<sup>3</sup> Blessed *is* he who reads and those who hear the words of this prophecy, and keep those things which are written in it; for the time *is* near. — Revelation 1:3 (NKJV)

### THE BOOK OF REVELATION

Cycle Two: The Trumpet Sequence (8:2-11:19)

"7th SEAL, 7 ANGELS & 7 TRUMPETS" (8:1-6)

After John completed writing the Lord's message to the seven churches, he is shown the throne of heaven through an open door.

### THE BOOK OF REVELATION

Chapters four and five present the sovereignty of God who is on his throne and whose righteous rule is vindicated by the work of Christ.

# THE BOOK OF REVELATION

Though it may some-times appear that the wicked rule, all things are actually controlled by God & He will hold the wicked accountable!

### THE BOOK OF REVELATION

### **Revelation 8:1–6 (NKJV)**

<sup>1</sup> When He opened the seventh seal, there was silence in heaven for about half an hour. <sup>2</sup> And I saw the seven angels who stand before God, and to them were given seven trumpets.<sup>3</sup> Then another angel, having a golden censer, came and stood at the altar. He was given much incense, that he should offer *it* with the prayers of all the saints upon the golden altar which was before the throne. <sup>4</sup> And the smoke of the incense, with the prayers of the saints, ascended before God from the angel's hand. <sup>5</sup> Then the angel took the censer, filled it with fire from the altar, and threw it to the earth. And there were noises, thunderings, lightnings, and an earthquake. <sup>6</sup> So the seven angels who had the seven trumpets prepared themselves to sound.

#### Cycle Two: The Trumpet Sequence (8:2-11:19) "7<sup>th</sup> SEAL, 7 ANGELS & 7 TRUMPETS" (8:1-6)



The **imagery** and **symbols** in Revelation are necessary in comprehending the **BIG PICTURE** - but if we focus too much on the imagery and symbols we can easily MISS the BIG PICTURE.

The BIG PICTURE in chapters 6-8:1 is clearly **GOD WILL TAKE VENGEANCE** upon those who persecute His people.



- A series of three "7's" 7 seals (6:1-8:5); 7 trumpets (8:6-9:21); and 7 bowls of wrath (15:1-16:21).
- These run parallel to each other in a recapitulation pattern with God's judgments being increased in intensity.
- John describes them one after the other by revealing from different viewpoints the judging and restraining action of God.



All three series of sevens are simultaneous, although the trumpets and the bowls of wrath are more limited in time as they deal only with the ''things which must shortly come to pass'' (1:1).

#### Cycle Two: The Trumpet Sequence (8:2-11:19) "7<sup>th</sup> SEAL, 7 ANGELS & 7 TRUMPETS" (8:1-6)

Revelation 8:1 (NKJV) <sup>1</sup> When He opened the seventh seal, there was silence in heaven for about half an hour.

### THE 7th SEAL OPENED (8:1)

- When the 7th seal is opened, a great hush settles over the worshipping hosts of heaven - a "dramatic pause."
- A literary device for deepening the suspense for what is coming next.
  - "The Lord is in his holy temple, let all the earth keep silence before Him" (Hag. 2:20; cf. Zep. 1:7-8; Zech. 2:13).
- A dramatic transition to the next cycle of divine judgments.

#### Cycle Two: The Trumpet Sequence (8:2-11:19) "7th SEAL, 7 ANGELS & 7 TRUMPETS" (8:1-6)

Revelation 8:2 (NKJV) And I saw the seven angels who stand before God, and to them were given seven trumpets.

- In the O.T., 3 passages speak of 7 trumpeters who formed a ceremonial procession - 2 mention the Ark (Josh. 6; 1 Chron. 15:24; Neh. 12:41).
- Trumpets also proclaimed accession of a king (1 Kings. 1:34, 39; 2 Kings. 9:13), the reign of God (Psa. 47:5; 98:6; Num. 23:21; Zech. 9:14; cf. 11:15), alarm of divine judgment, calling for repentance (cf. Jer. 4:5; 6:1, 17 Ezek. 33:3ff.; Isa. 8:1; Joel 2:1, 15).

#### Cycle Two: The Trumpet Sequence (8:2-11:19) "7th SEAL, 7 ANGELS & 7 TRUMPETS" (8:1-6)

Revelation 8:2 (NKJV) And I saw the seven angels who stand before God, and to them were given seven trumpets.

- Trumpets were also sounded at all of the Jewish feasts, on the first day of each month, and at the daily sacrifice "for remembrance before your God" (Num. 10:10).
- The prayers of God's suffering saints have not gone unheard.
- God intends to visit painful judgment on the wicked for the sake of His praying people.

### Cycle Two: The Trumpet Sequence (8:2-11:19) "7th SEAL, 7 ANGELS & 7 TRUMPETS" (8:1-6)

**Revelation 8:3** (NKIV) Then another angel, having a golden censer, came and stood at the altar. He was given much incense, that he should offer *it* with the prayers of all the saints upon the golden altar which was before the throne.

- Twice daily the priests would burn incense on the altar in the temple while the people stood outside praying (Luke 1:8-10).
- This scene preceding the sounding of the first trumpet symbolizes the prayers of the saints ascending like incense unto God (Ps. 141:2; Rev. 5:8).

