## PSALM 73






- First introduced as among the musicians who served in the house of the LORD (I Chron. 6:39)
- A Levite, the son of Berachiah, descendant of Gershon the son of Levi. (I Chron. 6:39-43)
- David made Asaph the chief Levite to minister before the ark of the LORD (I Chron. 16:4-6)
- Is called a "seer" (prophet) (2 Chron. 29:30)

- Asaph learned "perception" is NOT necessarily reality.
- What helped Asaph change his perspective?

## ASAPH's PROBLEM — Ps 73:1-11


### Psalm 73:1–11 (NKJV)

<sup>1</sup> Truly God *is* good to Israel, To such as are pure in heart. <sup>2</sup> But as for me, my feet had almost stumbled; My steps had nearly slipped. <sup>3</sup> For I was envious of the boastful, When I saw the prosperity of the wicked. <sup>4</sup> For there are no pangs in their death, But their strength is firm. <sup>5</sup> They are not in trouble as other men, Nor are they plagued like *other* men. <sup>6</sup> Therefore pride serves as their necklace; Violence covers them *like* a garment. <sup>7</sup> Their eyes bulge with abundance; They have more than heart could wish. <sup>8</sup> They scoff and speak wickedly *concerning* oppression; They speak loftily. <sup>9</sup> They set their mouth against the heavens, And their tongue walks through the earth. <sup>10</sup> Therefore his people return here, And waters of a full *cup* are drained by them. <sup>11</sup> And they say, "How does God know? And is there knowledge in the Most High?"



## ASAPH's PROBLEM — Ps 73:1-11

- He KNEW the truth vs. 1 "Truly God is good to Israel, To such as are pure in heart."— Mat 5:1-13; Psalm 84:10,11
- But yet, he ALMOST LOST his faith vs. 2 "But as for me, my feet had almost stumbled; My steps had nearly slipped"
- What Asaph believed to be true was NOT what he was experiencing — vs. 3-9



## ASAPH's PROBLEM — Ps 73:1-11

- "I was envious of the boastful When I saw ... vs. 3 <sup>3b</sup> the prosperity of the wicked. <sup>4</sup> ... no pangs in their death, But their strength is firm. <sup>5</sup> ... not in trouble ..., not plagued <sup>6</sup> proud & violent <sup>7</sup> eyes bulge with abundance; ... <sup>8</sup> scoff & speak wickedly ... loftily
  - <sup>9</sup> set their mouth against the heavens, ...



## ASAPH's PROBLEM — Ps 73:1-11

Psalm 73:10–11 (NKJV) <sup>10</sup> Therefore his people return here, And waters of a full *cup* are drained by them. <sup>11</sup> And they say, "How does God know? And is there knowledge in the Most High?" "I wa When These peop

Misled men dismissed God's omniscience. The names of God used here ('El = the mighty one; 'Elyon = supreme ruler) underscore the blasphemy of their skepticism. — God doesn't know - God will not judge (11)

### A CHANGE of PERSPECTIVE Can Change The Whole Picture!!

### "I was envious of the boastful When I saw ... vs. 3

These wicked men were popular - the people drank the waters of sinful pleasure they offered (10)




## ASAPH's DILEMMA — Ps 73:12-16

Asaph almost LOST his faith. (vs 2) Asaph wondered what the benefit was in being faithful -Because from all appearances there were no downsides to being evil — and no upside to being righteous (12-14)



## ASAPH's DILEMMA — Ps 73:12-16

Psalm 73:12–14 (NKJV) <sup>12</sup> Behold, these are the ungodly, Who are always at ease; They increase in riches. <sup>13</sup> Surely I have cleansed my heart in vain, And washed my hands in innocence. <sup>14</sup> For all day long I have been plagued, And chastened every morning.



