### GRACE

- 1. charis (χάρις, Strong's # 5485; L.N. 25.89)
- (1) on the part of the bestower, the friendly disposition from which the kindly act proceeds, graciousness, loving-kindness, goodwill generally, e.g., Acts 7:10; especially with reference to the divine favor or "grace," e.g., Acts 14:26; in this respect there is stress on its freeness and universality, ...thus it is set in contrast with debt, Rom. 4:4, 16, with works, 11:6, and with law, John 1:17;



# GRACE "Unmerited Favor"

- God NOT under obligation to man (Rom 4:4, 5; Mat 18:23-35)
- God's love is unmerited! (John 3:16; Rom 5:8; 1 John 4:9,10)
- The means of salvation is unmerited! (Mat 26:28; Rom 5:8-10; 10:513; Heb. 2:9)
- Every spiritual blessing we receive in Christ is unmerited (Ep 1:3: Col. 1:19: 2:9.10)

# GRACE "Unmerited Favor"

- Salvation is by grace [*We do not deserve it nor can we earn it*] (Titus 2:11; 3:5-7; Ro. 3:24; 4:4; 11:6; Ep. 1:7; 2:5-8; 2 Thes. 2:16)
- We have a choice to receive / continue in (Acts 13:43; Gal. 5:4; Heb. 10:29; 12:15)
- The doctrine of grace has been abused (Rom. 6:1,15; Jude 1:4)

### Ephesians 2:1-10

2 And ayou He made alive, bwho were dead in trespasses and sins, <sup>2</sup>cin which you once walked according to the ¹course of this world, according to dthe prince of the power of the air, the spirit who now works in ethe sons of disobedience, <sup>3</sup>famong whom also we all once conducted ourselves in gthe lusts of our flesh, fulfilling the desires of the flesh and of the mind, and hwere by nature children of wrath, just as the others.

### Ephesians 2:1-10

<sup>4</sup> But God, <sup>i</sup>who is rich in mercy, because of His jgreat love with which He loved us, 5 keven when we were dead in trespasses, made us alive together with Christ (by grace you have been saved), <sup>6</sup> and raised us up together, and made us sit together min the heavenly places in Christ Jesus, 7 that in the ages to come He might show the exceeding riches of His grace in <sup>n</sup>His kindness toward us in Christ Jesus.

#### **DEAD / LOST**

Because of sin, Worldliness, Disobedience Verses 1-4, 5

#### GRACE / MERCY

God's love provided a way for men to be made alive, saved, raised Verses 1,4,5,6

#### **ALIVE / SAVED**

Via our faith, we are made alive, saved, raised, in Christ Verses 1,6-10

### WHICH VIEW DOES THE BIBLE REACH?

#### UNCONDITIONAL:

#### All of God, NONE of man.

We contribute
NOTHING in regard
to our salvation.
Any act of obedience
from us nullifies
God's grace.

#### CONDITIONAL:

#### God provided the means and instructions.

We receive salvation through trusting God enough to submit to His terms.

Submission does not earn our salvation.

#### MERITED / EARNED


### None of God, ALL of man.

We are good enough to be saved.

We have done enough good deeds to outweigh our bad.

We climb our way to God doing enough good to deserve His favor.



# GRACE "Unmerited Favor"

- Our perspective of God's GRACIOUSNESS should ALWAYS be that of an unworthy, totally dependent servant (Luke 17:10)
- We DO NOT & CANNOT deserve a single thing from God!
- If we have sinned, (Rom. 3:23), we deserve DEATH (Rom. 6:23)

# GRACE "Unmerited Favor"

- Grace does NOT nullify the Law of Christ (Gal 6:2; Rom 6:1; 8:1)
- Grace does NOT permit the one who has received it to continue in sin (Rom 6:1,2; 1 Pet 1:14; 2:16; 4:1-4; Gal 5:13; 1 Jn 3:4)
- Grace does not exclude obedience (Gal 2:20; Heb 5:8.9; Rom. 6:15-18; Eph. 2:10)

#### Ephesians 2:8-9 (NKJV)

<sup>8</sup> For by grace you have been saved through faith, and that not of yourselves; *it is* the gift of God, <sup>9</sup> not of works, lest anyone should boast.

### GRACE

"Unmerited Favor"

- Noah saved by grace through faith (Gen. 6:8; Heb 11:7)
- Naaman healed by grace through faith (2 Kings 5:1-19; Lk 4:27)
- Walls of Jericho fell by grace through faith (Joshua 6:2,15,16,20; Heb 11:30)
- When we by FAITH obey, grace is received not nullified!

#### SAVED BY GRACE

GOD SPEAKS MAN HEARS MAN OBEYS BY FAITH

GOD SAVES

Noah - Gen. 6:8,13-17; 22; 7:5; Heb 11:7

**Abraham** – Gen 12:4; 15:6; 17:10,23; 22:3,16-18

Israel – Ex. 12:13; 14:30; Dt 30:15-19; Jos 6; 1 Cor 10:1-13

Us – Mark 16:16; Acts 2:38; 8:12,37; Rom 6:3-6; 10:9-13; Gal. 3:26,27; Col. 2:11-13; 1 Pet 3:21; 1 Jn 1:9

Paul's point is either a thing is deserved or it is NOT.

Jew NOR Gentile deserved to be saved by God!

How can any sinner deserve a right standing with God?

