


HAVE YOU BEEN REDEEMED?


The SOURCE of OUR HOPE





Those who seek the Father's deliverance:

- Need to understand His holy nature, His just character, and that He judges impartially (Acts 10:34; Rom. 2:11; Gal. 2:6; Ep. 6:9; Col. 3:25).
- Must obey Him in reverent fear following His absolute standards in a world of shifting situational ethics (1 Jn 2:15-17)
- MUST recognize the HIGH cost of our deliverance ...







2. lutroo (λυτρόω, 3084), "to release on receipt of ransom" (akin to lutron, "a ransom"), is used in the middle voice, signifying "to release by paying a ransom price, to redeem" (a) in the natural sense of delivering, Luke 24:21, of setting Israel free from the Roman yoke; (b) in a spiritual sense, Titus 2:14, of the work of Christ in "redeeming" men "from all iniquity" (anomia, "lawlessness," the bondage of self-will which rejects the will of God); 1 Pet. 1:18 (passive voice), "ye were

redeemed," from a vain manner of life, i.e., from bondage to tradition. In both instances the death of Christ is stated as the means of "redemption."

Note: While both No. 1 and No. 2 are translated "to redeem," exagorazo does not signify the actual "redemption," but the price paid with a view to it, *lutroo* signifies the actual "deliverance," the setting at liberty.



REDEMPTION DEFINED

When a person sins, he loses a spiritual battle and is taken captive, in Satan's domain - They are in bondage to sin, a slave to sin, (John 8:33,34; Rom. 6:16-18).

Those who sin are said to have "sold" themselves to sin, (Romans 7:14).

The sinner cannot "deliver" or "redeem" himself/herself. The sinner must be redeemed / delivered by a more powerful force than his captors.

REDEMPTION DEFINED

Satan is not paid off in the sense of a ransom being paid to him, but rather Jesus defeated Satan and his power through His death and resurrection. (Acts 20:28)

We are delivered from the kingdom of Satan when we die with Christ and are raised with Him.

(Romans 6:3-6; 16-18; Colossians 1:13)

THE NEED FOR REDEMPTION

- A universal need! Romans3:23; 6:23
- Due to our own sin Romans 5:12; Ezekiel 18:21-32
- The sinner is held captive by his sin John 8:34; Is. 59:1,2
- The sinner unable to redeem himself or provide redemption
 - Rom 3:24-26; 4:4-8; 7:24

BEFORE REDEMPTION

- AIMLESS (LOST WANDERERS)
 "aimless conduct received by tradition from your fathers" 18
- In bondage to sin John 8:34
- Owned by the devil 1 John 3:8
- Aliens WITHOUT HOPE Eph 2:11,12

- Any perishable means of currency -1Peter 1:18
- Blood of bulls / goats Heb 10:4
- Our own lives Ps 49:7; Rom 9:1-3
- Doing good deeds Eph. 2:1-9
- Man devised religion 1 Peter 1:18; Mat. 15:7-9
- Denying the reality of sin and its consequences - 1 John 1:8.10
- Attempting to forget about sin... Jeremiah 44:9






THE HIGH PRICE OF OUR REDEMPTION



- Our "redemption" came at a VERY HIGH PRICE! (1:18-21)
 - This they KNEW (18) "Because you are aware of what redeemed you, there should be on your part an effort to be reverential and respectful in your conduct and behavior before God." [Lenski 61]
 - "PRECIOUS" The "precious" blood of the Son of God is FAR more valuable than anything in the universe, or even the entirety of the universe (Mat 26:28; > 16:26)




- Our "redemption" came at a VERY HIGH PRICE! (1:18-21)
- As Of A Lamb Without blemish and without spot.
 - Only such a lamb was allowed to be offered in sacrifice (Leviticus 22:20; Ex. 12:5)
 - JESUS is the Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world (ls. 53:7; Jn 1:29; 1:36; Rev 13:8)


Matthew 20:28 (NKJV) 28 just as the Son of Man did not come to be served, but to serve, and to give His life a ransom for many."


Who gave Himself for us, that He might redeem us from every lawless deed and purify for Himself *His* own special people, zealous for good works.


THE HIGH PRICE OF OUR REDEMPTION





- The power and control of sin is broken (vs. 18) We are no longer in bondage to sin but salves of righteousness Rom 6:1-23
- "Brought near" and "reconciled" unto the Father in one body Ephesians 2:14-16
- "You are not your own For you were bought at a price therefore glorify God in your body" (1 Cor. 6:19,20)

THE HIGH PRICE OF OUR REDEMPTION



ALL ACCORDING TO GOD's FOREORDAINED PLAN

- Alluded To IN Genesis ... 3:15
- Accomplished through the wicked hands of His people Luke 22:22; Acts 2:23
- When the time was right God sent forth His Son, born of a woman, under the law to redeem those under the law Galatians 4:4,5
- His plan from the beginning Ephesians 3:11

What would a life of irreverence & disobedience manifest?


And what will be the end of such a life? - cf. Heb 10:26-31
