



2 TIMOTHY



- Trusting in God's grace, mercy and peace in the midst of trials, staying true to the scriptures (1:2,3).
- Concern and support for those who contend for the faith (1:4)
- Genuine faith is gained from God's word (1:5; 2 Tim 3:15)
- Fulfilling our duties to God (1:6)
- Faith extinguishes fear (1:7)
- The Value of Being Committed To The Lord, No Matter The Cost" (1:8-12)
- Hold Fast The Pattern (1:13,14)
- Disloyalty vs. Friendship (1:15-18)
- Grace Includes Keeping Rules! (2:1-7)
- Need Endurance & Faithfulness (2:8-13)
- Workers Approved & Honorable Vs. Rejected & Devil Enslaved (2:14-26).



CHAPTER 3

- In this chapter emphasis is placed upon the need for adherence, in word and in deed.
- (1) Warning of future Perilous Times (3:1-9)
- (2) Paul—An Example of Endurance (3:10-13);
- (3) The Scriptures—Our Safeguard (3:14-17).

2 Timothy 3:14–17 (NKJV) ¹⁴ But you must continue in the things which you have learned and been assured of, knowing from whom you have learned *them*, ¹⁵ and that from childhood you have known the Holy Scriptures, which are able to make you wise for salvation through faith which is in Christ Jesus. ¹⁶ All Scripture is given by inspiration of God, and is profitable for doctrine, for reproof, for correction, for instruction in righteousness, ¹⁷ that the man of God may be complete, thoroughly equipped for every good work.

THE ASSURANCE OF GOD'S WORD

2 Timothy 3:14 (NKJV) ¹⁴ But you must continue in the things which you have learned and been assured of, knowing from whom you have learned *them*,

"BUT YOU MUST CONTINUE:"

- "**But**:" Contrasting the False teachers w/ Timothy. (3:8,9,13)
- "you must continue:" The exhortation is to continue in the things Timothy had learned and become convinced of (2 Tim. 1:13; Titus 1:9; cf. 1 Cor. 15:1–2).
- **"knowing from whom you have learned** *them:*" Timothy had learned from 2 sources, Paul, & the scriptures (1:13; Gal. 1:11,12; Eph 3:3-5)

THE ASSURANCE OF GOD'S WORD

2 Timothy 3:14 (NKJV) ¹⁴ But you must continue in the things which you have learned and been assured of, knowing from whom you have learned *them*, "THE THINGS WHICH YOU HAVE LEARNED AND BEEN ASSURED OF:"

- Timothy had assurance because the ultimate source for what he had learned was God, (the inspired apostle & the Holy Scriptures).
- Paul's teaching was confirmed by miraculous signs, (2 Cor. 12:12), and even his teaching was tested by the Scriptures (cf. Acts 17:11).
- God's word is the TRUTH (Jn 17:17)

THE CAPABILITY OF GOD'S WORD

2 Timothy 3:15 (NKJV) ¹⁵ and that from childhood you have known the Holy Scriptures, which are able to make you wise for salvation through faith which is in Christ Jesus.

- "AND THAT FROM CHILDHOOD YOU HAVE KNOWN THE HOLY SCRIPTURES:"
 - From his childhood his mother, Eunice, and his grandmother, Lois, had taught him the Scriptures (1:5).
 - The expression holy scriptures in this verse obviously refers to the O.T., since the New Testament was not yet in existence during Timothy's childhood. (Jn 5:39; 1 Pe. 1:10–12)
 - This fact does NOT exclude the N.T. from being scripture (2 Pe. 3:15,16)

THE CAPABILITY OF GOD'S WORD

2 Timothy 3:15 (NKJV) ¹⁵ and that from childhood you have known the Holy Scriptures, which are able to make you wise for salvation through faith which is in Christ Jesus.

