



THE LAST WORDS OF THE APOSTLE PAUL




2 Timothy 2:7 (NKJV) <sup>7</sup> Consider what I say, and may the Lord give you understanding in all things.

### 2 Timothy 2:8–13 (NKJV)


<sup>8</sup> Remember that Jesus Christ, of the seed of David, was raised from the dead according to my gospel, <sup>9</sup> for which I suffer trouble as an evildoer, even to the point of chains; but the word of God is not chained. <sup>10</sup> Therefore I endure all things for the sake of the elect, that they also may obtain the salvation which is in Christ Jesus with eternal glory. 11 This is a faithful saying: For if we died with Him, We shall also live with Him. 12 If we endure, We shall also reign with *Him*. If we deny Him, He also will deny us. 13 If we are faithless, He remains faithful; He cannot deny Himself.




- "Remember that Jesus Christ ... was raised from the dead"
  - Just as surely as Jesus suffered and "arose a Victor from the dark domain, And He lives forever," so will those who endure suffering (He. 12:2, 3; 1 Co. 15:1,4,11–20)
- "of the seed of David"
  - Jesus, our example, was of the royal line—the Messiah—the King himself demonstrating suffering precedes victory. The cross goes before the crown (Mat. 1:1. Ac. 2:30; 13:23. Ro. 1:3, 4; Re. 5:5; 22:16)



- "according to my gospel"
  - The gospel committed to his trust (1 Ti. 1:11; 2:7; Ro. 2:16; 16:25; 2 Th. 3:1)
  - This gospel is God's power of salvation (Rom. 1:16; 2 Th. 2:14)
  - There is only one gospel (Gal. 1:6-9)
  - Peter preached the exact same gospel in Acts 2:14-41.
  - The gospel of Christ consists of facts to be believe, commands to be obeyed, and the promises to be received by those who believe and obey it (1 Cor. 15:4; Acts 2; Rom 6:3-6, 16-18; 10:9-17; 2 Thes 1:7-9)



- "for which I suffer trouble as an evildoer, even to the point of chains"
  - The preaching of the gospel was the cause of Paul's current imprisonment (1:8, 12, 16. Ac. 9:16; Col. 4:3)
  - The godly will likely suffer unjustly (3:12; 1 Pe. 2:12, 14; 3:16; 4:15)
- "but the word of God is not chained"
  - Even in prison, Paul was preaching, as were others. The word of God could NOT be stopped (Ac. 28:31. Ep. 6:19, 20. Phi. 1:12–14)



- "Therefore I endure all things for the sake of the elect"
  - Paul's faithfulness under the pressure of opposition was an encouragement to all. Hence, he was ready to endure (hupomenō) whatever Nero or anyone else could bring to bear in the form of persecution, for the salvation of souls. (Ep. 3:13; Col. 1:24; 2 Co. 1:6)
  - "elect's sake" identifies those chosen or called of God, which action is accomplished by obedience to the gospel (2 Thess. 2:13, 14; 1 Pe. 2:10).

#### BECAUSE OF OUR EXAMPLE & HOPE

2 Timothy 2:10 (NKJV) <sup>10</sup> Therefore I endure all things for the sake of the elect, that they also may obtain the salvation which is in Christ Jesus with eternal glory.

- "that they also may obtain the salvation which is in Christ Jesus with eternal glory"
  - "Eternal glory" identifies the ultimate reward for faithfulness. It is the consummation of our salvation in heaven. (Ro. 2:7; 2 Co. 4:17; 1 Pe. 1:3-7; 5:10.)
  - Paul often spoke about suffering for righteousness' sake, and associated this eternal glory with it, as a means of encouragement and power to endure (2 Co. 4:17, 18; Ro. 8:17,18).

- "This is a faithful saying:"
  - This expression appears five times in 1 and 2 Timothy and Titus: (1 Ti. 1:15; 3:1; 4:9; 2 Ti. 2:11; Titus 3:8).
  - The word faithful (pistos) means trustworthy (Wuest), or assuredly true (Barnes), or reliable (Lenski).
  - Saying (logos) "denotes the contents of what is expressed by words" (Lenski).
  - What Paul is about to state can be trusted as being absolutely TRUE!

#### "For if we died with Him"

- Metaphorically refers to our self-denial, & repentance which culminated in our baptism (Ro. 6:3-8; Ga. 2:20; Co. 2:12,13; 3:3, 4).
- "We shall also live with Him."
  - We are raised from the waters of baptism to "walk in newness of life," or as our text says, to "live with him" (Rom. 6:4).
  - This present new life relationship is also pictured by Paul in Ep. 2:5, 6 "made us alive together with Christ."

#### "If we endure"

- hupomeno (ὑπομένω, 5278) to continue to bear up despite difficulty and suffering. (Lou-Nida) (Ac. 14:22; Ro. 8:17,18; Phi. 1:28; 2 Th. 1:4–8; 1 Pe. 4:13–16).
- "We shall also reign with Him"
  - We are in a sense reigning with Christ now (cf. Re. 1:6, 9; 5:10; Eph. 2:5, 6)
  - As with the "living with Christ" above, we will reign with Christ in eternal glory (Ac. 14:22. Ro. 8:17. Phi. 1:28. 2 Th. 1:4–8. 1 Pe. 4:13–16).

- "If we deny *Him*, He also will deny us."
  - After setting forth two positive conditions and their consequent blessings, Paul now warns against two negatives and their consequent penalties.
  - The first negative is denying Christ (cf. Matt. 10:33; Mark 8:38; Luke 9:26; 2 Tim. 1:8).
  - Not long after this letter, emperor worship was enforced and demanded of Christians a denial of Christ and honoring the emperor as god.

- "If we are faithless"
  - 'If we are untrue to the Lord Jesus in our Christian lives,' is the idea' (Wuest).
  - This second negative deals with fidelity, or loyalty and faithfulness in every respect if we become unfaithful.
- "He remains faithful; He cannot deny Himself."
  - Should not be understood to say that even if we become unfaithful, Christ will give us eternal life anyway!
  - He keeps his promise whether of reward or punishment. His nature demands it!

#### "If we are faithless"

- Unfruitful branches will be cut off the vine (John 15:1-0)
- The example of the Jews who were saved from Egyptian bondage (1 Cor. 10:1-13; Heb. 3:7-19)
- If we become unfaithful, we will forfeit our hope (Heb. 10:26-39)

- God CANNOT LIE (Nu. 23:19. Tit. 1:2. He. 6:18)
  - God will reward the faithful as He has said (Titus 1:2; 1 Th. 5:24)
  - God will punish the wicked as He has said (2 Pet. 3:1-14)
