### The Context - MARK 11:1-26



The fig tree is an analogy, a metaphor, an illustration of the spiritual condition of Israel & the soon destruction of the Jewish leadership, Jerusalem & temple.

<sup>11</sup> And Jesus went into Jerusalem and into the temple. So when He had looked around at all things, as the hour was already late, He went out to Bethany with the twelve. 12 Now the next day, when they had come out from Bethany, He was hungry.

<sup>13</sup> And seeing from afar a fig tree having leaves, He went to see if perhaps He would find something on it. When He came to it, He found nothing but leaves, for it was not the season for figs. 14 In response Jesus said to it, "Let no one eat fruit from you ever again." And His disciples heard it.

<sup>15</sup> So they came to Jerusalem. Then Jesus went into the temple and began to drive out those who bought and sold in the temple, and overturned the tables of the money changers and the seats of those who sold doves. 16 And He would not allow anyone to carry wares through the temple.

17 Then He taught, saying to them, "Is it not written, 'My house shall be called a house of prayer for all nations'? But you have made it a 'den of thieves.' " 18 And the scribes and chief priests heard it and sought how they might destroy Him; for they feared Him, because all the people were astonished at His teaching.

19 When evening had come, He went out of the city. 20 Now in the morning, as they passed by, they saw the fig tree dried up from the roots. 21 And Peter, remembering, said to Him, "Rabbi, look! The fig tree which You cursed has withered away."

<sup>22</sup> So Jesus answered and said to them, "Have faith in God. <sup>23</sup> For assuredly, I say to you, whoever says to this mountain, 'Be removed and be cast into the sea,' and does not doubt in his heart, but believes that those things he says will be done, he will have whatever he says. <sup>24</sup> Therefore I say to you, whatever things you ask when you pray, believe that you receive them, and you will have them.



<sup>25</sup> "And whenever you stand praying, if you have anything against anyone, forgive him, that your Father in heaven may also forgive you your trespasses. 26 But if you do not forgive, neither will your Father in heaven forgive your trespasses."





## What Jesus Sought & Seeks




Jesus sought fruit from the fig tree -


(He had the right to expect some for it displayed leaves)




- Jesus was hungry as if he had had no food on the night before (12)...
- Having leaves this precocious tree had put out leaves as a sign of fruit.
- It was not the season of figs The early figs in Palestine are not gathered before May or June, the later crop in August.



- The fruit is formed in its immature state before the leaves are seen, (*March*). The leaves announced the advance of the tree to the state of having edible fruit, (*April*).
- The words, 'for it was not the season for figs' could actually be another reason why Jesus should have expected fruit, the fruit would not have yet been gathered. (May, June)



- We should be growing spiritually 2 Pet 1:5-10


# What Jesus Sought & Seeks



#### ROMANS 12:1-2 (NKJV)



## What Jesus Found & Finds



- The tree had the appearance of fruit but had none, it made a false profession.
- In Israel (15-18; 12; cf. Mat 21-24) blind guides (Mat 23:24) hypocrites (Mat 23:27,28) caused others to blaspheme (Rom 2:17-24)
- The fig tree is a graphic illustration of the pretense of the Jewish nation & its worship Mat 15:7-9



   13:23; Gal 5:22,23; etc.



## What Does Jesus Find In His People Today?


- Unauthorized practices? Men's innovations 1 Chron
   13,15; Col 3:17; 2 Jn 9
- Just going through the motions? –Insincere? Lack love? Rev 2:1-4
- Hypocritical? Gal 2:11-14
- Apathetic? Rev 3:14-22
- Not growing, i.e. NOT bearing fruit? John 15:1-10



- With Me & Us?


## What Jesus Did & Will Do

<sup>3</sup> I tell you, no; but unless you repent you will all likewise perish. 4 Or those eighteen on whom the tower in Siloam fell and killed them, do you think that they were worse sinners than all other men who dwelt in Jerusalem? <sup>5</sup> I tell you, no; but unless you repent you will all likewise perish."

## Luke 13:1-9 (NKJV)\

<sup>6</sup> He also spoke this parable: "A certain man had a fig tree planted in his vineyard, and he came seeking fruit on it and found none. 7 Then he said to the keeper of his vineyard, 'Look, for three years I have come seeking fruit on this fig tree and find none. Cut it down; why does it use up the ground?'

#### Luke 13:1-9 (NKJV)\

<sup>8</sup> But he answered and said to him, 'Sir, let it alone this year also, until I dig around it and fertilize *it*. <sup>9</sup> And if it bears fruit, *well*. But if not, after that you can cut it down.'"
