THIS IS A DAY OF Good News Context

ISRAEL & SYRIA AT WAR - (2 KINGS 6,7)



- Syria's familiarity with Elisha -(6:12; cf. 2 Kings 5)
- Ben-Hadad sends large army to capture Elisha (6:13-17)
- Elisha leads blinded Syrian soldiers into Samaria where they are captured - (6:18-20)
- Elisha demands mercy from Joram, king of Israel - (6:21-23)

THIS IS A DAY OF Good News Context

ISRAEL & SYRIA AT WAR - (2 KINGS 6,7)



- Some time after the events in 6:1-23

 Ben-Hadad mobilizes his entire army
 and besieges Samaria (6:24,25)
- The severity of the conditions in the city of Samaria (6:25-33)
 - * The value of a donkeys head (21bs of silver) & 1/2 pint of Dove dung (2 ounces of silver) (6:25)
 - * Cannibalism (6:26-30)
 - * Joram wearing sackcloth wants Elisha dead gives up on God (6:30-33)

ELISHA'S PROPHECY REJECTED - (2 KINGS 7:1,2)



"Hear the word of the Lord.

Thus says the Lord:
'Tomorrow about this time a seah of fine flour shall be sold for a shekel, and two seahs of barley for a shekel, at the gate of Samaria.'"

- Elisha announced that in about 24 hours, not only would the siege be over, but there would be plenty of food to eat at pre-siege prices.
- The personal attendant of the king did not believe this prophecy 7:2
- Elisha replied that the officer would see the miracle with his own eyes but because of his unbelief he would not experience the blessing (cf. 7:17).

2 KINGS 7:3-10 (NKJV)

³ Now there were four leprous men at the entrance of the gate; and they said to one another, "Why are we sitting here until we die? 4 If we say, 'We will enter the city, the famine is in the city, and we shall die there. And if we sit here, we die also. Now therefore, come, let us surrender to the army of the Syrians. If they keep us alive, we shall live; and if they kill us, we shall only die."

2 KINGS 7:3-10 (NKJV)

⁵ And they rose at twilight to go to the camp of the Syrians; and when they had come to the outskirts of the Syrian camp, to their surprise no one was there. 6 For the Lord had caused the army of the Syrians to hear the noise of chariots and the noise of horses—the noise of a great army; so they said to one another, "Look, the king of Israel has hired against us the kings of the Hittites and the kings of the Egyptians to attack us!"

2 KINGS 7:3-10 (NKJV)

⁷ Therefore they arose and fled at twilight, and left the camp intact—their tents, their horses, and their donkeys—and they fled for their lives. 8 And when these lepers came to the outskirts of the camp, they went into one tent and ate and drank, and carried from it silver and gold and clothing, and went and hid them; then they came back and entered another tent, and carried some from there also, and went and hid it.

2 KINGS 7:3-10 (NKJV)

⁹ Then they said to one another, "We are not doing right. This day is a day of good news, and we remain silent. If we wait until morning light, some punishment will come upon us. Now therefore, come, let us go and tell the king's household." 10 So they went and called to the gatekeepers of the city, and told them, saying, "We went to the Syrian camp, and surprisingly no one was there, not a human sound only horses and donkeys tied, and the tents intact."

THE FOUR LEPERS – (2 KINGS 7:3-10)



- Lepers were customarily confined to quarters outside the camp (Leviticus 13:46; Num 5:2-4).
- * "At the entrance of the gate" probably out of desperation seeking food -
 - "Why are we sitting here until we die?" There was NO HOPE in remaining where they were.
- Sinners acknowledging their situation deciding to act ...

THE FOUR LEPERS – (2 KINGS 7:3-10)



- Recognizing their hopeless situation, they weigh their 3 options (7:4)
 - * "If we say, We will enter the city,"
 the famine is in the city, and we shall
 die there" -
 - * "... if we sit here, we die also"
 - "... let us surrender to the army of the Syrians. If they keep us alive, we shall live; and if they kill us, we shall only die."

