The imagery and symbols in Revelation are necessary in comprehending the **BIG** PICTURE - but if we focus too much on the imagery and symbols we can easily MISS the **BIG PICTURE.** The BIG PICTURE in chapters 8:2-11:19 is clearly GOD WILL BRING CALAMITY upon those who persecute His people.

Cycle Two: The Trumpet Sequence (8:2-11:19)

"THE 6TH TRUMPET: WOES UPON MAN CONTINUED" (9:13-21)



- A series of three "7's" 7 seals (6:1-8:5); 7 trumpets (8:6-9:21); and 7 bowls of wrath (15:1-16:21).
- These run parallel to each other in a recapitulation pattern with God's judgments being increased in intensity.
- John describes them one after the other by revealing from different viewpoints the judging and restraining action of God.



All three series of sevens are simultaneous, although the trumpets and the bowls of wrath are more limited in time as they deal only with the ''things which must shortly come to pass'' (1:1).

Revelation 8:4 (NKJV) And the smoke of the incense, with the prayers of the saints, ascended before God from the angel's hand.

- 7 ANGELS & 7 TRUMPETS (8:2-6)
 - The urgent pleas and prayers of the saints have not gone unheard (cf. 6:10).
 - This vision is letting those who prayed so intensely for help in their distress know that God was indeed listening - it would be their prayers that initiate divine judgment.


Revelation 8:4 (NKJV) And the smoke of the incense, with the prayers of the saints, ascended before God from the angel's hand.

7 ANGELS & 7 TRUMPETS (8:2-6)

- The natural calamities symbolized by the first four trumpets have weakened the Empire, but did not bring it down. (8:1-13)
- The fifth and sixth trumpets
 seem to introduce these last two
 factors that contributed to the
 demise of the Roman Empire.

- HOW GOD WILL ULTIMATELY BRING AN END TO ROME'S POWER
 - Crisis of the 3rd Cent. AD (235–284).
 - **Civil wars** at least 26 claimants to the title of emperor.
 - Natural disasters Antonine &
 Cyprian Plagues, (165-180; AD 249 to AD 262); extreme weather events, agricultural instability; famine; volcanos, - economic collapse
 - Barbarian immigrants / and numerous invasions.

Revelation 9:13–21 (NKJV)

¹³ Then the sixth angel sounded: And I heard a voice from the four horns of the golden altar which is before God, ¹⁴ saying to the sixth angel who had the trumpet, "Release the four angels who are bound at the great river Euphrates." ¹⁵ So the four angels, who had been prepared for the hour and day and month and year, were released to kill a third of mankind. ¹⁶ Now the number of the army of the horsemen was two hundred million; I heard the number of them. ¹⁷ And thus I saw the horses in the vision: those who sat on them had breastplates of fiery red, hyacinth blue, and sulfur yellow; and the heads of the horses were like the heads of lions; and out of their mouths came fire, smoke, and brimstone.

Revelation 9:13–14 (NKJV)

¹³ Then the sixth angel sound at the golden altar which is before God, ¹⁴ saying to the sixth angel who had the trumpet, 'Release the four angels who are bound at the great river Euphrates.''

THE 6TH ANGEL SOUNDS (9:13-21) This voice can be construed only as an answer to the prayers offered up as incense (Rev. 5:8; 6:10; 8:3-5).

- By God's authority, the four angels, which are bound at the great river Euphrates, will stir up enemies to fight against the Romans (16:12).
- The figure of a massive army from across that ancient waterway was one that was well understood and in fact very familiar to the apostle's audience.

- In the Old Testament, Israel was threatened by the Assyrians and then the Babylonians from beyond the River Euphrates.
- The external invasions of the Parthians did arise from beyond the region of the Euphrates and did in fact contribute to the fall of the Empire.

THE 6TH ANGEL SOUNDS (9:13-21)

- All of this is said to be laid out in advance, minutely and immutably planned by God (cf. Wisd. 11:20).
- The writer does not mention that this 1/3 of mankind that are killed are those who have not been sealed by God for protection, but that is apparently assumed to be the case (cf. 9:4).

200 million horsemen - symbolic of an army impossible to repulse, even mighty Rome.

