The Great Isaiah Scroll



- The Great Isaiah Scroll (1QIsaa) is one of the original seven Dead Sea Scrolls discovered in Qumran in 1947.
- The largest and best preserved of all the biblical scrolls,
- Contains all 66 chapters of the Hebrew version.
- Dating from ca. 125 BCE, it is also one of the oldest of the Dead Sea Scrolls, some one thousand years older than the oldest manuscripts of the Hebrew Bible known to us before the scrolls' discovery.



The Servant's Rejection 53:1-3

The Messiah would be rejected

(53:1; Jno. 12:37-38; Rom. 10:16; Jn 1:11; 11:42;

15:24; Mt. 11:20; Lk. 16:31).

The Messiah's appearance unappealing

(53:2; Mark 6:3; (birth, Lk 2:7; home, Lk 2:39; poor,

Lk 9:58; etc.).

Despised / rejected / A Man of sorrows

(53:3; Mt. 26:37,38,67; 27:39-44; Mk. 14:34; Lk.

19:41; Jno. 11:35. Heb. 2:15–18; 4:15; 5:7; Jn 18:40).



- "Surely He has borne our griefs And carried our sorrows" (53:4; Mat 8:17; He. 9:28; 1 Pe. 2:24; 3:18; 1 Jno. 2:2. [Griefs & sorrows, {lit. sickness} = "transgressions" (v. 5,8,12), "iniquities" (vv. 5,6,11), "wicked" (v. 9), and "sin" (v. 12)].
- "Yet we esteemed Him stricken, Smitten by God, and afflicted." (53:4; Lu 23:34; Ac 3:17; 1 Co 2:8) / Falsely accused of sin, thought His suffering deserved (Jn 19:7; Mat 27:41-43).



Isaiah 53:5 (NKJV)

⁵ But He was wounded for our transgressions, He was bruised for our iniquities; The chastisement for our peace was upon Him, And by His stripes we are healed.

- Wounded lit. pierced (Psalm 22:16).
- ▶ Bruised lit. crushed severely oppressed, strongest form of suffering (ls. 3:15; Mt 27:32).
- Chastised Jesus received punishment due a criminal the condemnation judged by the rulers (Acts 3:17,18; 1 Cor 2:8; 2 Cor 3:14).
- Stripes prophetical of His being scourged (Mt 27:26; 1Pe 2:24).

For our transgressions -iniquities / For our peace - healing - (He suffered for our sins, not His).

- **We have all sinned** (Rom 3:9-23; 5:12; 11:23; Gal 3:10,22; 1 Jn 1:8-10).
- Sin is not transferable but committed (Eze. 18:20-32; Rom 5:12-19).
- JESUS was charged with taking our sins away through His suffering for us (Mat 26:28; Heb 5:8,9; Ro. 3:24-26; 5:15, 19; Ep. 1:7; Col.

1:14, 20; He. 9:22, 28; 1 Jno. 2:2; Rev. 7:14).



The Servant's Submission 53:7,8

Isaiah 53:7 (NKJV)

⁷ He was oppressed and He was afflicted, Yet He opened not His mouth; He was led as a lamb to the slaughter, And as a sheep before its shearers is silent, So He opened not His mouth.

The Servant's Submission 53:7,8

Isaiah 53:8 (NKJV)

⁸ He was taken from prison and from judgment, And who will declare His generation? For He was cut off from the land of the living; For the transgressions of My people He was stricken.

Acts 8:33; Psalm 22:12-21; Matthew 26:65, 66; 27:11-31, 35-50; John 19:7;

Isaiah 53:9 (NKJV)

⁹ And they made His grave with the wicked—But with the rich at His death, Because He had done no violence, Nor was any deceit in His mouth.

The Servant's Vindication 53:9-11

- Crucified between two thieves / murderers (Mat 27:38,39; Mar. 15:27, 28; Lu. 22:37; 23:32, 33, 39–43; Jno. 19:18, 31–35).
- The soldiers apparently intended to bury Him with the wicked like the two criminals (Jn 19:31).
- However, He was buried with the rich, in the grave of a rich man named Joseph (Matt. 27:57–60).



