James 1:23–25 (NKJV)


²³ For if anyone is a hearer of the word and not a doer, he is like a man observing his natural face in a mirror; ²⁴ for he observes himself, goes away, and immediately forgets what kind of man he was. ²⁵ But he who looks into the perfect law of liberty and continues in it, and is not a forgetful hearer but a doer of the work, this one will be blessed in what he does.

IF WE RESPECT, BELIEVE & LOVE GOD'S WORD ...



- We will see ourselves as God's creation and accountable to Him (Eccle. 12:13,14; Rom. 2:5-11)
- We will see ourselves as sinners in need of salvation (Rom. 3:23; 6:23)
- We will see ourselves as God does: LOVED / UNDESERVING / UNWORTHY / DEPENDENT / REDEEMABLE / SAVED or LOST ...

Luke 18:9-14 (NKJV)

- **The Pharisee (11,12)**
 - Misdirected his prayer "stood and prayed thus with himself," (11)
 - Saw himself better than others "God, I thank You that I am not like other men--extortioners, unjust, adulterers, or even as this tax collector." (11)
 - Was proud that he had exceeded the requirements of the Law "I fast twice a week; I give tithes of all that I possess." (12)

Luke 18:9–14 (NKJV)

- **The Pharisee (11,12)**
 - ▶ Jesus never condemned the Pharisees for following the Law – but for their hypocrisy, self righteousness, self exaltation, man made traditions and lack of compassion and love (Luke 18:9; Mat 15:7-9; 23)





Luke 18:9–14 (NKJV)


- The Tax Collector (13):
 - "Standing afar off" An expression of unworthiness.
 - "Would not so much as raise his eyes to heaven" expression of guilt & shame.
 - "But beat his breast" An expression of grief and anguish.
- "Saying, 'God, be merciful to me a sinner!'" An expression of dependency (humility) and repentance.

- CONTRASTING ATTITUDES:
 - **The Pharisee** Superiority, despised others, self righteousness, felt worthy to approach God because of his goodness, self-sufficiency.
 - The Tax Collector Humility, unworthy, penitent, insufficiency, accountability.
- Can we see ourselves in either of these two men? If so which one?



Luke 18:9–14 (NKJV)



A GODLY ATTITUDE TOWARDS SELF:

- Recognizes I am a sinner in need of God's mercy, forgiveness & renewal (Isa. 59:1,2; Rom. 3:23; Col. 2:13; Rom. 6:3-6)
- Recognizes my need to be humble, submissive, draw near to God, resist the devil, cleanse our deeds & thoughts (James 4:6-10)
- Recognizes I am nothing without Christ (Eph 2:12,13; Rev. 1:6; 5:10)



Luke 18:9-14 (NKJV)



A GODLY ATTITUDE TOWARDS DEEDS:

- Understands no accomplishment is GOOD apart from JESUS (John 15:5)
- Understands they will never make me worthy before God (Isa. 64:6; Luke 17:10)
- Understands salvation can't be earned or deserved (Eph. 2:8-10; Rom. 11:6; Luke 17:10)
- Understands reception of God's grace requires humble, trusting, loving submission (Mat. 5:3-11; Titus 2:11-14; Heb 5:8,9; Luke 9:23)

I beseech you therefore, brethren, by the mercies of God, that you present your bodies a living sacrifice, holy, acceptable to God, which is your reasonable service. ² And do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind, that you may prove what is that good and acceptable and perfect will of God. ³ For I say, through the grace given to me, to everyone who is among you, not to think of himself more highly than he ought to think, but to think soberly, as God has dealt to each one a measure of faith.