- "... Summers calculated they would cover an area one mile wide and eightyfive miles long. The literalist cannot find the space to fit an army this size into the valley of Jezreel for a battle of Armageddon!" (Dan King - I Saw The Heavens Opened")
- "This utterly bewildering number might have been sufficient to keep interpreters from looking for some slavishly literal fulfilment" (Ellicott's Commentary for English Readers)

Cycle Two: The Trumpet Sequence (8:2-11:19)

"THE 6TH TRUMPET: WOES UPON MAN CONTINUED" (9:13-21)

Revelation 9:17 (NKJV 17 And thus I saw the horses in the vision those who sat on them had breastplates of fiery red. hyacinth blue, and sulfur yellow, and the heads of the horses were like the heads of lions; and out of their mouths came fire, smoke, and brimstone.

- Like the locust plague before them, they are demonic forces.
- Their breastplates were the colors of hell (fiery red, smoky blue, and sulfurous yellow).
- A lion portrays strength and power, whereas the three elements they breathe out, fire, smoke, and brimstone (sulfur), illustrate the overwhelming, all-consuming destruction wielded by this power.

"THE 6TH TRUMPET: WOES UPON MAN CONTINUED" (9:13-21)

18 By these three plagues a third of mankind was killed by the fire and the smoke and the brimstone which came out of their mouths.

Revelation 9:18

- Like the first 4 trumpets affecting nature, only 1/3 part of mankind was affected, thus not the final judgment, but a warning for men to repent!
- This was the case with the locusthorses of Joel (2:12-14); The demonic cavalry of Gog (Ezek. 38:18-23); The locust swarm of Amos (7:1, 2).
 - Repentance on the part of wicked men is always the object of God's judgment (cf. Rom. 2:4-5; 2 Pet. 3:15).

Revelation 9:19 (NKJV) ¹⁹ For their power is in their mouth and in their tails; for their tails *are* like serpents, having heads; and with them they do harm.

- Many commentators suggest that this army John sees in this vision
 symbolize Parthian cavalry, Rome's most dreaded military enemy.
 Parthians were celebrated horsemen.
- The "sting" that John says is in the tails of these frightening horses is probably an allusion to the "Parthian shot" (or "parting shot") as it came to be called: a light horse military tactic customarily employed by them.

"THE 6TH TRUMPET: WOES UPON MAN CONTINUED" (9:13-21)

Revelation 9:19 (NKJV) ¹⁹ For their power is in their mouth and in their tails; for their tails *are* like serpents, having heads; and with them they do harm.

- This is symbolical language that dramatize the pageantry of a culture collapsing on itself, — the demise of the foundational institutions of society, i.e, government, family, & commerce.
- Invasions from insects and armies, like organized military forces, represent the heavy toll that sin exacts upon society.
 - This collapse finds its main cause in man's rejection of God. Men bring this killing curse upon themselves.

Revelation 9:20–21 (NKJV)

²⁰ But the rest of mankind, who were not killed by these plagues, did not these plagues, did not epent of the works of their hands, that they should not worship demons, and idols of gold, silver, brass, stone, and wood, which can heither see nor hear nor walk.

- The purpose of God in sending various judgments on mankind is always to elicit repentance from those who suffer these painful indignities (2 Pet. 3:1-9)
- How sad it is when men who see the power of God remain so hardened in spirit that they will not repent.
- This text associates idolatrous practices with the worship of demons (Lev. 17:7; Deut. 32:17; Ps. 106:37; 1 Cor. 10:20).

Cycle Two: The Trumpet Sequence (8:2-11:19)

"THE 6TH TRUMPET: WOES UPON MAN CONTINUED" (9:13-21)

Revelation 9:20–21 And they did not repent of their murders or their sorceries or their sexual immorality or their thefts.

- Sorceries" are commonly linked with the worship of demons — The two go hand in hand.
- John, like Paul, saw the varied practices of pagan worship as springs of moral and spiritual corruption, — we BECOME like what we worship! (cf. Rom. 1:18ff.).
- God's judgment against sinful man is JUST! (Rom. 1:18-2:11)


This world has repeatedly brought suffering to the people of God, but the day will come when God will avenge His saints, and glorify His people.


