# Leviticus 10:1–11 (NKJV)

<sup>1</sup> Then Nadab and Abihu, the sons of Aaron, each took his censer and put fire in it, put incense on it, and offered profane fire before the Lord, which He had not commanded them. <sup>2</sup> So fire went out from the Lord and devoured them, and they died before the Lord. <sup>3</sup> And Moses said to Aaron, "This is what the Lord spoke, saying: 'By those who come near Me I must be regarded as holy; And before all the people I must be glorified." So Aaron held his peace.

# Leviticus 10:1–11 (NKJV)

<sup>4</sup> Then Moses called Mishael and Elzaphan, the sons of Uzziel the uncle of Aaron, and said to them, "Come near, carry your brethren from before the sanctuary out of the camp." 5 So they went near and carried them by their tunics out of the camp, as Moses had said. <sup>6</sup> And Moses said to Aaron, and to Eleazar and Ithamar, his sons, "Do not uncover your heads nor tear your clothes, lest you die, and wrath come upon all the people. But let your brethren, the whole house of Israel, bewail the burning which the Lord has kindled.

# Leviticus 10:1–11 (NKJV)


<sup>7</sup> You shall not go out from the door of the tabernacle of meeting, lest you die, for the anointing oil of the Lord is upon you." And they did according to the word of Moses. 8 Then the Lord spoke to Aaron, saying: 9 "Do not drink wine or intoxicating drink, you, nor your sons with you, when you go into the tabernacle of meeting, lest you die. It shall be a statute forever throughout your generations, 10 that you may distinguish between holy and unholy, and between unclean and clean, 11 and that you may teach the children of Israel all the statutes which the Lord has spoken to them by the hand of Moses."

The PATTERN for the tabernacle, its furnishings, the ark, the table, the candlesticks, the altars, garments for the priests, etc. — Exodus 25-29




Background and Importance of the Context

Golden Calf Interlude – Exodus 32-34

The making of the tabernacle, its furnishings, priests clothing, and all things commanded by God according to the pattern — Exodus 35-40




Background and Importance of the Context

Regulations pertaining to the sacrificial system — Leviticus 1-7

The consecration of Aaron and his sons as priest according to Exodus 29 — Leviticus 8


The priestly ministry of Aaron and his sons begin - sacrifices offered - fire from heaven consumes the the burnt offering — Leviticus 9



Background and Importance of the Context

### Leviticus 9:23–24 (NKJV)

<sup>23</sup> And Moses and Aaron went into the tabernacle of meeting, and came out and blessed the people. Then the glory of the Lord appeared to all the people, <sup>24</sup> and fire came out from before the Lord and consumed the burnt offering and the fat on the altar. When all the people saw it, they shouted and fell on their faces.

# God means what HE SAYS -

(God's silence is NOT permissive!)


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
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- ➤ God had REVEALED what He wanted He specified the source of fire (9:24; 16:12)
  - There are MANY who try to escape the clear implications of this passage by attempting to explain away the stated purpose for God's judgment.
  - The "strange fire" was unauthorized by God: "...which he commanded them not" (Lev. 10:1).

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- We do NOT have the liberty to add to, take from or ALTER God's words — Deut 4:2
  - **Cain -** (Gen. 4:7) Heb 11:4
  - Moses (Num 20:8-24)
  - King Saul (1 Sam. 13 & 15)
  - David's ox cart (1 Chr. 13:7-12; 15:2)
  - Jeroboam (1 Kings 12:25-33)
  - Uzziah (2 Chr. 26:16-23)

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We cannot know the mind of God except through revelation
1 Cor 2:10, 11,14
Eph 3:3-5
Isaiah 55:8,9

**ROMANS 10:17** 

Faith comes by HEARING

God has revealed everything He wants from us 2 Pet 1:3; 2 Tim 3:16,17 Jude 3

Walking by faith means walking by what God has said

2 Cor. 5:7; 1 Cor. 4:6; Gal. 1:6-9

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- The God of the O.T. and the God of the N.T. is the same God (Acts 5:1-11; Col. 3:17; Heb. 10:26-31).
- If we truly respect, love & trust God we will worship as HE instructs we will seek to praise Him AS HE HAS spoken (John 4:22-24; 2 Tim 3:16,17; 1 Cor. 4:6).

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- When we become the designers & determiners of the how, when & where we worship, we have diverted our worship away from God & towards ourselves.
  - What is the difference between Nadab & Abihu's use of "strange fire" & those who profess to be Christians who exchange the simple instructions of the NT with the pomp, liturgy, extravagance, entertainment, & emotionally based practices of contemporary worshippers?

# God MUST Be Respected -

(God's Holiness Is To Be Taken Seriously)

### Leviticus 10:2–3 (NKJV)

<sup>2</sup> So fire went out from the Lord and devoured them, and they died before the Lord. <sup>3</sup> And Moses said to Aaron, "This is what the Lord spoke, saying: 'By those who come near Me I must be regarded as holy; And before all the people I must be glorified."...

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- They DISRESPECTED God's holiness by not following His instructions therefore they suffered the consequences — (vs. 1,2)
- The principle Moses explicitly states in verse 3 is just as true today as it was then! (in fact, there is a sense in which it would apply even MORE) Ex. 19:22; Ps. 89:7; 119:120; Is. 52:11. Eze. 20:41; 42:13. He. 10:26-32; 12:28, 29; John 2:13-17
- God should never be addressed in a casual or trivial way (Psa. 89:7).