## ASAPH's DILEMMA — Ps 73:12-16

Psalm 73:15–16 (NKJV) <sup>15</sup> If I had said, "I will speak thus," Behold, I would have been untrue to the generation of Your children. <sup>16</sup> When I thought *how* to understand this, It *was* too painful for me Asaph thought - "This is NOT FAIR!!!" But he also knew if he professed his thoughts he could cause others to stumble (vs. 15) This dilemma was beyond Asaph's ability to reconcile with what he knew about God (vs 16)



## ASAPH FINDS THE ANSWER — Ps 73:17-20

<sup>17</sup> "Until I went into the sanctuary of God; Then I understood their end." In order to overcome doubt created by the illusions in the world - we MUST come to see and accept the TRUTH.

<sup>18</sup> Surely You set them in slippery places; You cast them down to destruction.

<sup>9</sup> <sup>19</sup> Oh, how they are brought to desolation, as in a moment! They are utterly consumed with terrors.

<sup>20</sup> As a dream when one awakes, So, Lord, when You awake, You shall despise their image.



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### A CHANGE of PERSPECTIVE Can Change The Whole Picture!!

## "I understood their end."

- Asaph LEARNED the WHOLE truth in the Lord's HOUSE (17a)
- He learns God will JUDGE the wicked in the end (17b-19)
  - God allows the wicked to confidently pursue their evil ways, ending in eternal condemnation (18,19; Rom. 1:18-32; 2:5-11; 2 Thes 1:7-9; Jam 5:3; 2 Pet. 3; etc.)

### A CHANGE of PERSPECTIVE Can Change The Whole Picture!!

## "I understood their end."

Asaph LEARNS the TRUTH about what will ultimately happen to the wicked and all the things they pursue in life (20; [parable of the rich fool - Luke 12:13-21; story of the rich man and Lazarus — Luke

- God will AWAKE and justice will be served upon the wicked!! — Mat 25:46; 2 Thes. 1:9; Rev 14:10



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Galatians 6:7–8 (NKJV) 7 Do not be deceived, God is not mocked; for whatever a man sows, that he will also reap.<sup>8</sup> For he who sows to his flesh will of the flesh reap corruption, but he who sows to the Spirit will of the Spirit reap everlasting life.

## ASAPH's REACTION To The TRUTH — Ps 73:21-24

Psalm 73:21–22 (NKJV) <sup>21</sup> Thus my heart was grieved, And I was vexed in my mind. <sup>22</sup> I *was* so foolish and ignorant; I was *like* a beast before You.

## "Thus my heart was grieved, And I was vexed in my mind." — 21

Asaph suddenly shifts from self-pity & discontentment to humility and godly sorrow! (vs. 22,23)


He confesses his ignorance & admits he had allowed himself to sink to the level of a beast who had no understanding or knowledge of God (vs. 22)



## ASAPH's REACTION To The TRUTH — Ps 73:21-24

#### Psalm 73:23–24 (NKJV) <sup>23</sup> Nevertheless I *am* continually with You; You hold *me* by my right hand. <sup>24</sup> You will guide me with Your counsel, And afterward receive me *to* glory.

- "Nevertheless I am continually with You; You hold me by my right hand" — 23
  - Asaph NEVER turned away from God's guidance but RATHER turned to it for understanding HE then found the truth! (vs. 23,24)
  - The end of the faithful is FAR DIFFERENT from the end of the wicked — "And afterward receive me to glory" (24; Rom 2:7,10; 8:18)




## ASAPH's RENEWED DEVOTION — Ps 73:25-28

25 Whom have I in heaven but You? And there is none upon earth that I desire besides You. <sup>26</sup> My flesh and my heart fail; But God is the strength of my heart and my portion forever. <sup>27</sup> For indeed, those who are far from You shall perish; You have destroyed all those who desert You for harlotry. <sup>28</sup> But *it is* good for me to draw near to God; I have put my trust in the Lord God, That I may declare all Your works.

  - NOTHING perceived with our natural senses can be kept forever!





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## PERCEPTION


vs. 1 — TRULY God is GOOD to Israel, those pure of heart


