Hebrews 7

- A Bible study of Psalm 110:4
- Hebrews is a part of inspired scripture
- The logic of Hebrews is inspired
- The method of interpreting scripture is inspired
- The method of applying scripture is inspired

The Context of Hebrews 7

- The "main point" is in 8:1-6
- Jesus is High Priest in Heaven 8:1
- 1:3 implies it; mentioned in 2:17 and 3:1
- 1:1-4:13 Jesus as Apostle
- 4:14-10:18 Jesus as High Priest
- 10:19-13:25 Jesus as the New and Living
 Way

The Context of Hebrews 7

- 5:6 quotes Psalm 110:4b
 - Jesus as priest
- 1:13 quoted Psalm 110:1 earlier
 Jesus as king
- Jesus is a priest like Melchizedek
- Much to say about Melchizedek 5:9-10
- 5:11-6:20 is a parenthetical admonition for the Hebrews' spiritual immaturity
- 7:1 begins discussion about Melchizedek

Hebrews 7

7:1-3

INTERPRETATION

- 1. Collect all information Psalm 119:160
- 2. Define the terms
- 3. Establish the context
- 4. Summarize all the information
- 5. Note what information that scriptures omit

Listed everything from Gen. 14:18-20

- King of Salem v.1
- Priest of God Most High v.1
- He met Abraham and blessed him v.1
- When Abraham defeated the kings v.1
- He received 10% of the spoils from Abraham v.2,4

Defined Terms

- King of Salem = "king of peace" v.2
- Melchizedek = "king of righteousness"

Respected the context

• v.1: "he met Abraham returning from the defeat of the kings..."

Summarized information that was revealed

- King of Salem
- Priest of God Most High
- He met Abraham and blessed him
- When Abraham defeated the kings
- He received 10% of all Abraham had

Observed what is <u>not</u> revealed

- Without father
- Without mother
- Without genealogy
- Not even beginning of days
- nor end of life

Hebrews 7

7:4-28

APPLICATION

- Implications from what is revealed (Conclusions from inclusions)
- God has a purpose for revealing what He has revealed Deut. 29:29
- 2. Implications from what is not revealed (Conclusions from exclusions)
- God has a purpose for not revealing what He has not revealed 1 Cor. 2:8

APPLICATION STEP 1 Drew conclusions from what is revealed

- Melchizedek was great v.5
- Melchizedek was greater than Abraham
 v.7
- Melchizedek was greater than Levi v.5-10
- The priestly order of Melchizedek is greater than priestly order of Aaron v.11
- Greater priesthood requires a greater covenant v.12

APPLICATION STEP 1

Drew conclusions from what is revealed

- In v.17, Psalm 110:4b is repeated to emphasize "forever" and apply it to the resurrection of Jesus from the dead to live forever as priest and king
- In v.21, Psalm 110:4 is fully quoted to emphasize "sworn" and apply it to the greater word of God (greater promises in the form of an oath) than the fleshly commandment (v.16) for Jesus' greater priesthood (and covenant v.22)

APPLICATION STEP 2

Drew conclusions from what is not revealed

- Omission of genealogy of Melchizedek designed to make him a physical type for Christ the spiritual antitype v.3
- Silence does not authorize! v.11-14 need for a new law that authorized seed of David (tribe of Judah) to be a priest
- No oath for Levite priesthood implies its inferiority to priesthood of Christ v.20-28

- Melchizedek a type of Christ Heb. 7:3
- He was king of Salem (peace)
- Jesus is the Prince of Peace Isaiah 9:6
- Melchizedek was priest of God
- Jesus is king and priest Heb. 8:1
- Melchizedek brought Abraham bread and wine Gen. 14:20
- Christ gave His disciples the Lord's Supper

- Abraham is a type of us Rom. 4:12
- Melchizedek blessed Abraham with his word Gen. 14:19; Heb. 7:7
- Jesus blesses us with His word John 8:31-34
- Abraham gave tithes to Melchizedek Heb.
 7:4,9-10; Gen. 14:20
- How much are we to give?

- Abraham is a type of us Rom. 4:12
- Melchizedek blessed Abraham with his word Gen. 14:19; Heb. 7:7
- Jesus blesses us with His word John 8:31-34
- Abraham gave tithes to Melchizedek Heb.
 7:4,9-10; Gen. 14:20
- How much are we to give? Rom. 15:4; Heb.
 7:8: Where is "there"? Who is "he?"

- Abraham gave of the spoils of war 7:4
- We are to give as prospered 1 Cor. 16:2
- Abraham was not commanded
- We give not by command 2 Cor. 8:8; 9:7
- Abraham gave 10%
- How much are we to give? Rom. 15:4
- Abraham refused the king of Sodom's reward Gen. 14:21-24
- We must refuse Satan's offer of enrichment James 4:4

- 3. Respect the context
- 4. Analyze what is revealed
- 5. Note what is not revealed
- 6. Draw conclusions from what is revealed
- 7. Draw conclusions from what is not revealed
- 8. Live the truth and wisdom in God's word!

- Luke 13:3 you must repent or perish
