


"Paul; An Example of Endurance" (2 Tim. 3:10-13)

- Trusting in God's grace, mercy and peace in the midst of trials, staying true to the scriptures (1:2,3).
- Concern and support for those who contend for the faith (1:4)
- Genuine faith is gained from God's word (1:5; 2 Tim 3:15)
- Fulfilling our duties to God (1:6)
- Faith extinguishes fear (1:7)
- The Value of Being Committed To The Lord, No Matter The Cost" (1:8-12)
- Hold Fast The Pattern (1:13,14)
- Disloyalty vs. Friendship (1:15-18)
- Grace Includes Keeping Rules! (2:1-7)
- Need Endurance & Faithfulness (2:8-13)
- Workers Approved & Honorable Vs. Rejected & Devil Enslaved (2:14-26).




CHAPTER 3


- In this chapter emphasis is placed upon the need for adherence, in word and in deed.
 - (1) Warning of future Perilous Times (3:1-9)
 - ▶ (2) Paul—An Example of Endurance (3:10-13);
 - (3) The Scriptures—Our Safeguard (3:14-17).

2 Timothy 3:10–13 (NKJV)


¹⁰ But you have carefully followed my doctrine, manner of life, purpose, faith, longsuffering, love, perseverance, 11 persecutions, afflictions, which happened to me at Antioch, at Iconium, at Lystra—what persecutions I endured. And out of them all the Lord delivered me. 12 Yes, and all who desire to live godly in Christ Jesus will suffer persecution. ¹³ But evil men and impostors will grow worse and worse, deceiving and being deceived.




- "BUT YOU HAVE CAREFULLY FOLLOWED MY:"
 - **But**: A contrast between the False teachers and Timothy. (3:8,9)
 - You have carefully followed my: For over 14 years Timothy had the honor of serving the Lord with Paul. Timothy was not only fully aware of Paul's teaching and how he lived his life, but also imitated Paul as Paul followed Christ. Timothy experienced Paul's hardships firsthand (cf. 1 Cor. 11:1; Phil. 2:20, 22)



- "BUT YOU HAVE CAREFULLY FOLLOWED MY:"
 - **DOCTRINE:** The teaching Paul had received from the Lord (Gal. 1:11,12; Eph. 3:3–5)
- MANNER OF LIFE: Paul was dedicated to reproducing the life of Christ in his own life, as was Timothy (Phil. 1:21; Gal. 2:20)
 - PURPOSE: Involves decision, determination, and dedication. Paul and Timothy shared the same goal and pursued it relentlessly (cf. Dan. 1:8; Acts 26:16-18; 11:23; Phili. 3:11-14)




- "BUT YOU HAVE CAREFULLY FOLLOWED MY:"
 - FAITH: Probably refers to their shared conviction & trust in the Lord, which encompasses all He says. (1:12,13).
 - LONGSUFFERING: "a state of emotional calm in the face of provocation or misfortune and without complaint or irritation" (Lou-Nida) (cf. Phili. 4:6-13)
 - LOVE: The charity (love) set forth by Paul in 1 Corinthians 13
 - PERSEVERANCE: patiently remains under the load, enduring trials, standing steadfastly (1 Cor. 15:58).




"BUT YOU HAVE CAREFULLY FOLLOWED MY:"


- Persecutions, afflictions, which happened to me at Antioch, at Iconium, at Lystra: Paul refers to things which Timothy witnessed at the very beginning of his life as a Christian.
 - What if you had witnessed and experienced such things when you first learned thee truth, would you have been discouraged from becoming a Christian? Would you have been willing to give your life to such a work?




- "BUT YOU HAVE CAREFULLY FOLLOWED MY:"
 - "What persecutions I endured:"
 Timothy was well aware of the sufferings Paul experienced, but more importantly, he knew Paul endured them (2 Cor. 11:23-33).
 - "And out of them all the Lord delivered me:" The Lord was with Paul through every experience, and gave him strength to endure, and overcome. (1 Cor. 10:13; 2 Co. 1:10)
 - The life of a Christian does not lead around afflictions, but rather, through them (Ps. 34:19; 1 Pe. 1:3-9; 2 Pe. 2:9)



- "THOSE WHO TRULY FOLLOW CHRIST WILL SUFFER PERSECUTION"
 - It was important for Timothy, as for all Christians, to realize that persecution awaits everyone who wants to live a godly life in Christ (cf. John 15:18–21)
 - This spiritual warfare has been going on since the fall of man and will continue till time shall be no more.
 - While we may not suffer the physical persecution endured by early Christians here in the US, (yet), many in other parts of the world do!




- "THOSE WHO TRULY FOLLOW CHRIST WILL SUFFER PERSECUTION"
 - There are other forms of persecution besides physical!
 - Peer pressure,
 - Exclusion & ostracism,
 - Ridicule
 - Cancelation
 - False accusations
 - Christians today have to make their way in a wicked, sensual, hostile, atheistic world, and the wicked do not play nice or fair!




"BUT EVIL MEN AND IMPOSTORS WILL GROW WORSE AND WORSE"

- This verse describes the natural progression of sin in the heart of an individual. It is not static. Its natural tendency is to grow worse.
- Not only describes what is true of sin in one's heart if unchecked, but is true with reference to the future—it is going to get worse (3:1-9).
- Error feeds on itself until it consumes all truth in ones mind, and like a virus, it loves to spread. (2 Pet. 2:3; Mat. 15:14; 2 Thess. 2:10-12).



We too need to carefully follow Paul's doctrine, manner of life, purpose, faith, longsuffering, love, perseverance, persecutions, afflictions (I Cor. II:I)

We can endure whatever evil men may throw at us (Heb. 4:16; I Cor. 10:13; Phili. 4:13)



Please understand, suffering, and even suffering persecution, in and of itself, is NOT a sign one is godly!

BUT - What if we are not suffering persecution in some form?

Could it because we are not living GODLY?
