

James 4:13–17 (NKJV)

13 Come now, you who say, "Today or tomorrow we will go to such and such a city, spend a year there, buy and sell, and make a profit"; 14 whereas you do not know what will happen tomorrow. For what is your life? It is even a vapor that appears for a little time and then vanishes away. 15 Instead you ought to say, "If the Lord wills, we shall live and do this or that." 16 But now you boast in your arrogance. All such boasting is evil. 17 Therefore, to him who knows to do good and does not do it, to him it is sin.

Problem Of Self Confidence (13)

James 4:13 (NKJV) 13 Come now, you who say, "Today or tomorrow we will go to such and such a city, spend a year there, buy and sell, and make a profit";

- Planned a time to start: "Today or tomorrow"
- Planned the place to trade: "Such and such a city"
- Planned how long the venture would last: – "Spend a year there"
- Planned their activities: "Buy and sell"
- Planned the results: "And make a profit."

Problem Of Self Confidence (13)

James 4:13 (NKJV) 13 Come now, you who say, "Today or tomorrow we will go to such and such a city, spend a year there, buy and sell, and make a profit";

- Their sin was not in "planning for the future" but rather leaving God's will out of their plans (Note verse 15)
- Planning that takes God's will prayerfully into consideration is in fact necessary! (Acts 15:36; 18:20-21; 1 Co 16:5-9)
- How can we know God's will in all of these areas? (2 Tim 2:15; Mat 6:33; Jam. 1:5; Rom. 8:28)

The Lack of Knowledge & Control - (14)

James 4:14 (NKJV) 14 whereas you do not know what will happen tomorrow. For what is your life? It is even a vapor that appears for a little time and then vanishes away.

- We Do Not Know What Will Happen
 Tomorrow! (Proverbs 27:1; Luke 12:19,20;
 2 Cor. 6:2; Eccl. 6:12; 8:16,17)
- We Cannot Control What Happens Tomorrow (Life itself is Uncertain)
 - Life is FRAIL (14b; Ps 39:5-6,11; Jas 1:10-11)
 - Life is BRIEF (14c; Job 9:25-26; Job 14:1; 1 Jn 2:17)

The Right Perspective On Planning – (15)

James 4:15 (NKJV) 15 Instead you ought to say, "If the Lord wills, we shall live and do this or that."

- I must first seek God's approval (Col. 3:17; 1:10; 1 Thes 4:1; 1 John 3:22)
- Contingent on God's permission (Mat 26:39; 1 Co 16:7; Heb. 6:3; Job 1:6-12)
- We are not in control of circumstances or situations that may arise (Deut. 29:29; Ac 18:21; Acts 16:6-10; Rom. 8:28)
- We CONTROL our CHOICES & ACTIONS
 NOW (Mat. 6:19-33; 26:39; 2 Cor. 6:2)

Planning Without God Is Boastful, Arrogant & Evil (16)

James 4:16
(NKJV)

16 But now you
boast in your
arrogance. All such
boasting is evil.

- To plan without taking into consideration God's will is to set ourselves above God! (16; Ps. 52:7)
- Such boasting is evil (16; Is. 47:7-10; Luke 12:15-21)

Don't Procrastinate - Take Advantage of Today – (16,17)

James 4:17 (NKJV) 17 Therefore, to him who knows to do good and does not do it, to him it is S111.

- Take advantage of NOW TODAY
 (2 Cor. 6:2; Acts 24:25)
 - Thousands of things will compete for our time every day!
 - Do we distinguish between "Urgent" things and "Important" things?
 - Our time needs to be put on a budget as much as our money!

Don't Procrastinate - Take Advantage of Today — (16,17)

James 4:17 (NKJV) 17 Therefore, to him who knows to do good and does not do it, to him it is S111.

- Take advantage of NOW TODAY(2 Cor. 6:2; Acts 24:25)
 - Salvation (2 Cor. 6:2; Heb. 3:7, 13; 4:7)
 - Duty (Luke 9:62; Rom. 12:11; Col. 3:23)
 - ▶ Growth (2 Pet. 1:5-10)
 - Preparation for the Lord's return (foolish virgins Mat. 25:1-13; The one talent man Mat. 25:14-30)


Don't Procrastinate - Take Advantage of Today – (16,17)


ARE WE CONTENT WITH TODAY?

- PLANNING FOR OUR FUTURE AS A CONGREGATION (if GOD wills)
 - Det into our permanent place for worship as soon as possible.
 - Appoint qualified men as elders (Titus 1:5)
 - Establish training classes and opportunities for our young men and new converts.
 - Reach out to those who have fallen away and make a concerted effort to restore them.
 - Provide training for members to be better equipped for personal evangelism - providing study opportunities for deeper Bible study, (equipping them to answer questions and concerns they may encounter in the fields).
