

### WALKING BY FAITH




- ◆ Only Two Possible Sources For All We Believe, Teach &




### Worship of A Local Church



- ◆ It is important "HOW" we worship!
- ◆ There are MANY different ways to engage in "FALSE" worship!
- ◆ The "PURPOSE" of worship is to honor & glorify God The ONLY way to honor & glorify God in our worship is to worship AS HE SAYS!

#### THE N.T. PATTERN FOR THE

### Worship of A Local Church



- ◆ God has always ONLY accepted worship from those who offered it from their heart (in spirit) and in accordance with His Law (& truth).
- ◆ Ordinances of the OT were until "the time of reformation" (He 9:9-10), i.e., the NT.
- ♦ NT worship is more in keeping with the nature of God & relates more to the spiritual side of man.



◆ There is no New Testament authority for using mechanical instruments of music in worship - Col 3:17






Present-day Christian religious bodies known for conducting their worship services without musical accompaniment include some Presbyterian churches devoted to the regulative principle of worship, Old Regular Baptists, Primitive Baptists, Plymouth Brethren, most congregations among the churches of Christ, the Old German Baptist Brethren, the Eastern Orthodox Christian Church and the Amish. Many Mennonites also conduct some or all of their services without instruments.

## THE "REGULATIVE PRINCIPLE" OF WORSHIP (Deut. 4:2; John 4:24; Rev 22:18,19)



- Everything the New Testament has to say regarding music in worship must be considered.
- ◆ The totality of revelation on the matter is the pattern for our worship. (2 Tim 3:16,17)
- Silence does not authorize.
- ♦ When God specifies a thing then we transgress if we change it. (2 John 1:9)

12 saying: "I will declare Your name to My brethren; In the midst of the assembly I will sing praise to You."




### The New Testament Pattern

FACT: No record of MECHANICAL Instruments being used prior to 666


According to James William McKinnon, there is not one reference to instrumental music in the worship of the church in the "Fathers" from the second century through the beginning of the fifth (about 150 references in all).


### THE INTERESTING TESTIMONY OF HISTORY



#### Justin Martyr (A.D. 139):

"The use of [instrumental] music was not received in the Christian churches, as it was among the Jew, in their infant state, but only the use of plain song. . . . Simply singing is not agreeable to children [the aforementioned Jews], but singing with lifeless instruments and with dancing and clapping is. On this account the use of this kind of instruments and of others agreeable to children is removed from the songs of the churches, and there is left remaining simply singing."


### THE INTERESTING TESTIMONY OF HISTORY



#### Tertullian (c. A.D. 200):

"Musical concerts with viol and lute belong to Apollo, to the Muses, to Minerva and Mercury who invented them; ye who are Christians, hate and abhor these things whose very authors themselves must be the object of loathing and aversion."


### THE INTERESTING TESTINIONY OF HISTORY



#### Eusebius (260-340):

"Of old at the time those of the circumcision were worshiping with symbols and types it was not inappropriate to send up hymns to God with the psalterion and kithara . . . But we in an inward manner keep the part of the Jew, according to the saying of the apostle . . . [Romans 2:28f]. We render our hymns with a living psalterion and a living kithara, with spiritual songs. The unison voices of Christians would be more acceptable to God than any musical instrument" (Comments on Psalm 92:2-3).


### THE INTERESTING TESTINIONY OF HISTORY



#### John Chrysostom (345-407):

"Just as the Jews are commanded to praise God with all musical instruments so we are commanded to praise him with all our members-the eye, the tongue, ear, the hand. These instruments were then allowed because of the weakness of the people, to train them to love and harmony" (Comments on Psalm 150)..

### THE INTERESTING TESTIMONY OF HISTORY



Thomas Aquinas (1225 -1274)
"Our church does not use musical instruments, as harps and psalteries, to praise God withal, that she may not seem to Judaize"

### THE INTERESTING TESTINIONY OF HISTORY



#### John Calvin

"Musical instruments in celebrating the praises of God would be no more suitable than the burning of incense, the lighting of lamps, and the restoration of the other shadows of the law. The Papists therefore, have foolishly borrowed, this, as well as many other things, from the Jews. . . ."

(Commentary on Psalms 33)




#### John Calvin

"... Men who are fond of outward pomp may delight in that noise; but the simplicity which God recommends to us by the apostles is far more pleasing to him. Paul allows us to bless God in the public assembly of the saints, only in a known tongue (I Cor. 14:16) What shall we then say of chanting, which fills the ears with nothing but an empty sound?"






### THE INTERESTING TESTINIONY OF HISTORY



#### **Adam Clarke**

"But were it even evident, . . . that instruments of music were prescribed by divine authority under the law, could this be adduced with any semblance of reason, that they ought to be used in Christian worship? No; the whole spirit, soul, and genius of the Christian religion are against this; and those who know the Church of God best, and what constitutes its genuine spiritual state. . .



#### **Adam Clarke**


### THE INTERESTING TESTINIONY OF HISTORY



#### **Adam Clarke**

"I am an old man, and I here declare that I never knew them to be productive of any good in the worship of God, and have reason to believe that they are productive of much evil. Music as a science I esteem and admire, but instrumental music in the house of God I abominate and abhor. This is the abuse of music, and I here register my protest against all such corruption of the worship of the author of Christianity . . ."

### Charles Spurgeon -

"David appears to have had a peculiarly tender remembrance of the singing of the pilgrims, and assuredly it is the most delightful part of worship and that which comes nearest to the adoration of heaven.

What a degradation to supplant the intelligent song of the whole congregation by the theatrical prettiness of a quartet, bellows, and pipes. We might as well pray by machinery as praise by it...


### THE INTERESTING TESTINIONY OF HISTORY



### Charles Spurgeon -

... 'Praise the Lord with harp.' Israel was at school, and used childish things to help her to learn; but in these days when Jesus gives us spiritual food, one can make melody without strings and pipes... We do not need them. That would hinder rather than help our praise. Sing unto him. This is the sweetest and best music. No instrument is like the human voice." (Commentary on Psalm 42.)




### John L. Dagg

(1799-1884)

was one of the most respected Baptist theologians during the 19th Century. In his Manual of Theology he wrote, "Instrumental music formed a part of the temple worship, but it is nowhere commanded in the New Testament; and it is less adapted to the more spiritual services of the present dispensation."

#### James McKinnon

"The antagonism which the Fathers of the early church displayed toward instruments has two outstanding characteristics: vehemence and uniformity."






- Singing without mechanical accompaniment is right to which everyone will agree!
  - Singing without an instrument can be done by faith - 2 Cor 5:7; Rom 10:17; Jude 3

#### THE "REGULATIVE PRINCIPLE" OF WORSHIP (Deut. 4:2; John 4:24; Rev 22:18,19)



- → History confirms that Mechanical instruments were NOT used in the NT church - and condemned when introduced.
- ♦ If the N.T. authorizes MIM, then we can use it in worship - if it does not - we can't.

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### ROMANS 15:7-13 (NKJV)
