




#### 2 TIMOTHY



- Trusting in God's grace, mercy and peace in the midst of trials, staying true to the scriptures (1:2,3).
- Concern and support for those who contend for the faith (1:4)
- Genuine faith is gained from God's word (1:5; 2 Tim 3:15)
- Fulfilling our duties to God (1:6)
- Faith extinguishes fear (1:7)
- The Value of Being Committed To The Lord, No Matter The Cost" (1:8-12)
- Hold Fast The Pattern (1:13,14)
- Disloyalty vs. Friendship (1:15-18)
- Grace Includes Keeping Rules! (2:1-7)
- Need Endurance & Faithfulness (2:8-13)
- Workers Approved & Honorable Vs. Rejected & Devil Enslaved (2:14-26).





# 2 Timothy 4:1-5 (NKJV)

<sup>1</sup> I charge you therefore before God and the Lord Jesus Christ, who will judge the living and the dead at His appearing and His kingdom: <sup>2</sup> Preach the word! Be ready in season and out of season. Convince, rebuke, exhort, with all longsuffering and teaching. <sup>3</sup> For the time will come when they will not endure sound doctrine, but according to their own desires, because they have itching ears, they will heap up for themselves teachers; 4 and they will turn their ears away from the truth, and be turned aside to fables. 5 But you be watchful in all things, endure afflictions, do the work of an evangelist, fulfill your ministry.

## THE IMPORTANCE OF THE CHARGE




#### "I CHARGE YOU THEREFORE"

- "charge:" "to state something in such a way that the auditor is to be impressed with its seriousness. ...


  (2) to exhort with authority in matters of extraordinary importance, freq. w. ref. to higher powers and/or suggestion of peril, solemnly urge, exhort, warn" [BDAG]
- Indicates the importance and seriousness of what Paul was about to say. (cf. 1 Tim. 5:21)

## THE IMPORTANCE OF THE CHARGE




- "BEFORE GOD AND THE LORD JESUS CHRIST"
  - "before God and the Lord Jesus Christ:" This expression adds even more solemnity to Paul's words that follow.
  - Lenski argues "the translation should read 'Our God, even Christ Jesus,"
  - There are verses in which the word "God" clearly applies to Christ (Acts 20:28; Heb. 1:8).

## THE IMPORTANCE OF THE CHARGE




- "BEFORE GOD AND THE LORD JESUS CHRIST"
  - "who will judge the living and the dead"
    - Jesus will judge all men. (cf. John 5:22; Acts 17:31; Rom. 2:16).
    - Those found alive when Jesus comes again, and the dead are those who shall be raised from the grave at his coming (1 Thess. 4:15-18; 1 Cor. 15:51).

## THE IMPORTANCE OF THE CHARGE



- "BEFORE GOD AND THE LORD JESUS CHRIST"
  - "at His appearing and His kingdom:"—
    - "His appearing" (Acts 1:9; 1 Thess. 4:15-18; 2 Thess. 1:10; Rev. 1:7).
    - "His kingdom" the eternal phase of the kingdom which now exists and of which all Christians are members, and over which Christ now reigns (Col. 1:13; Heb. 12:28, 29; Rev. 1:9; 1 Cor. 15:22-28).

## THE DUTY OF THE PREACHER




- "PREACH" kērussō (κηρύσσω, 2784) signifies (a) "to be a herald," or, in general, "to proclaim," e.g., ... of the ministry of the Scriptures, with special reference to the gospel. [VINES]
  - All the weight of verse 1 bears on this entreaty. Paul could hardly have emphasized the matter more strongly. Because the Word is inspired and profitable for all aspects of the ministry, proclaiming that Word was to be Timothy's business




"That pattern involves preaching with dignity and a seriousness that commands the respect of the audience, being commensurate with the fact that preachers are the heralds of the King of kings, and that their message is indeed grave, authoritative, involving the eternal destiny of mankind in heaven or hell. Such preaching precludes pretty little sermonettes designed to please people rather than God, entertaining the audience with anecdotes, political issues, current events, philosophizing, etc. Furthermore, it demands a full proclamation of the whole counsel of God, without any addition or subtraction (Acts 20:27; 2 John 9; Deut. 4:2). ## THE DUTY OF THE PREACHER




- "Be ready in season and out of season"
   (eukairos) "opportune" and (akairos)
  "inopportune whether circumstances
  are favorable or unfavorable.
- Marshall Keeble is reported as saying, "Preach it when they like it and when they don't like it."
- The responsibility of this charge is too serious, time is too precious for apathy in any measure, souls are at stake, and their eternal destiny depends on it (cf. Eph. 5:15, 16).