Isaiah 53:10 (NKJV)

¹⁰ Yet it pleased the Lord to bruise Him; He has put Him to grief. When You make His soul an offering for sin, He shall see His seed, He shall prolong His days, And the pleasure of the Lord shall prosper in His hand.

The Servant's Vindication 53:9-11

- "It pleased the Lord to bruise Him" (John 3:16; Acts 2:23,24; Rom. 8:32; 1 Jno. 4:9,10).
- God "will make His soul" a sacrificial offering for sin (1

Jno. 1:29; Acts 2:24; Eph. 5:2;

Heb. 7:27; 9:14,25,26; 10:6-12)

Isaiah 53:10 (NKJV)

10 Yet it pleased the Lord to bruise Him; He has put Him to grief. When You make His soul an offering for sin, He shall see His seed, He shall prolong His days, And the pleasure of the Lord shall prosper in His hand.

The Servant's Vindication 53:9-11

- "He shall see His seed": His Resurrection from the dead & offspring (Acts 2:24–28; Ro. 6:9; Rev. 1:18; Heb. 2:13; Jno. 6:37–40; Eph. 1:5)
- "He shall prolong *His* days, And the pleasure of the Lord shall prosper in His hand." (He. 7:21-28; Acts 2:36; 2 Thes 1:11; Col. 1:19-20)



The Servant's Vindication 53:9-11

Isaiah 53:11 (NKJV)

He shall see the labor of His soul, *and* be satisfied. By His knowledge My righteous Servant shall justify many, For He shall bear their iniquities.

John 12:24, 27-32; Revelation 5:9; Leviticus 16:15; Romans 3:24-30; 1:16,17; 1 John 2:1,2




The Servant's Vindication 53:9-11

Isaiah 53:12 (NKJV)

12 Therefore I will divide Him a portion with the great, And He shall divide the spoil with the strong, Because He poured out His soul unto death, And He was numbered with the transgressors, And He bore the sin of many, And made intercession for the transgressors.

(Luke 22:36-37; Isaiah 52:13-15; Mar. 15:28; Lu. 22:37; 23:25, 32, 33; Ro. 8:34; 1 Tim. 2:5, 6; He. 7:25; 9:24; 1 Jno. 2:1, 12.)



The Servant's Vindication 53:9-11

Philippians 2:9–11 (NKJV)

⁹ Therefore God also has highly exalted Him and given Him the name which is above every name, ¹⁰ that at the name of Jesus every knee should bow, of those in heaven, and of those on earth, and of those under the earth, 11 and that every tongue should confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father.



WHAT CAN BE SEN IN THE SUFFERING OF JESUS?

- God's love for man (John 3:16; Rom 5:6-10)
- God's hatred of sin (Psalm 45:7)
- The HIGH cost of our redemption (1 Peter 1:18,19)
- Necessity of obedience (Heb. 5:7-9)
- Motivation to live for the Lord Who died for us (2 Cor. 5:14-15)



WHAT CAN BE SEN IN THE SUFFERING OF JESUS?

- Our path to glory is ONLY through the suffering Servant Jesus Christ (John 8:24; 14:6; Acts 4:12; Gal 3:26,27).
- We have all sinned and need salvation (Rom 3:23; 2 Thes 1:7-9)
- Many reject Jesus today for the same reasons the Jews did (Isaiah 53:1)





- Hear the word of GOD (Rom. 10:14-17)
- Believe that Jesus is the Son of God (John 8:24)
- Confess that Jesus is the Son of God (Acts 8:37)
- Repent of your sins, turning to the name of Jesus (Acts 17:30)
- Be Baptized in the name of Jesus Christ for forgiveness of sins (Acts 2:38; 8:38; Rom 6:3-6; Col 2:12)
- Live Faithfully (1 Cor 10:1-13; 15:58)