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- It is essential that we approach the presence of God in our lives and worship with reverence (Lev. 10:3; Rom 12:1, 2; 2 Cor. 6:14-7:1; Eccl. 5:1-5).
- Only the holy, (those cleansed & obedient), can approach God: "Be holy, for I am holy" (Lev. 11:44, 45; 19:2; 20:7, 26; 21:6, 8; I Peter 1:13-17; 2 Cor. 6:14-7:1).

# Worship In TRUTH Not just Feelings

(Emotions Must Be Present In Worship, But Disciplined By Truth)

### Leviticus 10:1–2 (NKJV)

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- Time of great sacrifice to the Lord (Lev. 9:1-21).
- The glory of the Lord appeared (Lev. 9:22, 23).
- Fire from God consumed the sacrifice (Lev. 9:24).
- They would tell us it is appropriate in light of God's glory and majesty to worship God passionately, but we must be disciplined by the truth.

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### Proverbs 14:12 (NKJV)

12 There is a way that seems right to a man, But its end is the way of death.

### Jeremiah 10:23 (NKJV)

<sup>23</sup> O Lord, I know the way of man *is* not in himself; *It is* not in man who walks to direct his own steps.

# Grace Doesn't Allow Disobedience

(God Is Gracious, BUT His Grace Must Not Be Taken For Granted.)

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- ▶ God blessed them with the opportunity to serve as priests by His grace (Lev. 8:1-5, 36).
- Nowever, they moved away from obedience to rebellion (Lev. 10:1, 2).
- They would tell us to rejoice in His grace with thankfulness, respect, & submission (Galatians 2:20,21; Ephesians 2:8-10; Titus 2:11-14)

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- Only those who believe God enough to do what He says receives His grace — (Eph 2:8,9)
  - Israel (Josh. 6; Heb. 11:30)
  - Naaman (2 Kings 5)
  - Christians (Acts 2:38; etc.)
- Only those who believe God enough to do what He says abide in His grace
  - Noah (Gen. 6:8ff; Heb 11:7)
  - Israel (Exo. 14:30,31; 1 Cor. 10)
  - Christians (John 15:1-10)

# GOD WAS / IS RIGHT

(God's Righteous Judgment Was Just!)

### Leviticus 10:6 (NKJV)

<sup>6</sup> And Moses said to Aaron, and to Eleazar and Ithamar, his sons, "Do not uncover your heads nor tear your clothes, lest you die, and wrath come upon all the people. But let your brethren, the whole house of Israel, bewail the burning which the Lord has kindled.

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- They had known God's law, instructions about the tabernacle, and sacrifices all pointing to God's holiness, yet they acted without authority and violated God's holiness.
- We too have tasted the good word of God and his grace – how will we respond to God's truth? — (Romans 2:2-11; Acts 17:31; 2 Thess. 1:6-9).

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- Many argue God would be UNJUST if he cast all who do not obey into an everlasting hell —
- Our emotional feelings, nor our human philosophies are worthy to judge the righteousness of God in regard to His dealings with the disobedient — Rom. 2:5; 3:5; 9:14-20
- All LOST in hell will be there because of their own choices

   Mat. 7:13,14; Rom. 2:5-11

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### John 3:16–17 (NKJV)

<sup>16</sup> For God so loved the world that He gave His only begotten Son, that whoever believes in Him should not perish but have everlasting life. <sup>17</sup> For God did not send His Son into the world to condemn the world, but that the world through Him might be saved.

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Mark 16:15–16 (NKJV)

15 And He said to them, "Go into all the world and preach the gospel to every creature.

16 He who believes and is baptized will be saved; but he who does not believe will be condemned.

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### Acts 2:37–38 (NKJV)

<sup>37</sup> Now when they heard *this*, they were cut to the heart, and said to Peter and the rest of the apostles, "Men and brethren, what shall we do?" 38 Then Peter said to them, "Repent, and let every one of you be baptized in the name of Jesus Christ for the remission of sins; and you shall receive the gift of the Holy Spirit.

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### 1 Timothy 2:3–6 (NKJV)

<sup>3</sup> For this is good and acceptable in the sight of God our Savior, 4 who desires all men to be saved and to come to the knowledge of the truth. <sup>5</sup> For there is one God and one Mediator between God and men, the Man Christ Jesus, <sup>6</sup> who gave Himself a ransom for all, to be testified in due time,

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2 Peter 3:9 (NKJV)

<sup>9</sup> The Lord is not slack concerning His promise, as some count slackness, but is longsuffering toward us, not willing that any should perish but that all should come to repentance....

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2 Peter 3:9 (NKJV)

14 Therefore, beloved, looking forward to these things, be diligent to be found by Him in peace, without spot and blameless; <sup>15</sup> and consider that the longsuffering of our Lord is salvation

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# Hebrews 12:25–29 (NKJV)

<sup>25</sup> See that you do not refuse Him who speaks. For if they did not escape who refused Him who spoke on earth, much more shall we not escape if we turn away from Him who speaks from heaven, <sup>26</sup> whose voice then shook the earth; but now He has promised, saying, "Yet once more I shake not only the earth, but also heaven." 27 Now this, "Yet once more," indicates the removal of those things that are being shaken, as of things that are made, that the things which cannot be shaken may remain.

# Hebrews 12:25–29 (NKJV)

28 Therefore, since we are receiving a kingdom which cannot be shaken, let us have grace, by which we may serve God acceptably with reverence and godly fear. 29 For our God is a consuming fire.