### GRACE

"Unmerited Favor"

#### Romans 11:6 (NKJV)

<sup>6</sup> And if by grace, then *it is* no longer of works; otherwise grace is no longer grace. But if *it is* of works, it is no longer grace; otherwise work is no longer work.

### GRACE IS PREACHED WHEN WE PREACH

### GOD'S PROVISION of SALVATION

- We are all sinners in need of salvation (Ecc. 7:20; Rom. 3:23; Gal. 3:22; etc.)
- We CANNOT save ourselves from our sins (Is. 59:1,2; 64:6; Jer. 10:23; Rom 6:23; 7:23,24)
- Jesus died on the cross to provide an acceptable sacrifice for our sins (Is. 53:11; Mt. 26:28; Jn 3:16; Rom. 5:8-10; Heb. 2:9; 9:14,15,26,27; 10:12; 1 Jn 2:1,2; etc)
- Jesus was buried, but three days later was raised to sit on His throne (Jn. 14:9; Acts 2:29-36; Ro. 4:25; 5:10,18; 1 Cor. 15:17; etc.)

### GRACE IS PREACHED WHEN WE PREACH

### GOD'S PLAN of SALVATION

- We MUST hear these facts & believe them to be true, and place our trust in Jesus (Jn. 3:14-18; 8:24; Acts 2:41; Rom. 10:1-17)
  - We MUST CONFESS (Mt. 10:32; Ro. 10:9,10)
  - We MUST REPENT (Acts 2:38; 3:19; 17:30,31; 20:21; 26:20; Rom. 2:5-10; 2 Cor. 7:9,10; 2 Pet. 3:9)
  - We MUST be BAPTIZED in the name of Jesus for the remission of our sins (Mt. 28:19; Mk. 16:16; Acts 2:38; ...

### GRACE IS PREACHED WHEN WE PREACH

### ON BAPTISM ...

- It is by God's grace we are saved Jesus said "*He who believes and is baptized will be saved*" (Mk 16:16; cf. 1 Pt. 3:21)
- It is by God's grace we are forgiven of our sins (Acts 2:38; Col. 2:12,13)
- It is by God's that we become children of God (Gal. 3:26,27)
- It is by God's grace that we are baptized into Christ's death and raised to spiritual life in Christ (Rom. 6:1-18)

### GRACE IS PREACHED WHEN WE PREACH

### HOW WE ARE TO LIVE AS CHRISTIANS

### The GRACE of God teaches us

- Grace teaches us to deny ungodliness & worldly lusts, and to live soberly, righteously, & godly (Titus 2:11,12)
- Grace teaches us live holy lives (Rom. 6:1-24; 1 Pet. 1:13-16)
- Grace instructs us to be faithful and fruitful (Acts 11:23; 13:43; Rom. 12:3; 15:15; Col. 1:6; 2 Thes. 1:12)
- Grace teaches us how to overcome sin (Rom. 6-8; Eph. 6:10-18; 1 Cor. 10:13)

### GRACE IS PREACHED WHEN WE PREACH

### THE WORD OF GOD (2 Tim 4:2)

### The GRACE of God teaches us

- The faithful preacher will preach the word when people want it and when they don't (2 Tim. 4:2-4)
- It is God's grace that warns us of the danger of apostasy, both individually and corporately (1 Cor. 10:1-13; Gal. 5:1-4; 1 Tim 4:1-6; 2 Tim. 3:1-9)
- It is God's grace that warns us about sin, error, and the judgment, as well as the way of deliverance (Acts 24:25; Rom. 2:5-11; 6:23; etc.)

### GRACE IS PREACHED WHEN WE PREACH

### THE WORD OF GOD (2 Tim 4:2)


### The GRACE of God teaches us

- What has the grace of God revealed in the scriptures teach about ...
  - The Lord's church It's unity, organization, worship and work?
  - The duties of husbands, wives, fathers, mothers and children?
  - Mow we are to love one another?
  - Sin what it is, what it does to us?
  - The 2nd coming / Hell / HEAVEN

#### DO WE WANT THE BIBLICAL VERSION of GRACE?



- What do people expect to hear when "GRACE" is preached?
  - Some expect to hear the whole council of God (Acts 20:24-27)
  - Some expect to hear how God's grace can deliver them from the guilt, practice and bondage of sin (Rom. 6-8; Eph. 6:10-18; 2 Pet. 1:5-10)
  - Sadly, some expect to hear that God's grace will overlook their sin, allow them to continue in sin and save them even though they refuse to repent of their sin. (Rom. 2:5-11; 1 Jn 1:5-2:4; 3:1-9)



Grace Does NOT nullify OUR DUTY to obey God!

Grace Does NOT grant permission or liberty to sin!

Grace does NOT pardon sin we REFUSE to repent of.

Grace Demands Faith, Repentance & Obedience!

### Titus 2:11–12 (NKJV)

<sup>11</sup> For the grace of God that brings salvation has appeared to all men, 12 teaching us that, denying ungodliness and worldly lusts, we should live soberly, righteously, and godly in the present age,

- Because of God's love and mercy He has provided the means of forgiveness for sin!! John 3:16; Acts 2:38; Eph. 2:1-10; 1 Jn 1:5-2:1,2
  - The Grace of God is to have abiding results in the life of the child of God!! Titus 2:11-14; Romans 6;8;12:1,2; 1 Pet 1:13-19