"WHICH ARE ABLE TO MAKE YOU WISE FOR SALVATION THROUGH FAITH WHICH IS IN CHRIST JESUS:"

- The OT Scriptures are able to "make you wise unto salvation" by its promises, prophecies, shadows, and figures of the Messiah who was to come (Gal. 3:15-29; Jno. 5:39-47).
- - Jesus and His New Covenant was that to which the O.T. pointed (Rom. 10:4; cf. Ac. 2:14-36; 8:30-35; 17:2; 18:28; 28:23)
 - The Scriptures bring salvation for those who believe (Ac. 13:26; Ja. 1:18,21-25; Ro. 1:16; Ep. 1:13; 1 Pet. 1:22,23)

THE SOURCE OF GOD'S WORD

2 Timothy 3:16 (NKJV) ¹⁶ All Scripture *is* given by inspiration of God, and is profitable for doctrine, for reproof, for correction, for instruction in righteousness,

"ALL SCRIPTURE IS GIVEN BY INSPIRATION OF GOD:"

- The expression "all scripture" includes the the OT (v. 15) and the NT, most of which had been written and circulated at the time of this writing. (2 Pet. 3:15,16)
- "Inspiration," i.e., God breathed. The scriptures claim to be from God (2 Peter 1:20-21; 1 Corinthians 2:11–13)
- Scripture claims "Plenary" (*Full; entire; complete; absolute*) and "verbal" inspiration, (*extends to the very words and forms of expression*).

Timothy 3:16 (NKJV) ¹⁶ All Scripture *is* given by inspiration of God, and is profitable for doctrine, for reproof, for correction, for instruction in righteousness,

"ALL SCRIPTURE IS GIVEN BY INSPIRATION OF GOD:"

- God has revealed His will to us through words.
- Words are vehicles of thought and convey concepts.
- The Very Words Of The Bible Are Inspired By God.
 - All of God's Word Is Inspired
 - We accept God's will through accepting the words of Scripture.

THE SOURCE OF GOD'S WORD

INSPIRED

WHAT THEY SAID

Matthew 10:19–20 (NKJV) ¹⁹ But when they deliver you up, do not worry about how or what you should speak. For it will be given to you in that hour what you should speak; ²⁰ for it is not you who speak, but the Spirit of your Father who speaks in you.

WHAT THEY WROTE

2 Peter 1:20–21 (NKJV) ²⁰ knowing this first, that no prophecy of Scripture is of any private interpretation, ²¹ for prophecy never came by the will of man, but holy men of God spoke *as they were* moved by the Holy Spirit.

THE SOURCE OF GOD'S WORD

2 Timothy 3:16 (NKJV) ¹⁶ All Scripture *is* given by inspiration of God, and is profitable for doctrine, for reproof, for correction, for instruction in righteousness,

"ALL SCRIPTURE IS GIVEN BY INSPIRATION OF GOD:"

- Words (Mat 10:19-20; 1 Cor. 2:13).
- Tense (Mat 22:31,32).
- Grammatical number (Gal 3:16).
- Smallest letter & Mark Irrevocable (Mat 5:18).
- Unbreakable (John 10:35).
- Final Authority (Mat 4:4; Gal. 1:6-9; Rev. 22:18,19).

THE SUFFICIENCY OF GOD'S WORD

2 Timothy 3:16 (NKJV) ¹⁶ All Scripture *is* given by inspiration of God, and is profitable for doctrine, for reproof, for correction, for instruction in righteousness,

"AND IS PROFITABLE FOR DOCTRINE, FOR REPROOF, FOR CORRECTION, FOR INSTRUCTION IN RIGHTEOUSNESS:"

- "**Profitable**:" (ophelimos) useful or beneficial, an advantage, (Vine, Lou Nida)
- "doctrine:" (didaskalia) i.e., "teaching," that is, 'teaching material.' (Wuest)
- "reproof" (elegmos), i.e., "a proof, proving, test," (Vine), "convict" (Wuest), "to rebuke another with such effectual wielding of the victorious arms of the truth, as to bring him, if not always to a confession, yet at least to a conviction of his sin." (Trench)