Romans 12:16 (NKJV)


16 Be of the same mind toward one another. Do not set your mind on high things, but associate with the humble.

Towards OURSELVES


A GODLY ATTITUDE TOWARDS SELF PROMOTES:



- Humility / Teachable (Mat 5:3; Jer. 10:23; Isaiah 6:5)
- Meekness / Submission (Eccl. 12:13,14; Luke 17:10; James 1:21)
- Honesty / Integrity (Acts 17:11)
- Honest Self Examination / Receiving Correction (Mt. 7:1-3; Ac 17:11; 2 Cor. 13:5; Pr. 15:31-33; 2 Ti 3:16,17)
- Loving / Serving [seek our true & eternal best interest] (Mk 12:29-31; Mt. 16:26)



A GODLY ATTITUDE TOWARDS SELF PROMOTES:



James 3:13-18 (NKJV)

13 Who is wise and understanding among you? Let him show by good conduct that his works are done in the meekness of wisdom. ... ¹⁷ But the wisdom that is from above is first pure, then peaceable, gentle, willing to yield, full of mercy and good fruits, without partiality and without hypocrisy. ¹⁸ Now the fruit of righteousness is sown in peace by those who make peace.

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A GODLY ATTITUDE TOWARDS SELF PROMOTES:



- Self-denial (Matt. 16:24; Luke 9:23). by esteeming others better than self (Phil. 2:3; John 13:3-17) by humbling oneself before God (1 Pet. 5:6).
- Self-control (Prov. 16:32; Gal. 5:23; 2 Pet. 1:6). bringing every thought & action into conformity with the will of God.
- Self-sacrifice (2 Cor. 8:5; Rom. 12:1-2). Christians are to be "living sacrifices" unto God-living each day to accomplish the good works for which they were created.

MUCH DEPENDS ON WHICH MIRROR WE USE

Isaiah 57:15

For thus says the High and Lofty One Who inhabits eternity, whose name is Holy: "I dwell in the high and holy place, With him who has a contrite and humble spirit, To revive the spirit of the humble, And to revive the heart of the contrite ones.

MUCH DEPENDS ON WHICH MIRROR WE USE

Isaiah 66:2 (NKJV) For all those things My hand has made, And all those things exist," Says the LORD. "But on this one will I look: On him who is poor and of a contrite spirit, And who trembles at My word.

- Do we will see ourselves as God's creation & accountable to Him (Ecc. 12:13,14; Rom. 2:5-11; Heb 11:13-16)
- Do we see ourselves as sinners in need of God's mercy & salvation (Titus 3:1-5; Rom. 3:23; 6:23)
- Do we see ourselves as God does: UNDESERVING / DEPENDENT / REDEEMABLE / LOVED / SAVED or LOST (Jn 3:16-21)

- CREATED FOR GOD'S SERVICE
- ACCOUNTABLE TO OUR CREATOR
- GUILTY OF SINNING AGAINST GOD
- RESPONSIBLE FOR OUR CHOICES
- UNWORTHY OF SALVATION
- INCAPABLE OF REDEEMING OURSELVES
- LOVED BY GOD / GAVE HIS SON FOR US
- ONLY MADE ACCEPTABLE TO GOD IN CHRIST
- WILL EXIST FOREVER / HEAVEN OR HELL

- ▶ HEAR THE GOSPEL
- BELIEVE THE GOSPEL, THAT JESUS IS THE CHRIST, THE SON OF GOD -THAT HE DIED FOR YOU AND IS THE RISEN LORD
- CONFESS JESUS AS LORD
- REPENT / TURN FROM YOURSELF, FROM SIN, AND TO GOD
- BE BAPTIZED INTO CHRIST FOR THE FORGIVENESS OF YOUR SINS
- ▶ LIVE FOR JESUS / IMITATE HIM

(Matthew 16:16-19; Ephesians 5:22-31; 2 Corinthians 11:28)

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1 Corinthians 11:27–32 (NKJV)

²⁷ Therefore whoever eats this bread or drinks this cup of the Lord in an unworthy manner will be guilty of the body and blood of the Lord. 28 But let a man examine himself, and so let him eat of the bread and drink of the cup. 29 For he who eats and drinks in an unworthy manner eats and drinks judgment to himself, not discerning the Lord's body. ³⁰ For this reason many are weak and sick among you, and many sleep. ³¹ For if we would judge ourselves, we would not be judged. ³² But when we are judged, we are chastened by the Lord, that we may not be condemned with the world.
