- We can conquer the giants in our lives, such as fear, doubt, addiction, temptation, etc. IF WE JUST BELIEVE IN OURSELVES?


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
- Worldly giants CANNOT defeat God's purposes, word, or people!
- God's will can be accomplished by those who TRUST HIM enough to obey Him!
- Our PERSONAL GIANTS NEED TO DIE (Pride; Selfishness; Sinful desires; Worldly desires; Earthly priorities; etc.) through trusting in God and His provisions in Christ!

#### THE STORY IN CONTEXT



- God tells Saul he would be removed from being king due to his disobedience (1 Sam. 15)
- Samuel anoints David as king over Israel (1 Sam. 16:1-13)
- A troubled Saul calls for a musician to help calm his nerves (1 Sam. 16:14-17)
- David is called and finds favor in Saul's eyes David intermittently serves the king (1 Sam. 16:18-23)

### THE STORY IN CONTEXT



- Philistines encamped between Sochoh and Azekah to battle Israel (1 Sam. 17:1)
- Saul and Israel encamped in valley of Elah (1 Sam. 17:2)
- Goliath challenges Israel and defies Saul's army "I defy the armies of Israel this day; give me a man, that we may fight together." (I Sam. 17:3-10)

- Goliath (about 9'6" tall!),
- Bronze helmet, coat of scale armor weighing 5,000 shekels, i.e., about 125 lbs.
- A bronze javelin, and a long spear with an iron tip weighing over 15-pounds!

#### ISRAEL'S REACTION



- Saul & Israel's reaction (they were dismayed and greatly afraid) (17:11)
- David sent to Israel's camp and hears Goliath's challenge (Goliath ... spoke according to the same words. So David heard them.) (17:17-23)
- "All the men of Israel, when they saw the man, fled from him and were dreadfully afraid ..." (17:11,24)

#### ISRAEL'S REACTION



- David did not compare the enemy to himself or any man but to the living God ("who is this uncircumcised Philistine, that he should defy the armies of the living God?") (17:26; Ps. 18:1-3; 28:7; 46:1; Isa. 12:2; 45:24)
- David faces rebuke from Eliab his brother ("I know your pride and the insolence of your heart, for you have come down to see the battle." 17:28)

#### ISRAEL'S REACTION



- David viewed the cause worth fighting for! ""What have I done now? Is there not a cause?" (spoke the same to others) (17:29,30)
- David tells the king he would fight Goliath (17:31,32; Psalm 27:1-3)
- King Saul tries to discourage David! ("You are not able . . . you are but a youth, . . . [He is] a man of war from his youth.") (17:33)

### DAVID'S CONFIDENCE



- Previous Victories God delivered the lion & a bear into his hands (17:34-37)
- Proven Methods Wasn't a soldier, but a shepherd He used what he had and was familiar with (17:38-41)
- Faith in God David KNEW God's enemies always lose and cannot stand before those who trust and serve God. (17:36,37)

#### DAVID'S CONFIDENCE



### Psalm 18:1–4 (NKJV)

<sup>3</sup> I will call upon the Lord, *who is* worthy to be praised; So shall I be saved from my enemies. <sup>4</sup> The pangs of death surrounded me, And the floods of ungodliness made me afraid.

### DAVID'S CONFIDENCE



Psalm 18:17 (NKJV)

17 He delivered me from my strong enemy, From those who hated me, For they were too strong for me.


### DAVID'S CONFIDENCE



### Psalm 28:7 (NKJV)


<sup>7</sup> The Lord *is* my strength and my shield; My heart trusted in Him, and I am helped; Therefore my heart greatly rejoices, And with my song I will praise Him.

### DAVID'S CONFIDENCE



- Did not waver in the face of intimidation, mockery or insults (41-44, cf Num. 13:28-33; 14:8,9)
- David's God is SO much bigger and stronger than his adversary—it wasn't a fair fight (45-47)

#### DAVID'S CONFIDENCE



#### 1 Samuel 17:45-47 (NKJV)

45 Then David said to the Philistine, "You come to me with a sword, with a spear, and with a javelin. But I come to you in the name of the Lord of hosts, the God of the armies of Israel, whom you have defied. 46 This day the Lord will deliver you into my hand, and I will strike you and take your head from you.

