

A Fellowship of Believers




ffllowstip in the gospel the local church is important



Local churches were established throughout the Roman Empire (cf. Acts 2:42ff; 13-20; Col. 1:5,23).

Christians banded together for the purpose of corporate worship and fellowship in serving JESUS (Acts 2:42-47; 11:19ff; 1 Cor. 11:17-34; etc.).

This was not some optional plan or un-meaningful happenstance; it was a divinely orchestrated pattern of organizing local churches for God's work (cf. Acts 14:23; Eph 4:11-16; Titus 1:5).

In the early chapters of Acts, following the establishment of the church we have numerous references acknowledging the "togetherness" of the early saints (2:42,44,46; 4:23-24,31-32; 9:26–31; etc.; cf. Heb. 10:24,25).

God never intended for a Christian to function as an isolated "island" in a sea of worldly-oriented people. (Heb 10:24,25)








One of the negative effects of our "individualistic" society has been the development of a negative attitude in the minds of many professed Christians towards any form of organized religion.

The world engenders distrust, evil suspicions, negativity, strife & division, (James 3:13-17).


LOVE produces the opposite (1 Cor. 13:1-8)

The state or condition of our "fellowship" with Christ will govern and determine how we treat, associate with & serve one another (Rom 12:9-16; Gal 5:22,23)



WHAT ROLE DOES KNOWLEDGE & DISCERNMENT PLAY IN FELLOWSHIP?



Philippians 1:27–28 (NKJV) ²⁷ Only let your conduct be worthy of the gospel of Christ, so that whether I come and see you or am absent, I may hear of your affairs, that you stand fast in one spirit, with one mind striving together for the faith of the gospel, ²⁸ and not in any way terrified by your adversaries, which is to them a proof of perdition, but to you of salvation, and that from God.




OWSHDIN THE GOSPEL


CONTINUE in fellowship with the Lord and one another (1 John 1:3-9)

Romans 12:9–19 (NKJV)

⁹ Let love be without hypocrisy. Abhor what is evil.
