Components of Attitude

- **Cognitive**: Your thoughts and beliefs about the subject.
- Affective: How the object, person, issue, or event makes you feel.
- **Behavioral**: How attitude influences your behavior.

James 1:23–25 (NKJV) ²³ For if anyone is a hearer of the word and not a doer, he is like a man observing his natural face in a mirror; ²⁴ for he observes himself, goes away, and immediately forgets what kind of man he was. ²⁵ But he who looks into the perfect law of liberty and continues *in it*, and is not a forgetful hearer but a doer of the work, this one will be blessed in what he does.

IF WE RESPECT, BELIEVE & LOVE GOD'S WORD ...



We will see ourselves as God's creation and accountable to Him (Eccle. 12:13,14; Rom. 2:5-11)

We will see ourselves as sinners in need of salvation (Rom. 3:23; 6:23)

We will see ourselves as God does: LOVED / UNDESERVING / DEPENDENT / REDEEMABLE / SAVED or LOST ...



⁹ Also He spoke this parable to some ^ewho trusted in themselves that they were righteous, and despised others: ¹⁰ "Two men went up to the temple to pray, one a Pharisee and the other a tax collector. ¹¹The Pharisee ^fstood and prayed thus with himself, ^gGod, I thank You that I am not like other men—extortioners, unjust, adulterers, or even as this tax collector. ¹²I fast twice a week; I give tithes of all that I possess.' ¹³ And the tax collector, standing afar off, would not so much as raise his eyes to heaven, but beat his breast, saying, 'God, be merciful to me a sinner!' ¹⁴ I tell you, this man went down to his house justified *rather* than the other; ^hfor everyone who exalts himself will be ⁴humbled, and he who humbles himself will be exalted."

The Pharisee (11,12)

Misdirected his prayer – "stood and prayed thus with himself," (11)

Our Attitude Towards

OURSELF MATTERS

- Compared himself to others "God, I thank You that I am not like other men--extortioners, unjust, adulterers, or even as this tax collector." (11)
- Was proud that he had exceeded the requirements of the Law - "I fast twice a week; I give tithes of all that I possess." (12)

Luke 18:10 (NKJV) ¹⁰ "Two men went up to the temple to pray, one a Pharisee and the other a tax collector.

The Pharisee (11,12)

Jesus never condemned the Pharisees for following the Law – but for their hypocrisy, self righteousness, self exaltation, man made traditions and lack of compassion and love (Luke 18:9; Mat 15:7-9; 23)

The Tax Collector (13):

"Standing afar off" An expression of unworthiness.


Our Attitude Towards

OURSELF MATTERS

- "Would not so much as raise his eyes to heaven" expression of guilt.
- "But beat his breast" An expression of grief and anguish.
- "Saying, 'God, be merciful to me a sinner!'" - An expression of dependency (humility) and repentance.



Luke 18:9–14 (NKJV)



CONTRASTING ATTITUDES:

- The Pharisee Superiority, despised others, self righteousness, felt worthy to approach God because of his goodness, self-sufficiency.
- The Tax Collector Humility, unworthiness, penitence, insufficiency.
- Can we see ourselves in either of these two men? If so which one?



Luke 18:9–14 (NKJV)



We must have the right attitude toward ourselves:

- We are all sinners in need of forgiveness & renewal (Isa. 59:1,2; Rom. 3:23; Col. 2:13; Rom. 6:3-6)
- Must be humble, submissive, draw near to God, resist the devil, cleanse our deeds & thoughts (James 4:6-10)
 - We are nothing without Christ (Eph 2:12,13; Rev. 1:6; 5:10)



Luke 18:9–14 (NKJV)



We must have the right attitude toward our deeds:

- No accomplishment is GOOD apart from JESUS (John 15:5)
- Still unworthy (Isa. 64:6; Luke 17:10)
- Salvation can't be earned (Eph. 2:8-10; Rom. 11:6)
- Reception of God's grace requires humble, trusting, loving submission (Mat. 5:3-11; Titus 2:11-14; Heb 5:,8,9; Luke 9:23)



Romans 12:1–16 (NKJV)

³For I say, *f* through the grace given to me, to everyone who is among you, ^gnot to think of himself more highly than he ought to think, but to think soberly, as God has dealt ^hto each one a measure of **faith**. ⁴ For ¹as we have many members in one body, but all the members do not have the same function, ⁵ so ^jwe, being many, are one body in Christ, and individually members of one another.



Romans 12:1–16 (NKJV)

- Romans 12:3 (NKJV) ³ For I say, through the grace given to me, to everyone who is among you, not to think of himself more highly than he ought to think, but to think soberly, as God has dealt to each one a measure of faith.

 - CORRECT THINKING IS INFORMED & PURPOSEFUL THINKING!



Romans 12:1–16 (NKJV)

Romans 12:16 (NKJV) ¹⁶ Be of the same mind toward one another. Do not set your mind on high things, but associate with the humble. Do not be wise in your own opinion.

Think of others above **self** (Phil. 2:1-4) The real danger of money, authority and fame is pride & condescension (| Ti. 6:6–9)



KEYS TO ACCURATE SELF DISCOVERY

- Humility / Teachable (Mat 5:3; Jer. 10:23; Isaiah 6:5)
- Meekness / Submissive (Luke 17:10; James 1:21)
- Honesty / Integrity (Acts 17:11)
- Willing to Examine self & receive correction (Mt. 7:1-3; Ac 17:11; 2 Cor. 13:5; Pr. 15:31-33; 2 Ti 3:16,17)
- **Love** [seek our true & eternal best interest] (Mk 12:29-31; Mt. 16:26)



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Self-denial (Matt. 16:24; Luke 9:23). by esteeming others better than self (Phil. 2:3; John 13:3-17) by humbling oneself before God (1 Pet. 5:6).

Self-control (Prov. 16:32; Gal. 5:23; 2 Pet. 1:6). bringing every thought & action into conformity with the will of God.

Self-sacrifice (2 Cor. 8:5; Rom. 12:1-2). Christians are to be "living sacrifices" unto God-living each day to accomplish the good works for which they were created.

Isaiah 57:15

For thus says the High and Lofty One Who inhabits eternity, whose name is Holy: "I dwell in the high and holy *place*, With him *who* has a contrite and humble spirit, To revive the spirit of the humble, And to revive the heart of the contrite ones.

Isaiah 66:2 (NKJV) For all those things My hand has made, And all those things exist," Says the LORD. "But on this one will I look: On him who is poor and of a contrite spirit, And who trembles at My word.

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Matthew 7:1–5 (NKJV)

¹ "Judge not, that you be not judged. ² For with what judgment you judge, you will be judged; and with the measure you use, it will be measured back to you. ³ And why do you look at the speck in your brother's eye, but do not consider the plank in your own eye? 4 Or how can you say to your brother, 'Let me remove the speck from your eye'; and look, a plank is in your own eye? ⁵ Hypocrite! First remove the plank from your own eye, and then you will see clearly to remove the speck from your brother's eye.