#### DAVID'S CONFIDENCE



#### 1 Samuel 17:45-47 (NKJV)

And this day I will give the carcasses of the camp of the Philistines to the birds of the air and the wild beasts of the earth, that all the earth may know that there is a God in Israel. <sup>47</sup> Then all this assembly shall know that the Lord does not save with sword and spear; for the battle *is* the Lord's, and He will give you into our hands."

### DAVID'S CONFIDENCE



#### David's trust was in God

- ▶ Goliath had a "sword" and "spear" David had the Lord of host (17:45)
- David was going to fight for the God of Israel whom this giant defied (17:45,46)
- David KNEW the Lord defends and makes victorious those who trust in Him (17:47)

#### DAVID'S CONFIDENCE



- David's confidence in the Lord was more than mere words:
  - David ran toward the enemy (17:48)
  - He used the weapon familiar to him, a sling, to bring down his enemy (17:49)
  - ▶ David killed Goliath with Goliath's sword, and all the Philistines fled – Just as David said (17:50,51)

### DAVID'S CONFIDENCE



- God's cause is worth fighting for regardless of the material cost or reward (Titus 1:2; Jude 3)
- David's trust in the Lord could NOT be shaken by doubt, or fear of failure!

### SOME OF OUR EXTERNAL GIANTS



#### Satan & His Evil Forces

- ▶ We CANNOT overcome him alone but he can be resisted and overcome with God's provisions (Eph. 6:10-17; Ja 4:7-10)
- Through God's word, we are made aware of his devices (2 Cor. 2:11)
- Satan CANNOT destroy the faithful (Rom. 8:28-39)
- THERE IS A CAUSE! (1 Pet. 5:8-10)

### SOME OF OUR EXTERNAL GIANTS



#### The world - Persecution

- The immoral defy God and those who follow Him (John 15:20)
- Academia ridicules God and His people they do everything they can to suppress the truth (Rom 1:18,28,32; 2 Thes 2:10)
- Through faith in Christ we can and WILL overcome the world (1 John 4:4)
- ▶ JESUS, and all in him, will be victorious (1 Cor. 15:57; 1 John 5:4; Revelation)




- Error, false teachers, denominationalism
  - There are more erroneous and unbiblical teachings than you can shake a stick at (Matt. 7:13,14; 15:7-9)
  - Denominationalism is the result of false teaching and MUST be opposed and exposed (Rom. 16:17)
  - The cause of truth is worth fighting for (Matt. 13:44-46; Jude 3)



- Naysayers / Pessimists
  - Our Enemies! (2 Cor 12:7)
  - Our family (Job 2:9)
  - Our friends (Mat. 16:22,23)
  - Our Brethren! (2 Cor 11:26; Gal 2:4)
  - Our Leaders! (Num. 13,14; Matt. 26:3–5; 27:1,2,20; Acts 20:29,30; 3 John 9)



- Life (things happen to us)
  - Injustice suffering for righteousness (2 Tim. 3:12; Jam. 1:2)
  - Material loss / Accidents / Tragedies
  - Loss of friends and family: To death /Sickness / Disabilities / To the world / Facing death...
  - There is a cause greater than anything bad we may experience in this world (Mat. 6:19-33; Rom. 8:17-39; 2 Cor. 4:16–18)



- A sin which seems insurmountable? (Heb 12:1-3; 1 Cor. 10:13)
- A command of God that seems undoable (1 John 5:1-4; Phili 4:13)
- Discouragement / worry? (Mat. 6:25-34; Phili 4:4-13)
- WE CAN FACE OUR GIANTS WITH UNWAVERING TRUST IN GOD!



### Ephesians 6:10–18 (NKJV)

<sup>10</sup> Finally, my brethren, be strong in the Lord and in the power of His might. 11 Put on the whole armor of God, that you may be able to stand against the wiles of the devil. 12 For we do not wrestle against flesh and blood, but against principalities, against powers, against the rulers of the darkness of this age, against spiritual hosts of wickedness in the heavenly places. 13 Therefore take up the whole armor of God, that you may be able to withstand in the evil day, and having done all, to stand.

### Ephesians 6:10–18 (NKJV)

14 Stand therefore, having girded your waist with truth, having put on the breastplate of righteousness, 15 and having shod your feet with the preparation of the gospel of peace; 16 above all, taking the shield of faith with which you will be able to quench all the fiery darts of the wicked one. <sup>17</sup> And take the helmet of salvation, and the sword of the Spirit, which is the word of God; <sup>18</sup> praying always with all prayer and supplication in the Spirit, being watchful to this end with all perseverance and supplication for all the saints—
