
WHAT IT MEANS TO WALK W/ GOD

"... The pious followed or practiced God's commands; they "walked" in righteousness (Isa. 33:15), in humility (Mic. 6:8), and in integrity (Ps. 15:2). They also "walk with God" (Gen. 5:22), and they live in His presence, and "walk before" Him (Gen. 17:1), in the sense of living responsibly before Him."




Enoch WALKED with GOD

(Gen 5:22,24)

- Enoch walked by faith (Heb. 11:5, 39; Rom. 10:17)
- Enoch walked (lived) in a way "that he pleased God" (Heb 11:5,6)
- Enoch walked in agreement with God (Amos 3:3)
- We MUST agree with & walk in God's revealed way! (Deut 13:4; Jer. 6:16)

WHAT IT MEANS TO WALK W/ GOD



Noah WALKED with GOD

(Gen 6:9,22; 7:5)

- "Noah was a just man, perfect in his generations" (Gen 6:9)
- Noah walked by faith he feared God, believed God's warning and built the ark (Heb. I I:7; 39; Rom. 10:17)
- Noah did according to all that God commanded him (Gen. 6:22; 7:5)
- We MUST obey God's instructions as given! (Deut 4:2; Mat. 17:5; 28:19,20)

WHAT IT MEANS TO WALK W/ GOD



Judah WALKED with GOD (Hosea 11:12)


- Ephraim, i.e., Israel, the northern tribes had fallen away, but Judah "still walked with God" (Hos. 11:12)
- Hosea prophesied "in the days of Uzziah, Jotham, Ahaz, and Hezekiah" -Judah was "still" faithful to God's commandments (Hos. I:I; 2 Kg 18:4-6)
- We MUST remain faithful to God! Judah later fell away (Jer. 18:12)



WHAT IT MEANS TO WALK W/ GOD

- If we trust God enough to obey Him, we are walking with Him we are pleasing to Him (Heb. I I; 2 Jn 6)
- Walking with God is to walk different than most people around us (Gen. 6; Eph. 4:17; I Jn 5:19)
 - Only those who ACTUALLY follow God's revealed will walk with God mere profession does NOT make it so (Mt 7:21-23; Lk 6:46; 2 Co 11:3,4,13-15)






- God rewards the faithful ...

1 John 2:1-6 (NKJV)

¹ My little children, these things I write to you, so that you may not sin. And if anyone sins, we have an Advocate with the Father, Jesus Christ the righteous. ² And He Himself is the propitiation for our sins, and not for ours only but also for the whole world. ³ Now by this we know that we know Him, if we keep His commandments. ⁴ He who says, "I know Him," and does not keep His commandments, is a liar, and the truth is not in him. ⁵ But whoever keeps His word, truly the love of God is perfected in him. By this we know that we are in Him. ⁶ He who says he abides in Him ought himself also to walk just as He walked.
