<sup>14</sup> Now it was the Preparation Day of the Passover, and about the sixth hour. And he said to the Jews, "Behold your King!" 15 But they cried out, "Away with Him, away with Him! Crucify Him!" Pilate said to them, "Shall I crucify your King?" The chief priests answered, "We have no king but Caesar!" 16 Then he delivered Him to them to be crucified. Then they took Jesus and led Him away.

#### Isaiah 53:4–8 (NKJV)


<sup>4</sup> Surely He has borne our griefs And carried our sorrows; Yet we esteemed Him stricken, Smitten by God, and afflicted. <sup>5</sup> But He was wounded for our transgressions, He was bruised for our iniquities; The chastisement for our peace was upon Him, And by His stripes we are healed. <sup>6</sup> All we like sheep have gone astray; We have turned, every one, to his own way; And the Lord has laid on Him the iniquity of us all. <sup>7</sup> He was oppressed and He was afflicted, Yet He opened not His mouth; He was led as a lamb to the slaughter, And as a sheep before its shearers is silent, So He opened not His mouth. 8 He was taken from prison and from judgment, And who will declare His generation? For He was cut off from the land of the living; For the transgressions of My people He was stricken.

<sup>39</sup> Coming out, He went to the Mount of Olives, as He was accustomed, and His disciples also followed Him. 40 When He came to the place, He said to them, "Pray that you may not enter into temptation." 41 And He was withdrawn from them about a stone's throw, and He knelt down and prayed, <sup>42</sup> saying, "Father, if it is Your will, take this cup away from Me; nevertheless not My will, but Yours, be done."
