Instructions to the weak James 5:14-16

kakopatheo (κακοπαθέω, 2553), to suffer physical pain, hardship and distress

astheneo (ἀσθενέω, 770), akin to A, No. I, "to lack strength, to be weak, sick," ...

kamno (κάμνω, 2577) "to work"; then, as the effect of continued labor, "to be weary"

iaomai (ἰάομαι, 2390), "to heal," is rendered "to make whole,"





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Instructions to the weak James 5:14-16

 - Need for FAITH in trials 1:2-6
 - **Blessed is the man that endures** temptation – 1:13
 - Prosecuted by the rich -2:6,7
 - Submission, repentance, humility the Lord will lift us up – 4:7-9
 - **Poor Christians being defrauded 5:4**
 - Need for patience in suffering 5:7-12

¹⁷ Elijah was a man with a nature like ours, and he prayed earnestly that it would not rain; and it did not rain on the land for three years and six months. ¹⁸ And he prayed again, and the heaven gave rain, and the earth produced its fruit.

Elijah was a man with a nature like ours He is an example of persecution, affliction, and fervent prayer - (1 Ki. 17:1; 1 Ki 18:41-45)

A MAN WITH A NATURE LIKE OURS



- Prophesied in a time and place of great wickedness: (Ahab - I Kings 16:32-33; Jezebel –I Kings 18:4; Rev 2:20)
- Elijah ("Jehovah is MY God"), stood uncompromisingly with great faith and preached an unpopular message (I Kings 17:1)





A MAN WITH A NATURE LIKE OURS

• Told to flee, cared for by God (Ravens, widow of Zarephath, miracle of the unending supply of flour - raised widows son) -1 Kings 17:2-24

1 Kings 17:1–4 (NKJV)

¹ And Elijah the Tishbite, of the inhabitants of Gilead, said to Ahab, "As the Lord God of Israel lives, before whom I stand, there shall not be dew nor rain these years, except at my word."² Then the word of the Lord came to him, saying, ³ "Get away from here and turn eastward, and hide by the Brook Cherith, which flows into the Jordan. ⁴ And it will be *that* you shall drink from the brook, and I have commanded the ravens to feed you there."





RETURNS TO FACE AHAB



1 Kings 18:1–2 (NKJV) ¹ And it came to pass *after* many days that the word of the Lord came to Elijah, in the third year, saying, "Go, present yourself to Ahab, and I will send rain on the earth." ² So Elijah went to present himself to Ahab; and there was a severe famine in Samaria.





RETURNS TO FACE AHAB



- Elijah gives instructions to Obadiah (1 Kings 18:7-15)
- Elijah was a wanted man (1 Kings 18:10)
- Elijah confronts Ahab, the real troubler of Israel (1 Kings 18:16-18)
 - Elijah tells Ahab to assemble all Israel together at Mount Carmel (I Kings 18:19)





A GREAT SPIRITUAL VICTORY AT MOUNT CARAMEL




- Elijah's boldness (vs. 21, 27-29)
- Rebukes Israel's indifference (21)
- He stood alone! Elijah vs. 450 prophets of Baal (22)
- Mocks Baal and its prophets (26-29)
- Fire from heaven (30-39)
- Executes the 450 prophets! (vs. 40)





ELIJAH PRAYS FOR RAIN



Elijah's prayer for rain (7 times), is answered (1 Kings 18:41-45; James 5:18)





FLEES FOR HIS LIFE

19:1-2)



• Jezebel puts a bounty on his head! (I Kings

 Elijah flees and becomes so discouraged he prays "It is enough! Now, Lord, take my life, for I *am* no better than my fathers!" (I Kings 19:3-5)

• Elijah is exhausted physically and emotionally. *He feels like a failure! He has been faithful, and zealous, but things are worse now than before.*





EVEN FAITHFUL PEOPLE OF GOD CAN GET DISCOURAGED





THE DAY ELIJAH WANTED TO DIE



- Elijah had forgotten the good 1 Kings 17,18
- Elijah allowed fear to get to him 19:2,3
- Elijah felt sorry for himself ready to quit 19:5
- Elijah thought his faithfulness and zeal would spark a spiritual revolution - 19:10,14
- Underestimated God & the faithful 19:15-18






GOD HELPS ELIJAH (1 KINGS 19:5-18)




- Fed twice by an angel (19:5-8)
- Traveled to Mt Horeb Forty days & nights without food - stayed in a cave (19:8,9)
- After the Lord came to Elijah & ask: "What are you doing here?" God reveals His power in the wind, earthquake, fire and a still small voice - - then ask again . . . (10-13)





GOD HELPS ELIJAH (1 KINGS 19:5-18)



1 KINGS 19:1-18

• Elijah told to get busy (14-18)

Anoint Hazael as king over Syria. (15)
 Anoint Jehu the son of Nimshi king over Israel.

Anoint Elisha as prophet in your place. (16)
Give them their orders (17)

"I have reserved 7,000 in Israel," who have not bowed to Baal, ... (18)





ELIJAH RETURNS TO SERVICE (1 KINGS 21:17-29; 2 KINGS 1:3-2:12)



- Elijah Returns I Ki.21:17-29
 - His Boldness is Back 21:20,21
 - His Message is Stronger 21:21-24
 - Now Ahab is Afraid 21:27
- Elijah trains Elisha faces Ahaziah after Ahab's death - destroys Ahaziah's two groups of 50 with fire - 2 Kings 1:9-18
- Ascends to heaven 2 Ki 2:11,12




THE CURE FOR SPIRITUAL WEAKNESS

- A Part of the Christian's life we CAN overcome! (Jam. 1:2-5; Heb. 12:1-15)
- Discouragement is a tool of Satan to
 - ▶ Weaken our faith,
 - Hinder our service to God
 - Diminish our effectiveness
 - Divide the people of God.

THE CURE FOR SPIRITUAL WEAKNESS

• Remember – GOD IS IN CONTROL, GOD WILL PROVIDE for our needs, and GOD IS AT WORK!

• Take time for physical, emotional, spiritual rest and nourishment - PRAY / MEDITATE / SURROUND YOURSELF WITH THOSE WHO CAN HELP STRENGTHEN YOU (Mark 8:31-32, 46)

• GET BACK TO WORK and focus back on God's purpose for our lives (I Peter 4:7ff)



THE CURE FOR SPIRITUAL WEAKNESS

- Don't exaggerate the negative. Our blessings in Christ are far more valuable and enduring.
- Focus on TRUTH, not feelings Truth endures forever - emotions, good or bad, come and go like the wind.
- Accept accountability for our actions.
- Get HELP and become active again.

Hebrews 12:7–11 (NKJV) ⁷ If you endure chastening, God deals with you as with sons; for what son is there whom a father does not chasten? ⁸ But if you are without chastening, of which all have become partakers, then you are illegitimate and not sons.⁹ Furthermore, we have had human fathers who corrected us, and we paid them respect. Shall we not much more readily be in subjection to the Father of spirits and live? ¹⁰ For they indeed for a few days chastened us as seemed best to them, but He for our profit, that we may be partakers of His holiness. ¹¹ Now no chastening seems to be joyful for the present, but painful; nevertheless, afterward it yields the peaceable fruit of righteousness to those who have been trained by it.
