- This lesson is NOT about promoting a "positive mental attitude" approach to life, but rather a balanced, informed, and godly approach to life.


Ephesians 4:17–32 (NKJV)

¹⁷ This I say, therefore, and testify in the Lord, that you should no longer walk as the rest of the Gentiles walk, in the futility of their mind, ¹⁸ having their understanding darkened, being alienated from the life of God, because of the ignorance that is in them, because of the blindness of their heart; ¹⁹ who, being past feeling, have given themselves over to lewdness, to work all uncleanness with greediness. ²⁰ But you have not so learned Christ, ²¹ if indeed you have heard Him and have been taught by Him, as the truth is in Jesus: ²² that you put off, concerning your former conduct, the old man which grows corrupt according to the deceitful lusts,

Definition of Attitude

"A settled way of thinking or feeling about someone or something, typically one that is reflected in a person's behavior."

"Beliefs, emotions, and behaviors toward a particular object, person, thing, or event"



How we THINK, FEEL & BEHAVE towards God, His will & His people.

Components of Attitude

- **Cognitive**: Your thoughts and beliefs about the subject.
- Affective: How the object, person, issue, or event makes you feel.
- **Behavioral**: How attitude influences your behavior.



Components of Attitude

- **Cognitive**: Your thoughts and beliefs are formed by accepting the TRUTH.
- Affective: Your thoughts, desires and will are moved to reverence, trust, & love God, His word, & people.
- **Behavioral**: You willingly & joyfully serve and obey Him in thought, word & deed from the heart.
