
- Jesus demonstrates why some reject the word of God and others accept it.

- The importance of developing a proper attitude towards the Word of God!
 - The strength, durability and fruitfulness of our faith is determined by the attitude we CHOOSE to have towards God's word!



SOIL #1 — The Wayside Hearer

Mat 13:19 (NKJV)

When anyone hears the word of the kingdom, and does not understand it, then the wicked one comes and snatches away what was sown in his heart. This is he who received seed by the wayside.


Mark 4:15 (NKJV)

And these are the ones by the wayside where the word is sown. When they hear, Satan comes immediately and takes away the word that was sown in their hearts.

Luke 8:12 (NKJV)

12 Those by the wayside are the ones who hear; then the devil comes and takes away the word out of their hearts, lest they should believe and be saved.


SOIL #1 — The Wayside Hearer



Wayside (Unresponsive Closed Minded) Hearer

- hodos (ὁδός, 3598) "A road, highway, street, way" (Lou-Nida)
- The seed of the gospel could not penetrate the hard surface (13:19).
- This was the condition of the majority of the Jewish leadership of Jesus' day.

SOIL #1 — The Wayside Hearer



Wayside (Unresponsive Closed Minded) Hearer

Through Satan's influences, in harmony with free-will, the word is prevented from penetrating the heart, "the place of decision" wherein they could have been saved - (1 Cor. 1:22,23; 2:13,14; 2 Cor 4:4; Eph. 4:17-19; Col. 2:8).

SOIL #2 — Rocky Ground Hearer

Mat 13:20-21

20 ... hears the word and immediately receives it with joy; 21 yet he has no root in himself, but endures only for a while. For when tribulation or persecution arises because of the word, immediately he stumbles.


Mark 4:16-17

16 ... hear the word, immediately receive it with gladness; 17 and they have no root in themselves, and so endure only for a time. Afterward, when tribulation or persecution arises for the word's sake, immediately they stumble.

Luke 8:13

hear, receive the word with joy; and these have no root, who believe for a while and in time of temptation fall away.


SOIL #2 — Rocky Ground Hearer



The Undeveloped Believer

- Seed will germinate in such soil but the underlying rock prevents a deep root system.
- Receives with joy,
 BELIEVES, had LIFE thus
 saved but does not
 endure persecution &
 temptation (Mat 13:13;
 Mk 4:16-17; Luke 8:13)

SOIL #2 — Rocky Ground Hearer



The Undeveloped Believer

- Intellectually & emotionally affected by the word but lacks the commitment to grow & develop (2 Pet 1:5-10)
- Those once saved by faith can lose their faith and be lost (1 Cor. 10:1-13; Heb. 3:1,7-19; 5:12-6:8)

SOIL #3 — Thorny Ground Hearer

Matthew 13:22

22 Now he who received seed among the thorns is he who hears the word, and the cares of this world and the deceitfulness of riches choke the word, and he becomes unfruitful.


Mark 4:18–19

¹⁸ Now these are the ones sown among thorns; they are the ones who hear the word, 19 and the cares of this world, the deceitfulness of riches, and the desires for other things entering in choke the word, and it becomes unfruitful.

Luke 8:14

14 Now the ones that fell among thorns are those who, when they have heard, go out and are choked with cares, riches, and pleasures of life, and bring no fruit to maturity.


SOIL #3 — Thorny Ground Hearer



Thorny Ground (Unfruitful Disciple)

- Had to compete for sunlight and nutrients.
- Weeds will choke healthy plants by sapping them of their sources of nourishment, leaving them weak and stunted.


SOIL #3 — Thorny Ground Hearer



Thorny Ground (Unfruitful Disciple)

Though one is made alive by the gospel, his/her faith is suffocated by temporal concerns and pleasures — Thus the believers faith does not produce the fruit required due to a divided heart -(James 1:18,21-25; 1 Peter 1:13-2:2; Mat 6:22-24)

SOIL #3 — Thorny Ground Hearer



Thorny Ground (Unfruitful Disciple)

- Materialism is a certain recipe for a spiritual crop failure:
- John 15:1-10
- ▶ 1 John 2:15-17
- James 4:4
- 2 Cor. 6:14-7:1
- ≥ 1 Tim 6:9,10

SOIL #4 — Good Ground Hearer

Mat 13:23

23 But he who received seed on the good ground is he who hears the word and understands it, who indeed bears fruit and produces: some a hundredfold, some sixty, some thirty."


Mark 4:20

15 But the ones that fell on the good ground are those who, having heard the word with a noble and good heart, keep it and bear fruit with patience.


SOIL #4 — Good Ground Hearer

- Hears & understands recognizes the value — (Mat 13:20, 44-46)
- Receive God's Word (Mark 4:20).
- Keeps God's Word & perseveres (Lk 8:15).
- Bears fruit (Lk 8:15; John 15:5)



Good Ground (Fruitful Christian)

- Win souls (Acts 8:4; 1 Thes 1:8)
- Practical holiness -(Rom 6:22; 12:1-2; Phili 1:11; Col. 1:10)
- Fruit of the Spirit /
 Christ-like character (Gal 5:22,23)

Good Ground (Fruitful Christian)

- Is noble & honest / searches Acts 17:11,12
- Receives the word with meekness (Jas 1:21)
- Willing to make changes- (Acts 19:18-20; Jas 1:25)
- Bears fruit 1 Thes 1:8-10
- A heart like the one described in Ps 1:1-3?

SOIL #4 — Good Ground Hearer



Psalm 1:1-3 (NKJV)

¹ Blessed is the man Who walks not in the counsel of the ungodly, Nor stands in the path of sinners, Nor sits in the seat of the scornful; ² But his delight is in the law of the Lord, And in His law he meditates day and night. ³ He shall be like a tree Planted by the rivers of water, That brings forth its fruit in its season, Whose leaf also shall not wither; And whatever he does shall prosper.



The word of God can save anyone who is willing to receive it –

James 1:18-25



One can be saved from his past sins but fail to grow and be lost - 2 Pet 1:5-10



One can be spiritually alive but allow the world to choke out his spiritual life – Rev 3:2,3



We choose the condition of our heart – we can all be good ground hearers & bear fruit!

- Bearing fruit for the master?


What Kind of SOIL Are You?



- Our growth & survival as a Christian, and our hope of eternal salvation, depend on applying Jesus' teachings.
- He warns, admonishes and encourages us with His words. Let us understand them and be motivated to produce much good fruit.
- Do not look at this parable just as it relates to the hearts of others'. Let us look closely at our own hearts and always be watchful for those things that endanger our production of good fruit.

- Your hearts condition is manifested in how you respond Acts 17:11,12
