


(Mt 19:16-30; Mk 10:17-27; Lk 18:18-27)

The CONTEXT (Mat. 19; Mark 10; Luke 18)



Matthew and Mark place this story after Jesus's teaching on marriage and children being brought to Him. (Mat. 19:3-15; Mark 10:2-16)

Luke places this event in the midst of a series of incidents and parables designed to indicate the character of discipleship, especially humility, including Jesus receiving the small children (18:15-17; cf. Mat, & Mark).

Mark supplies a bit of the context: "As Jesus started on his way, a man ran up to him and fell on his knees before him" (Mark 10:17a).

Matthew 19:16-30

¹⁶ Now behold, one came and said to Him, ^p"Good 4Teacher, what good thing shall I do that I may have eternal life?"
¹⁷ So He said to him, ⁵"Why do you call Me good? ⁶No one *is*^qgood but One, *that is*, God. But if you want to enter into life, ^rkeep the commandments."

¹⁸ He said to Him, "Which ones?"

Jesus said, ^s" 'You shall not murder,' 'You shall not commit adultery,' 'You shall not steal,' 'You shall not bear false witness,' ¹⁹ ^t'Honor your father and your mother,' and, ^u'You shall love your neighbor as yourself.'"

²⁰ The young man said to Him, "All these things I have "kept
⁷ from my youth. What do I still lack?"

Matthew 19:16-30

- ²¹ Jesus said to him, "If you want to be perfect, ^wgo, sell what you have and give to the poor, and you will have treasure in heaven; and come, follow Me."
- ²² But when the young man heard that saying, he went away sorrowful, for he had great possessions.
- ²³ Then Jesus said to His disciples, "Assuredly, I say to you that ^xit is hard for a rich man to enter the kingdom of heaven. ²⁴ And again I say to you, it is easier for a camel to go through the eye of a needle than for a rich man to enter the kingdom of God." ²⁵ When His disciples heard *it*, they were greatly astonished, saying, "Who then can be saved?"

Matthew 19:16-30

²⁶ But Jesus looked at *them* and said to them, "With men this is impossible, but ^y with God all things are possible." ²⁷ Then Peter answered and said to Him, "See, ^zwe have left all and followed You. Therefore what shall we have?" ²⁸ So Jesus said to them, "Assuredly I say to you, that in the regeneration, when the Son of Man sits on the throne of His glory, *a* you who have followed Me will also sit on twelve thrones, judging F the twelve tribes of Israel. ²⁹ ^bAnd everyone who has left houses or brothers or sisters or father or mother ⁸or wife or children or ⁹lands, for My name's sake, *shall* receive a hundredfold, and inherit eternal life. ³⁰ ^cBut many who are first will be last, and the last first.

PROFILE of the Rich Young Ruler



An earnest man (Mk 10:17) A respectful man (Mk 10:17) A ruler (Lk 18:18) A young man (Mt. 19:22) A rich man (Lk 18:23) A moral man (Mk 10:20) A man seeking how he could have eternal life (Mt. 19:16; Mk 10:17; Lk 18:18) A man not willing to pay the price

(Mt. 19:22; Mk 10:22; Lk 18:23)

ASKTHE MOST IMPORTANT QUESTION

"Good Teacher, what good thing shall I do that I may have eternal life?" The MOST Important question one could ask (Acts 2:37; 9:6; 16:30)

Recognized that there was more than this present life (Luke 10:25; Mark 10:30; Mat 25:46; Rom 2:7; 6:22,23; Tit 1:2; 1 John 5:21; 1 Cor. 15:19)

Eternity is TOO long to settle for the wrong answer! (Mat. 7:13,14; 2 Thes. 1:7-9)

Went To The Right Person!!!

"Good Teacher, what good thing shall I do that I may have eternal life?" "Good teacher ..." high opinion of Jesus as a teacher. (cf. John 3:2)

"Why do you call Me good? No one is good but One, that is, God."-Denoting infinite perfection, Divinity; (Mat 23:6-10)

Jesus not denying His Deity – but affirming it (John 1:1,2; 8:58; 13:13; 17:5; Phili 2:5-10; Col. 1:15-18; Heb. 1:1-3,7-10; Mat 3:17; 17:5)

Jesus was GOOD in the absolute sense (Jn 8:46; 14:30; 2 Cor 5:21; Heb 4:15; 7:26; 1 Pet 2:21,22)

Received The Right Answer

But if you want to enter into life, keep the commandments." "You know the commandments ..." – (required for one living under the OT) (Gal. 3:10-13)

The Law exposes and convicts men of their sin (Rom 3:20; 7:7-9)

Was mistaken about his own righteousness (Acts 13:39; Rom 3:9,19,23; Gal. 3:22)

