Premillennialism, and its theological

- sister, dispensationalism, argue that
 - in connection with the second
 - coming of Christ, God intends to
 - reestablish a Jewish kingdom in
 - Palestine. The doctrine contends
 - that there is yet a purpose to be
 - served by physical Israel.



"Contrary to replacement theology, dispensationalism teaches that, after the rapture (<u>1 Thessalonians 4:13–18</u>), Got Questions God will restore Israel as the primary focus of His plan. The first event at this time is the tribulation (Revelation chapters 6–19). The world will be judged for rejecting Christ, while Israel is prepared through the trials of the great tribulation for the second coming of the Messiah. Then, when Christ does return to the earth at the end of the tribulation, Israel will be ready to receive Him. The remnant of Israel who survive the tribulation will be saved, and the Lord will establish His kingdom on this earth with Jerusalem as its capital. With Christ reigning as King, Israel will be the leading nation, and representatives from all nations will come to Jerusalem to honor and worship the King -Jesus Christ. The church will return with Christ and will reign with Him for a literal thousand years (<u>Revelation 20:1–5</u>)."





Supersessionism, also called replacement theology or fulfillment theology,^[1] is a Christian theological doctrine which describes the theological conviction that the Christian Church has superseded the nation of Israel assuming their role as God's covenanted people,^[2] thus asserting that the New Covenant through Jesus Christ has superseded or replaced the Mosaic covenant exclusive to Jews. Supersessionist theology also holds that the universal Christian Church has replaced ancient Israel as God's true Israel and that Christians (including gentiles) have replaced the biological bloodline of ancient Israelites as the people of God. For most of Christian history, supersessionism has been the mainstream interpretation of the New Testament of all three major historical traditions within Christianity – Orthodox, Roman Catholic and Protestant.^[19]

It was declared that through Abraham a seed would come by whom all peoples of the earth would be blessed (cf. Gen. 12:1-3; 22:17-18).

All of this, of course, was in view of the coming Messiah (cf. Gal. 3:24-25; Heb. 9:1-10).

- God promised Abraham that he would give the land of Canaan to his descendants (Gen. 13:15; 15:18)
- 430 years after God made this promise to Abraham, his descendants were given a special law and ritualistic system of worship which were designed to separate them from the other nations of the world (Ex. 19:5-6; cf. Eph. 2:14).



Psalm 105:5–12 (NKJV) ⁵ Remember His marvelous works which He has done, His wonders, and the judgments of His mouth, ⁶ O seed of Abraham His servant, You children of Jacob, His chosen ones! 7 He is the Lord our God; His judgments are in all the earth.⁸ He remembers His covenant forever, The word which He commanded, for a thousand generations, ⁹ The covenant which He made with Abraham, And His oath to Isaac, ¹⁰ And confirmed it to Jacob for a statute, To Israel as an everlasting covenant, ¹¹ Saying, "To you I will give the land of Canaan As the allotment of your inheritance," ¹² When they were few in number, Indeed very few, and strangers in it.



The axe lieth at the root (Mt. 3:10)

of Israel (cf. Jn. 8:39).

- Like modern millennialists, there were Jews of old who felt that there was intrinsic virtue in being a physical descendant of Abraham and of the nation
- John the Baptizer informed them, however, that God was able to use stones in raising up seed to the patriarch. He then warned: "And even now the axe lieth at the root of the trees" (Mt. 3:10).



The axe lieth at the root (Mt. 3:10)

The "wrath to come" (Mt. 3:7), would find its application in the destruction of the Jewish nation by the Romans in A.D. 70.

When a tree is cut down, there is hope that it will sprout again, provided its stump or roots remain (cf. Job 14:7, 8; Isa. 11:1). But when the axe is laid at the root, where is the hope of restoration? There simply is none!







The cursed fig tree (Mt. 21:19)

- Christ once pronounced a curse upon a barren fig tree near (Mt. 21:19). The tree served as an apt illustration of fruitless national Israel.

The root is holy - (16) –The root refers to Abraham and the fathers OF FAITH! Therefore the branches, (decedents) are also holy – that is consecrated to God for His use -(Genesis 17:7; Jer. 2:21)






Some branches of the original olive tree were broken off - (17-21) – Broken off because of unbelief - (vs. 20; Jer. 11:16; John 15:6; Acts 13:46)



Wild branches grafted in to the original olive tree - (17-22) –by faith – to partake of the blessings of the root – the promise God gave to Abraham – could be cut off - (Genesis 17:7; Eph. 2:11-13)




Jews can be grafted in again if they turn to God in faith - (23-24) – Easier to graft in the natural branches than the unnatural - (cf. Rom 3:1-3; Zec. 12:10; 2 Cor. 3:16)





SO ALL ISRAEL = "In this manner, i.e., through the gospel (1:16) - = Those who believe (Rom. I:16; Acts 15:11)