THE SUFFICIENCY OF GOD'S WORD

2 Timothy 3:16 (NKJV) ¹⁶ All Scripture *is* given by inspiration of God, and is profitable for doctrine, for reproof, for correction, for instruction in righteousness,

"AND IS PROFITABLE FOR DOCTRINE, FOR REPROOF, FOR CORRECTION, FOR INSTRUCTION IN RIGHTEOUSNESS:"

- "correction" (epanorthosis), i.e., "to cause something to be or to become correct, with the implication of a previous condition of faults or failures—'to correct, correcting faults.' (Lou Nida); "restoration to an upright or right state, correction or improvement" (Wuest).
 - "instruction in righteousness:" i.e., training and discipline in what is right.
 - The Bible is all-sufficient as a rule book of faith and practice, (as seen in the next verse).

THE SUFFICIENCY OF GOD'S WORD

2 Timothy 3:17 (NKJV) 17 that the man of God may be complete, thoroughly equipped for every good work.

"THAT THE MAN OF GOD:"

- "man of God" Specifically one who provides spiritual leadership to others, (1 Tim. 6:11; Deut. 33:1; 2 Kings 23:17; 2 Pet. 1:21), but certainly by extension applies to anyone who believes and follows the scriptures (Gal. 3:26; Eph. 1:4)
- "may be complete:" (teleios) i.e., full, complete, full grown, lacking nothing.
- "thoroughly equipped for every good work," - The individual whose faith is anchored in the all-sufficiency of the holy Scriptures is well fortified against all foes and for every need of life

THE SUFFICIENCY OF GOD'S WORD

2 Timothy 3:17 (NKJV) ¹⁷ that the man of God may be complete, thoroughly equipped for every good work.

"EQUIPPED FOR EVERY GOOD WORK:"

- Furthermore, the expression "all good works" magnifies and corroborates further the idea of the all-sufficiency of the Scriptures. (Matt. 28:19,20; 2 Pet. 1:3; Jon. 6:63, 67,68)
- If it is a good work, it can be found in the Scriptures. (Deut. 4:2; 12:32; [Josh. 1:7]; Prov. 30:6; [Rev. 22:18, 19].
- If it cannot be found in the Scriptures, the opinion of some to the contrary, it is not a good work. (2 Co. 9:8; Mat. 21:25; 28:19,20; 2 Cor. 5:7; Rom. 10:17)


THE SUFFICIENCY OF GOD'S WORD

2 Timothy 3:17 (NKJV) 17 that the man of God may be complete, thoroughly equipped for every good work.

"Buy the truth, and sell it not" (Prov. 23:23).

- If it costs you your means of earning a livelihood, buy it, because it is worth it.
- If it costs you the dearest relationship on earth, buy it, because it is worth it.
- If it costs you all of your earthly possessions, buy it, because it is worth it.

Having bought it, do not sell it for anything in this world, it is not worth it.


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

Genesis 6:5–12 (NKJV)

⁵ Then the Lord saw that the wickedness of man was great in the earth, and that every intent of the thoughts of his heart was only evil continually. ⁶ And the Lord was sorry that He had made man on the earth, and He was grieved in His heart. ⁷ So the Lord said, "I will destroy man whom I have created from the face of the earth, both man and beast, creeping thing and birds of the air, for I am sorry that I have made them." 8 But Noah found grace in the eyes of the Lord. 9 This is the genealogy of Noah. Noah was a just man, perfect in his generations. Noah walked with God. ¹⁰ And Noah begot three sons: Shem, Ham, and Japheth. ¹¹ The earth also was corrupt before God, and the earth was filled with violence. ¹² So God looked upon the earth, and indeed it was corrupt; for all flesh had corrupted their way on the earth.
