## A Transliteration

# BAPTISM = IMMERSION



- The concept consists of both "submersion and emergence"
- The term itself does NOT specify the element into which a thing is immersed and is used metaphorically (Mt 3:7, 10-12; Mk 10:38-39; Ac 1:5-8)
- The most common usage of the term in the NT refers to being immersed in water (John 3:23; Acts 8:36-39; 10:48)





▶ IS NOT baptism of the Holy Spirit - Element: the Holy Spirit / Promised to apostles / Given directly by Jesus / Occurred two times in the NT / Not an action of man / Not common to all (Mt. 3:11; Ac 1:5,8; 2:1-13; 10:44-46)



"One Baptism" - The baptism of the great commission - Baptism in the name of Jesus.

"Baptized in the name of the Lord"



- The baptism of the great commission was Commanded by the Lord and to be administered by men (Mt 28:18-20; Mk 16:15,16; Acts 2:38; 8:36-38; 22:16)
- Received by believers beginning on the day of Pentecost in obedience to the great commission (Acts 2:37-41)
- Administered throughout the book of Acts & to continue throughout this age (Mt 28:19-20; Mk 16:16; Ac 2:38,41; 8:12; 10:47,48; 19:5)

## **ONE BAPTISM** = "Baptized in the name of the Lord"

- ✓ For (*eis*), unto the remission of sins (Ac 22:16)
- ✓ Distinct from H S baptism, reception
- ✓ Involves water (Acts 8:36-39;
  10:47)
- ✓ A command to be obeyed requiring understanding & trust.

- Acts 2:38 (NKJV) Then Peter said to them, "Repent, and let every one of you be <u>baptized in</u> <u>the name of Jesus Christ</u> for the remission of sins; and you shall receive the gift of the Holy Spirit.
- Acts 8:16 (NKJV) For as yet He had fallen upon none of them. They had only been <u>baptized in</u> the name of the Lord Jesus.
- Acts 10:47, 48 (NKJV) <sup>47</sup> "Can anyone forbid water,... <sup>48</sup>And he commanded them to be baptized in the name of the Lord.
- Acts 19:5 (NKJV) When they heard this, they were baptized in the name of the Lord Jesus.

To teach that ANY of these are the one baptism that is in obedience to Christ is a teaching from men - NOT GOD!

- Not Holy Spirit baptism (Acts 8:12-16)
- Not John's baptism (Acts 19:1-5)
- Not Infant "baptism" (not baptism or believers)
- Sprinkling or pouring water on someone (not baptism / not authorized by Christ)
- ▶ Baptized because already been saved (Not the baptism commanded by Jesus or His apostles [an outward sign of an inward grace] (Mark 16:16; Acts 2:38; 22:16; Rom 6:3-6; Gal. 3:26,27; Col. 2:12,13; 1 Pet. 3:21)
- Baptized into a denomination (Ac 2:38,41,47; 8:36-39; Rom 6:3-6; Gal 3:27; Col 2:12,13

## Just Any Old Baptism Will NOT Do!




To teach that ANY of these are the one baptism that is in obedience to Christ is a teaching from men - NOT GOD!


- Faith requires a knowledge of the truth - not only about the person & authority of Jesus Christ, but also knowledge of the purpose for our obedience (Rom 10:17; Acts 2:38-41; 8:12; 19:1-6)
- One cannot be taught error, believe error and obey truth (John 8:32; Acts 19:1-6)

## The One Baptism Is A Baptism of Unity!




- Enters INTO the "one body" (Acts 2:41,47; 1 Cor. 12:13; Gal. 3:26,27)
- Accepts what the "one Spirit" gives (1 Cor. 12:13; Ac 2:38; 18:8; cf. Mt. 28:19),
- Receives the call of the "one hope" (Eph. 4:4; Acts 2:38-41; 8:39; Titus 1:2)
- Obeys & thus belongs to the "one Lord" (Ep. 4:5; Mt 28:19; Rom. 6:16-18)
- Accepts the "one faith" becoming a believer (Acts 16:34; Rom. 1:16)
- Becomes a child of the "one God" by faith (Mat. 28:19; Gal. 3:26,27)

How Does Baptism Save Us?



- The saving power of baptism is not in the water or in the act itself (Act 19:1-6; Gen. 6; 1 Kings 5; Josh 6)
- The saving power of baptism is not in the person baptizing you (Acts 22:16; Col 2:12-13)
- The saving power lies in what Christ has done for us, (Ro 6:3-6; 1 Pt 3:21), and our faith's response to His sacrifice, authority & promises (Col 2:12,13; 1 Pet 1:22,23

How Does Baptism Save Us?



- When the believer is baptized in the name of Christ, the believer is:
  - Forgiven of sins by contacting the blood of Christ (Acts 2:38; 22:16; Rom 6:3; Col. 2:12,13)
  - Added to the body of Christ (Acts 2:38,41,47; 1 Cor 12:13; Gal. 3:26,27)
  - Raised to walk in newness of life (Jn 3:3-5; Rom 6:3-6; Col 2:12,13; Tit 3:5; 1 Pet 1:22,23)

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## 1 Corinthians 12:12–18 (NKJV)

<sup>12</sup> For as the body is one and has many members, but all the members of that one body, being many, are one body, so also is Christ. 13 For by one Spirit we were all baptized into one body—whether Jews or Greeks, whether slaves or free—and have all been made to drink into one Spirit. 14 For in fact the body is not one member but many. 15 If the foot should say, "Because I am not a hand, I am not of the body," is it therefore not of the body? 16 And if the ear should say, "Because I am not an eye, I am not of the body," is it therefore not of the body? 17 If the whole body were an eye, where would be the hearing?
