15 If ye love me, keep my commandments. 16 And I will pray the Father, and he shall give you another Comforter, that he may abide with you for ever; 17 Even the Spirit of truth; whom the world cannot receive, because it seeth him not, neither knoweth him: but ye know him; for he dwelleth with you, and shall be in you. 18 | will not leave you comfortless: will come to you. (KJV)

Another Encourager in John 14

15 If you love Me, you will keep My commandments. 16 And I will ask the Father, and He shall give you another encourager, that He may be with you for ever, 17 the Spirit of the truth, which the world cannot grasp, because it does not see or know Him. You know Him; because with you He is remaining, and in you He will be. 18 I will not send you as orphans: will come to you. (PJV)

Titus 2:11-3:3

11 For the grace of God that brings salvation has appeared to all men, 12 teaching us that, denying ungodliness and worldly lusts, we should live soberly, righteously, and godly in the present age, 13 looking for the blessed hope and glorious appearing of our great God and Savior Jesus Christ, 14 who gave Himself for us, that He might redeem us from every lawless deed and purify for Himself His own special people, zealous for good works.

Titus 2:11-3:3

15 Speak these things, exhort, and rebuke with all authority. Let no one despise you. 3:1 Remind them to be subject to rulers and authorities, to obey, to be ready for every good work, 2 to speak evil of no one, to be peaceable, gentle, showing all humility to all men. 3 For we ourselves were also once foolish, disobedient, deceived, serving various lusts and pleasures, living in malice and envy, hateful and hating one another.

Special situation required a special man

Recognized the grace of God when he saw it

Titus 2:11-3:3

Rejoiced in the grace of God at work

Encouraged them...to continue with the Lord

good man (righteous + merciful)

filled with the Holy Spirit Ephesians 5:18

filled with faith (a prophet in Acts 13:1)

A great many people were added to the Lord

Things were going very well; a great many new Christians to teach! Matt. 28:18-20 Barnabas went to Tarsus to look for Saul He found Saul Matt. 7:7 He brought Saul to Antioch to help him They assembled with the church in Antioch They together taught a great many people The people knew and trusted the selfless attitude and examples of Barnabas & Saul

Acts 11:27-30

27 And in these days prophets came from Jerusalem to Antioch. 28 Then one of them, named Agabus, stood up and showed through the Spirit that there was going to be a great famine throughout all the world, which also happened in the days of Claudius Caesar. 29 Then the disciples, each according to his ability, determined to send relief to the brethren dwelling in Judea. 30 This they also did, and sent it to the elders by the hands of Barnabas and Saul.

The people knew and trusted the selfless attitude and examples of Barnabas & Saul

This is why they were entrusted with the money that they gave to several churches in Judea

They finished their work in Judea and went to (EIS) Jerusalem where Barnabas' cousin Mark (see Colossians 4:14) joined them Acts 12:25

Trusted by apostles; trusted by new saints
