¹ God is our refuge and strength, A very present help in trouble. ² Therefore we will not fear, Even though the earth be removed, And though the mountains be carried into the midst of the sea; ³ Though its waters roar and be troubled, Though the mountains shake with its swelling. Selah

- Psalm 46 is filled with familiar themes found in the Psalms as a whole.
- Most have little problem with their faith when life is treating them well, but sadly, when trials and tribulations present themselves, as they inevitably do, many "lose it."
- Our reactions to trials manifest the true strength or weakness of our faith.
- We may forsake God to protect our carnal treasures, or cower in the corner paralyzed by fear.

- REFUGE: i.e., safety and free from danger as a figurative extension of a place of refuge or shelter (Swanson, J. (1997). Dictionary of Biblical Languages with Semantic Domains: Hebrew (Old Testament) (electronic ed.). Oak Harbor: Logos Research Systems, Inc.)
- The picture is of a high place of refuge and defense to which one might flee for protection. (Ps 14:6; 46:2; 61:4; 62:8,9; 71:7; 73:28; 91:2, 9; 94:22; 142:6; Pr 14:26; Isa 25:4; 28:15, 17; Jer 17:17; Joel 4:16).
- God is our STORM shelter!

God is our refuge and strength,



(ḥē :zěq): n. [masc.]; - power, might, i.e., a condition in which one can exert great force or withstand great force, with a focus of having ability to do what is desired, intended, or necessary (Swanson, J. God encourages and enables His people that they may endure, gaining eventual victory over all enemy invaders. (Ex 15:13; Ps 89:11; 1 Cor. 10:13; Ep. 6:10-18; Phil 4:13; 1 Jn 5:2-5).



- God's help is abundantly available to all who seek it by faith (Deut. 4:7; Ps. 145:18; Rom. 10:12).
- God is always ready and able to provide the help His people need (Deut. 31:6, 8; Josh. 1:5; 1 Cor. 10:13; Heb. 13:5,6).

Indeed we live in troublesome times but we need to keep our troubles in perspective. Compare our troubles to Job's / Paul's / our first century brothers and sisters / to brethren who live in other parts of the world / to JESUS ...

In troublesome times, we should NEVER doubt God's willingness and ability to provide the safety, security, encouragement and strength needed to endure the storm!

Hebrews 13:5–6 (NKJV)

⁵ Let *your* conduct *be* without covetousness; *be* content with such things as you have. For He Himself has said, "I will never leave you nor forsake you." ⁶ So we may boldly say: "The Lord is my helper; I will not fear. What can man do to me?"

(1) Yahweh's protection (vv. 1-3);

² Therefore we will not fear



- FEAR: יֵבֹא (yā rē(')): v.; ≡ Str 3372 be afraid, be frightened, i.e., be in a state of feeling great distress, and deep concern of pain or unfavorable circumstance (Ge 3:10); (nif) be in fear (Ps 46:3).
- FEAR reveals a lack of faith (Mat. 6:30; 8:24–26; 14:31,32; Mark 4:40)
- Even though "the earth be removed, And though the mountains be carried into the midst of the sea ..." we should not fear but trust God! (2,3)

(2) Yahweh's presence (vv. 4-7)

The Lord of hosts is with us;

God blesses & sustains His people (Ps. 23:2; 36:8, 9. ls. 8:6, 7; 48:18. Eze. 47:1–12. Re. 22:1–3)

God is AMONG His people and will help us, and deliver us from our enemies (2 Cor. 6:14-7:1; Romans 8:28-39)

(Ex. 12:30; 14:30, 31; ls. 24:1; 34:2; 2 Cor. 10:4-6)


God brings PEACE to His people who walk in truth

(ls. 2:4; 11:9; 54:17; 60:18. Mi. 4:3, 4; Jn 17:17-21; 1 Cor. 1:10; Ep 4:1-7; Gal. 3:26-29) Psalm 46:8–9 (NKJV)

(3) Yahweh's preeminence (vv. 8-11).


The Lord of hosts is with us;



- **Be still** The NASB has "Cease striving and know that I am God." cf. In Exodus 14:13, God told Israel to "Stand still, and see the salvation of God."
- "Know that I AM GOD" recognize God's sovereignty and TRUST HIM that we may receive His aide!
- The agitation within our hearts, i.e., our fears, anxieties, and anger, reveal that we really do not KNOW GOD and will prevent us from receiving His blessings (Jam. 1:19,20)




James 1:17-20 (NKJV)