The Law pointed to Jesus - those justified before and under the Law were justified by faith (vs, 21; Gen. 15:6; Rom. 4:1-6; 10:1-17; Heb 11)

Was Lacking One Thing

"All these things I have kept from my youth. What do I still lack?" 1 Jesus said to him, "... go, sell what you have and give to the poor, and you will have treasure in heaven; and come, follow Me." Being what we may consider a "good person" WILL NOT get us into heaven (Eph. 2:8,9; Jn 8:24; 14:6; Acts 4:12; Rom. 10:1-4)

All it takes is one sin to make one guilty before God (James 2:10; Gal. 3:10, 11; Rom 3:19,20)

Jesus knew his one area of weakness (Luke 12:15-21)

Jesus requires self denial and total commitment (Mark 10:21; Luke 9:23-26; 14:26,27; John 12:25,26)


Was Unwilling To Comply

"All these things I have kept from my youth. What do I still lack?" 1 Jesus said to him, "... go, sell what you have and give to the poor, and you will have treasure in heaven; and come, follow Me." Not a shortage of Jesus's love for him (Mark 10:21)


Love causes one to tell others the truth about what they must do – even if it is not what they want to hear (Mark 10:21,22)

Not a lack of knowledge (21)

Ignorance is no excuse, (Hos. 4:6), but to know & reject is worse (Rom. 10:1-17; 2 Pet 2:20,21)

We MUST seek the RIGHT answer to the MOST IMPORTANT question "what shall I do that I may have eternal life?" (Jn 8:24; Acts 2:37 -> 38-41; 9:6 -> 22:16; 16:30 -> 31-33; Rom. 6:3-18; 10:9-17)

We MUST go to the RIGHT SOURCE and submit to the right authority (Jn 14:6; 12:48; Mt 28:19, 20; Mk 16:16; Acts 2:38-41; etc.)

Our submission to the LORD must be complete (Mat. 7:21-23; 28:20; Lk 6:46; Acts 2:42; Col. 1:23; etc.)

MAKING APPLICATION

"Jesus said to him, "... go, sell what you have and give to the poor, and you will have treasure in heaven; and come, follow Me." Eternal life cannot be purchased or earned, but can ONLY be received when we "deny ourselves and take up our cross and follow Jesus" (Lk 9:23-26; 14:26-27, 33; Matthew 13:44-46; Phil. 3:7-11)

When we, by faith, fully surrender to Jesus Christ, obeying Him as Lord, we receive the salvation He authored through His death, burial and resurrection (Heb. 5:8,9; 12:1-3; Rom. 6:16-23)


MAKING APPLICATION

Our Possessions Can Be DANGEROUS?

- Covetousness, greed (Col. 3:5; Eccl. 5:10; Prov. 1:19; 15:27; 1 Tim. 6:10)
- Trusting in riches (Ps 49:6; Mat. 6:24ff)
- Compromising character to obtain (Prov. 22:1; Titus 1:11; 2 Pet. 2:3)
- Debt (Prov. 22:7; 26,27; 27:13)
- Wasteful spending (Luke 15:13,14)
- Can cause one to lose their soul (Mat 19:23,24; Luke 18:18-23)

¹⁹ "Do not lay up for yourselves treasures on earth, where moth and rust destroy and where thieves break in and steal; ²⁰ but lay up for yourselves treasures in heaven, where neither moth nor rust destroys and where thieves do not break in and steal. ²¹ For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also. ²² "The lamp of the body is the eye. If therefore your eye is good, your whole body will be full of light.

MAKING APPLICATION

"Jesus said to him, "... go, sell what you have and give to the poor, and you will have treasure in heaven; and come, follow Me."

Matthew 6:19–24 (NKJV) ²³ But if your eye is bad, your whole body will be full of darkness. If therefore the light that is in you is darkness, how great is that darkness! ²⁴ "No one can serve two masters; for either he will hate the one and love the other, or else he will be loyal to the one and despise the other. You cannot serve God and mammon.

Are we unwilling to pay the PRICE, or will we truly surrender ALL? Will we go away from the LORD in sorrow, or will we rejoice in Him? The LORD LOVES YOU, but it is your choice!

1 Timothy 6:6–10 (NKJV)

⁶ Now godliness with contentment is great gain. ⁷ For we brought nothing into this world, and it is certain we can carry nothing out. 8 And having food and clothing, with these we shall be content. ⁹ But those who desire to be rich fall into temptation and a snare, and *into* many foolish and harmful lusts which drown men in destruction and perdition. ¹⁰ For the love of money is a root of all kinds of evil, for which some have strayed from the faith in their greediness, and pierced themselves through with many sorrows.