## THE DUTY OF THE PREACHER




- "Convince, rebuke, exhort, with all longsuffering and teaching"
  - CONVINCE (reprove) elencho (ἐλέγχω, 1651) "to convict, confute, refute," usually with the suggestion of putting the convicted person to shame …" [VINES]
  - REBUKE *epitimao* (ἐπιτιμάω, 2008), ... (b) to adjudge, to find fault with, rebuke; hence to charge, or rather, to charge strictly (*epi*, intensive), [VINES]
  - EXHORT parakaleo (παρακαλέω, 3870), denotes "to call to one's side," hence, "to call to one's aid." [VINES]

## THE DUTY OF THE PREACHER



- "Convince, rebuke, exhort, with all longsuffering and teaching" —
- ▶ LONG-SUFFERING makrothumia (μακροθυμία, 3115) "a state of emotional calm in the face of provocation or misfortune and without complaint or irritation—'patience.'" [Lou-Nida]
- "L.S. is to be maintained against the temptation to anger presented by the obstinacy and perverseness of certain hearers; such is to be met, not merely with rebuke, but also with sound and reasonable instruction in the truth." [Vincent]

## THE DUTY OF THE PREACHER




- "Convince, rebuke, exhort, with all longsuffering and teaching"—
  - TEACHING (doctrine) didache (διδαχή, 1322), denotes "teaching," either (a) that which is taught, e.g., Matt. 7:28, kjv, "doctrine," rv, "teaching"; Titus 1:9, rv; Rev. 2:14–15,24, or (b) the act of teaching, instruction, [VINES]
  - Would include teaching about practical living; what constitutes moral purity or sinful impurity; the attitudes we are to cultivate; theological truth; soteriology; eschatology; ecclesiology; etc.

#### THE DUTY OF THE PREACHER


#### 2 Timothy 4:3–4 (NKJV) <sup>3</sup> For the time will come when they will not endure sound doctrine, but according to their own desires, because they have itching ears, they will heap up for themselves teachers; 4 and they will turn their ears away from the truth, and be turned aside to fables.

- "For the time will come when they will not endure sound doctrine"—
- Paul's main focus in this passage is on the inclinations of the audience rather than his typical focus on false teachers (cf. 2 Tim. 3:6–7; Gal. 1:10).
- "the time will come" when men will reject sound (healthy) teaching (cf. 1 Tim. 1:10; 6:3; 2 Tim. 1:13; Titus 1:9, 13; 2:8)
- Instead ... they would seek out **teachers** who would tell them what they want to hear (cf. Jer. 5:30, 31; Rom. 1:18–32; 2 Thes. 2:10-12).

#### THINGS NECESSARY TO FULFILLING DUTY




- "But you be watchful in all things"— "to be in a sober mood, to be calm and collected in spirit, to be temperate, dispassionate, circumspect, alert" (Wuest).
- "endure afflictions" Afflictions will come; the opposition will be strong and the foes will be many. (cf. 2:3)
- "do the work of an evangelist" —
  proclaim the gospel at every opportunity
- "fulfill your ministry" "to cause a thing to be shown to the full, to carry through to the end, to fully perform" (Wuest).



This charge Paul gives
Timothy is the same charge
every preacher is duty
bound to follow in order to
be pleasing to Christ!

The desires of the worldly minded, professing disciples, will encourage preachers to abandon this charge, and tell them what they want to hear (Jer. 5:30,31)



Preachers should be committed to preaching the word of God at all times? Even when it is not wanted? What KIND of preaching do we demand?

# Colossians 1:24–29 (NKJV)

<sup>24</sup> I now rejoice in my sufferings for you, and fill up in my flesh what is lacking in the afflictions of Christ, for the sake of His body, which is the church, <sup>25</sup> of which I became a minister according to the stewardship from God which was given to me for you, to fulfill the word of God, 26 the mystery which has been hidden from ages and from generations, but now has been revealed to His saints. <sup>27</sup> To them God willed to make known what are the riches of the glory of this mystery among the Gentiles: which is Christ in you, the hope of glory. <sup>28</sup> Him we preach, warning every man and teaching every man in all wisdom, that we may present every man perfect in Christ Jesus. 29 To this end I also labor, striving according to His working which works in me mightily.
