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





²⁰ O Timothy! Guard what was committed to your trust, avoiding the profane and idle babblings and contradictions of what is falsely called knowledge




- "GUARD WHAT WAS COMMITTED TO YOUR TRUST" (20)
 - ▶ GUARD : (phulassō) means "to keep / to preserve"
 - WHAT WAS COMMITTED: God's truth, the gospel (2 Timothy 2:2),
 - * Timothy is expected to guard this truth, that is, preach it faithfully without any addition or subtraction (2 Timothy 4:2).
 - Do we feel the same responsibility to guard God's truth? (Proverbs 23:23).




"GUARD WHAT WAS COMMITTED TO YOUR TRUST" (20)

- This solemn charge rings loud and clear from the beginning to the very end of this epistle (cf. 1:3, 18-20; 4:1-6, 16; 6:3-5, 12-14, 20, 21; cf. also 2 Tim. 2:2).
 - * "Teach no other doctrine" (1:3)
 - * "This charge I commit to you ... wage the good warfare, ¹⁹ having faith and a good conscience, which some having rejected, concerning the faith have suffered shipwreck," (1:18-20)




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- This solemn charge rings loud and clear from the beginning to the very end of this epistle (cf. 1:3, 18-20; 4:1-6, 16; 6:3-5, 12-14, 20, 21; cf. also 2 Tim. 2:2).
 - * "If you instruct the brethren in these things, you will be a good minister of Jesus Christ, nourished in the words of faith and of the good doctrine which you have carefully followed." (4:6)



"GUARD WHAT WAS COMMITTED TO YOUR TRUST" (20)



 - * "Take heed to yourself and to the doctrine. Continue in them, for in doing this you will save both yourself and those who hear you." (4:16)
 - Fight the good fight of faith, lay hold on eternal life (6:12)




"GUARD WHAT WAS COMMITTED TO YOUR TRUST" (20)

2 Timothy 4:1–2 (NKJV)

¹ I charge you therefore before God and the Lord Jesus Christ, who will judge the living and the dead at His appearing and His kingdom: ² Preach the word! Be ready in season and out of season. Convince, rebuke, exhort, with all longsuffering and teaching.




- "AVOIDING THE PROFANE & IDLE BABBLINGS & CONTRADICTIONS" (20)
 - AVOIDING: The tense here is present, he must continue to avoid using such things. (6:3-5; Rom. 1:16)
 - PROFANE: "of the world, of the earth, ungodly" (1:9; Heb. 12:16)
 - IDLE BABBLINGS: "(kenophōnia) "empty voices" / Arguments with no real content" (Reese p. 303)
 - CONTRADICTIONS: a statement which is in direct contradiction or is logically inconsistent with the truth of God's word.




"WHAT IS FALSELY CALLED KNOWLEDGE" (20)

- FALSE KNOWLEDGE: gnosis (γνῶσις, 1108), primarily "a seeking to know, an enquiry, investigation"
- Those who advocate error often claim their error is the true enlightened knowledge from God.
- It is nothing new for someone to claim that they have a superior knowledge, but it is NOT TRUE knowledge if it differs from what is revealed in the Bible. (Ro. 1:22. 1 Co. 1:19–23; 2:6; 3:19. Col. 2:8, 18)




- "SOME HAVE STRAYED CONCERNING THE FAITH" (21)
 - ▶ BY PROFESSING IT SOME HAVE STRAYED: The danger of people professing such false-knowledge is that it had led some Christians away from the faith. (Such had actually happened in Ephesus to some of the members) (Acts 20:29-31; 1:6,7,19,20; cf. Titus 1:14)
 - CONCERNING THE FAITH: faith is used in the objective sense, meaning the gospel (Acts 6:7; Jude 3; cf. 1:6, 7; 6:10).




"GRACE BE WITH YOU. AMEN." (21)

- Paul's benediction, "grace be with you" is brief, but not uncommon (cf. Gal. 6:18; 2 Tim. 4:22; Titus 3:15).
- "This benediction may be brief, but it is rich in meaning, for grace (all the help that God can give a man) is the greatest blessing of all. With that help, Timothy can carry out all the charges given in this epistle" (Reese p. 306).



"GRACE BE WITH YOU. AMEN." (21)

- God has provided us with everything we need to "guard the faith" as well.
 - * We can know the truth
 - We can recognize error
 - We can use the truth to expose error —
- We too must avoid the temptation to incorporate worldly wisdom and human philosophies into the gospel message, or into our strategies and work as God's people.
