


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#### PAST / PRESENT / FUTURE




- Hindsight is not necessarily 20/20.
  - Revisionist history is REAL & DANGEROUS. We NEED to be honest with our past!
- Current vision can be very blurry.
  - Seeing ourselves as we REALLY ARE requires accurate understanding of both objective and subjective truth!
- Future consequences and destiny
  - Knowledge of God's word ESSENTIAL!

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
- Hindsight is not necessarily 20/20.
  - Israel suffered from "revisionist history" syndrome (Psalm 78; Judges 2:10-12; Mat. 23:31–33. Ac. 7:51; etc.).
  - Men have always had the tendency to revise history to accommodate current conditions and activities (Rom. 1:28; 2 Peter 3:1-9; etc.).
  - Paul was honest with his past and also retained his sincerity when confronted with the truth (c Phil. 3:1-7; etc)

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
- Hindsight is not necessarily 20/20.
  - Just as Israel quickly forgot God and His Law, those professing to follow Christ quickly forgot and turned away from Him (Gal. 1:6-9; 1 John; Rev. 2:4,5; 3:1-3)
  - Catholicism & denominationalism exists because professed Christians forgot the Lord's way (1 Pet. 5:1-4; 1 Tim. 4:1-5)
  - History is repeating itself by professed churches of Christ today (1 Cor. 1:10-13; 2 Ti. 3:1-5; 4:4)

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- We need to emulate the approved original example & pattern of the NT.
  - The Restoration movement refocuses attention on the original pattern.
  - If we do what they were instructed to do, and we are what they were instructed to be - we will be what God wants us to be (Acts 2; 2 Tim. 3:16,17; cf. 2 Kings 23; Ezra and Nehmiah)
  - This requires an accurate understanding & application of the NT.


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- We need to emulate the attitude of Paul regarding our past ...
  - BE HUMBLED: Recognizing & accepting responsibility for our past sins (1 Tim 1:13-15; 1 Co. 15:9; Gal. 1:13; etc.)
  - MEEKNESS: Recognizing the authority of Jesus over our lives (Acts 9:6; 26:15-19; Phili. 3:7-11; 2 Tim. 4:6-8; etc.)
  - GRATITUDE: Recognizing our lostness
     and need for Jesus' sacrifice (Gal. 2:20;
     2 Cor. 5:14,15; Phi. 4:6; Col. 1:13)



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#### BEING HONEST WITH OUR PRESENT




#### Current vision can be very blurry.

- Seeing ourselves as we REALLY ARE requires accurate understanding of both objective and subjective truth!
- David was blinded to his spiritual condition in 2 Samuel 11:1-12:6
- Israel was blind to their spiritual condition (Ezek. 12:2; Mat. 13:13-15)
- Those who rejected Christ were blinded to their spiritual condition (Luke 19:42; Acts 28:26,27; Romans 10:1-3)

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#### BEING HONEST WITH OUR PRESENT




#### Current vision can be CLEAR ...

- Josiah demonstrated honesty when he recognized the spiritual condition of Judah and sought to bring Judah into compliance with God's stated will (2 Kings 23; 2 Chr. 34:29, 30)
- Jesus gives sight to the blind the truth can open our eyes if we are honest (John 9:39; cf. 8:31,32; James 1:21-25)
- Those in Berea are examples (Acts 17:11,12; Jn. 5:39; Ja. 1:21; 1 Thes. 2:13)

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#### BEING HONEST WITH OUR PRESENT




#### Current vision can be CLEAR ...

- Are we genuine seekers of the truth or are we blind defenders of error (Acts 5:33; 7:54,57; 21:36; 22:22,23; etc.)?
- Are we honest with our weaknesses, struggles and sin (Psalm 139:23,24; 1 Cor. 11:28,31; 2 Cor. 13:5; Heb. 3:12,13)?
- Are we as faithful as we could and should be (Mt. 25:14-46; Ga. 6:4; He. 4:1; 12:15; 1 Jno. 3:20, 21; Re. 2:5; 3:2, 3)?
- Let us be doers (Jn 8:31,32; Ja. 1:21-26)




Current vision can be CLEAR ...




#### Future consequences and destiny ...

- Israel was deceived regarding their future. They assumed they would not suffer the consequences of their sins because they were God's chosen people (Jer. 6:16-23; 19:4ff; etc.)
- Those who put Jesus to death, and persecuted the early church, assumed they were doing God's will and thought they would be blessed (John 16:2; Ro. 10:2,3; Ga. 1:13,14; Phi. 3:6)

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#### BEING HONEST WITH OUR FUTURE




#### Future consequences and destiny ...

- Sadly, MANY believe they are heading for heaven when they are not (Mat. 7:13,14,21-23; 25:44-46; et.).
- If we are NOT following the Lord today, we are not on the path leading to heaven (Mat. 7:13,14; Heb. 5:8,9; John 10:1-10; Rom. 8:1,2,12-17).
- If we are walking in the truth, we can know where we are going (Rom. 8:1,2, 12-17; 1 Thes. 5:4; 1 John 3:3; 5:13).


#### Future consequences and destiny ...

#### Philippians 3:12-14 (NKJV)

your understanding being enlightened;



  - Hear the truth. (Luke 8:11)

  - Repent (Luke 13:3,5; Acts 17:30)
  - Confess Jesus as Lord (Romans 10:9,10)
  - Be Baptized (Ac 2:38; 22:16; Co. 2:12,13)
- Are you an erring Christian?
  - Repent and confess (Acts 8:22; 1 Jn 1:9)

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# John 9:35–39 (NKJV)