THE FOUR LEPERS – (2 KINGS 7:3-10)



At dusk the four enter the Syrian camp and find it deserted. (7:5)

- * The same God who caused one Syrian army to see things that were not there (2 Kings 6:18) now causes another Syrian army to hear what they assumed to be the armies of the Hittites & Egyptians hired by Israel. -(7:6; cf Pro 28:1).
- * The Syrian soldiers flee, leaving all their provisions [tents, horses, donkeys fled for their lives].(7:7

THE FOUR LEPERS – (2 KINGS 7:3-10)




At first the lepers filled their own stomachs, pockets & even hid some of the treasure so they could retrieve it later - 7:8

They could have easily convinced themselves this was "pay-back time" ... But even having leprosy - these men were not bitter or resentful ...

"We are not doing right. This day is a day of good news, and we remain silent." - (7:9; Luke 15:17).

THE FOUR LEPERS – (2 KINGS 7:3-10)



* We are not doing right

- * "This day is a day of good news, and we remain silent." (7:9; Jam 4:17)
- * If we wait until morning light, some punishment will come upon us. (7:9; Num 32:23; Ezk 3:17-21)
- * Now therefore, come, let us go and tell the king's household."


THE CAUTIOUS INVESTIGATION (7:10-15)



They Tell Others The 'Good News'

- * The lepers return to Samaria and tell the gatekeepers (7:10,11)
- * The Israelite king thought the whole thing was a trap (7:11,12)
- * The king approves a "fact finding mission" which verifies the Syrian army had crossed the Jordan (7:13-15)


GOD'S WORD PROVEN TRUE - (7:16-20)



Both of Elisha's prophecies come to pass

- Two measures of barley sold for a shekel and a measure of fine flour sold for a shekel (7:1,16,18)
- * The officer who had doubted the truthfulness of Elisha's prophecy was trampled to death as he attempted to control the crowd that poured out of the city (7:17, 19,20)

SOME LESSONS



Our Enemies & Famine

- The people of God have many enemies BUT as the people of God we have God Our enemies will always be outnumbered! (2 Kings 6:16; 7:1; Rom 8:31)
- There is a famine for the word, Amos 8:11; of righteousness, Rom 3:10-23; etc. - But God has provided abundantly for our needs in Christ - Eph 1:3; 2 Pet 1:3; etc

SOME LESSONS



The Need To Recognize
Our Situation & Search
For A Remedy -

- Physical deformities are easier to recognize than spiritual deformities but spiritual deformities are more serious (Mat 6:25-34; 16:26; 2 Cor 13:5)
- * God has provided a remedy for sin the enemy's defeated there's hope in Christ (Jn 3:16; Mt 7:7-14)

SOME LESSONS



Those of us who have found salvation in Christ have a responsibility -

- Are we doing right if we do not share the good news of salvation?
 (Acts 8:4; 1 Thes 1:8)
- Today is the day of salvation, (2 Cor 6:2), for both those needing to hear the gospel & those needing to share it we should act with haste!

SOME LESSONS



Those of us who have found salvation in Christ have a responsibility -

God can use anyone to spread His message - the biggest qualities needed are "LOVE for God & truth" & "FAITH" in God & His word" - Acts 8:4; 1 Cor 1:19,27,28; Rom 1:16

Every Christian should be able to tell someone how to become a Christian - Act 19:1-5

SOME LESSONS



Why Many May Remain Silent?

- For some, it may be they are starving themselves Hos 4:6; 1 Pet 2:2; 2 Pet 1:5-10;
- * For others, it may be out of fear or discouragement Rev 21:8; Acts 4:29,31; Gal 6:9; Heb 12:1-3
- * For many others, it may just be the idea that it is too complicated or I am inadequate Acts 8; 16; 1 Pt 3:15