#### Cycle Two: The Trumpet Sequence (8:2-11:19) "7<sup>th</sup> SEAL, 7 ANGELS & 7 TRUMPETS" (8:1-6)

Revelation 8:4 (NKJV) And the smoke of the incense, with the prayers of the saints, ascended before God from the angel's hand.

- 7 ANGELS & 7 TRUMPETS (8:2-6)
  - The urgent pleas and prayers of the saints have not gone unheard (cf. 6:10).
  - This vision is letting those who prayed so intensely for help in their distress know that God was indeed listening - it would be their prayers that initiate divine judgment.

#### Cycle Two: The Trumpet Sequence (8:2-11:19) "7th SEAL, 7 ANGELS & 7 TRUMPETS" (8:1-6)

Revelation 8:4 (NKJV) And the smoke of the incense, with the prayers of the saints, ascended before God from the angel's hand.

- God continually hears the prayers of his people (Exod. 2:23-24; 1 Pet. 3:12).
- What follows in the remainder of this vision is a portrait of the various aspects of the Lord's vengeance against their enemies.
  - What an assurance for the saints!

### Cycle Two: The Trumpet Sequence (8:2-11:19) "7th SEAL, 7 ANGELS & 7 TRUMPETS" (8:1-6)

5 Then the angel took the censer, filled it with fire from the altar, and threw it to the earth. And there were noises, thunderings, lightnings, and an earthquake.

Revelation 8

- The same censer that offered the incense to God is filled with fire taken from the altar.
- When this fire strikes the earth, it causes peals of thunder, lightnings, and an earthquake, all symbolical of God's response.
  - The fervent petitions by his afflicted people have been heard by God and justice will be carried forth.

#### Cycle Two: The Trumpet Sequence (8:2-11:19) "7th SEAL, 7 ANGELS & 7 TRUMPETS" (8:1-6)

### Revelation 8:6 (NKJV)

<sup>6</sup> So the seven angels who had the seven trumpets prepared themselves to sound.

- The purpose of the Trumpet Judgments are to lead men to repentance (Ezekiel 33), they warn of impending danger.
- When Joel gave his warning to Israel about the coming locust plague, he spoke also of the coming of the day of the Lord: "Blow the trumpet in Zion! Sound the alarm ..." (Joel 2:1).
  - They are directed against a world that is adamant in its hostility toward God.

#### Cycle Two: The Trumpet Sequence (8:2-11:19) "7th SEAL, 7 ANGELS & 7 TRUMPETS" (8:1-6)

### Revelation 8:6 (NKJV)

<sup>6</sup> So the seven angels who had the seven trumpets prepared themselves to sound.

- The first 4 trumpets initiate natural calamities and are reminiscent of the plagues upon Egypt: hail (Exod. 9:23-25); water to blood (Exod. 7:20-21); darkness (Exod. 10:21-23); and locusts (Exod. 10:4-15).
- As the intensity of the judgments increases, so also does the vehemence with which evil men refuse to repent (cf. also 9:20-21; 16:9, 11, 21).

#### Cycle Two: The Trumpet Sequence (8:2-11:19) "7th SEAL, 7 ANGELS & 7 TRUMPETS" (8:1-6)

#### Revelation 8:6 (NKJV) <sup>6</sup> So the seven angels

who had the seven trumpets prepared themselves to sound.

- We may think ourselves self-sufficient,
  but we are constantly reminded by
  storms and natural disasters that we
  are not in control of our world.
- When earthquakes, hurricanes, and tornados disrupt the physical world,
  affected human beings should be sufficiently reminded of their
  limitations and frailties, and turn to
  Almighty God who created and
  sustains the universe.

This world has repeatedly brought suffering to the people of God, but the day will come when God will avenge His saints, and glorify His people.

# THE BOOK OF REVELATION

Mercy is still greater than judgment since a longsuffering God extends every opportunity for men to return to God. (2 Peter 3:9)



### 2 Peter 3:5–13 (NKJV)

<sup>5</sup> For this they willfully forget: that by the word of God the heavens were of old, and the earth standing out of water and in the water, <sup>6</sup> by which the world *that* then existed perished, being flooded with water. 7 But the heavens and the earth which are now preserved by the same word, are reserved for fire until the day of judgment and perdition of ungodly men.<sup>8</sup> But, beloved, do not forget this one thing, that with the Lord one day is as a thousand years, and a thousand years as one day.<sup>9</sup> The Lord is not slack concerning His promise, as some count slackness, but is longsuffering toward us, not willing that any should perish but that all should come to repentance.

### 2 Peter 3:5–13 (NKJV)

<sup>10</sup> But the day of the Lord will come as a thief in the night, in which the heavens will pass away with a great noise, and the elements will melt with fervent heat; both the earth and the works that are in it will be burned up. <sup>11</sup> Therefore, since all these things will be dissolved, what manner of persons ought you to be in holy conduct and godliness, <sup>12</sup> looking for and hastening the coming of the day of God, because of which the heavens will be dissolved, being on fire, and the elements will melt with fervent heat? <sup>13</sup> Nevertheless we, according to His promise, look for new heavens and a new earth in which righteousness dwells.
