






THE COMPREHENSIVE NATURE OF THE NT SCRIPTURES




- ORGANIZATION OF A LOCAL CHURCH


- ◆Self-Edification, i.e. to build up and strengthen itself (Acts 20:28, 32; Col 2:6, 7).
- **► Evangelism** Preach the gospel to the lost (Mat 28:18-20).
- ◆ Benevolence Providing the needs of destitute Christians (Acts 6:1-4)

THE N.T. PATTERN FOR THE



- ◆ We ARE NOT free to involve the church in whatever work we deem suitable!
- ◆There is a distinction to be made between the church "universal" and the church "local."
- ◆The work of the local church can be gleaned in some respects from what is revealed about it's organization and worship.

THE N.T. PATTERN FOR THE



- ◆The Lord equipped local churches to do the work that He has given them - Eph 4:11-16
- ◆ If more organization is needed to carry out a work than is found in the NT – then it should be obvious that such a work is NOT a work of the church – (whether establishing other institutions or reorganizing the local church)

Benevolence - Definitions



- ◆ Benevolence The provision of assistance, help or aide such as food, clothing, shelter & medical care for the relief of material needs for others.
- ◆ The English term "benevolence" Appears only once in the KJV 1 Cor 7:3 The Greek word rendered benevolence in the KJV in 1 Cor 7:3 appears only one other time in Eph. 6:7 "good will"

WHAT WE FIND IN THE NEW TESTAMENT

ACT OF FELLOWSHIP

- 2 Corinthians 8:4 (NKJV)
- 4 imploring us with much urgency that we would receive the gift and the fellowship of the ministering to the saints.

- ♦ A local church caring for those of its own number - (Acts 2:44-46; 4:32-37).
- ◆ A local church Caring for its own widows– (Acts 6:1-8; 1 Tim 5:3-16).
- ◆ The church in Antioch sent to the brethren in Judea (Acts 11:27-30).
- ★ The churches in Macedonia, Achaia, and Galatia sent to the church at Jerusalem (1 Cor. 16:1-3; 2 Cor 8:1-5; 9:1,2).

Acts 4:32-37

- Money was laid at the apostles feet – thus a common treasury.
- Distribution was made according to the need among the believers.
- None of them lacked so the effort was successful under the organization provided.

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
Acts 6:1-8; I Tim. 5:3-16

- ◆ There was a daily ministration but some were being neglected.
- ◆ The church was instructed to "seek out seven men to be appointed over this business;"
- ★ Those taken into the number [to be cared for by the church] had to meet certain conditions.

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
Acts II:27-30

- ◆ Each gave according to their ability
- ◆ For the purpose of relieving BRETHREN in Judea – (Jerusalem – Bethany – Joppa – Lydda – Emmaus)
- This THEY did, sending it by Paul and Barnabas,
- ◆ To the elders (of each local church)– (Acts 14:23; 1 Peter 5:2)

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
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I Cor. 16:1-3; 2 Cor. 8:1-5; 9:1,2

- The Jerusalem church had members in need of temporal things, which she was unable to supply.
- ◆ Paul commanded these churches to send to Jerusalem that there be equality – (i.e. they all be relieved of being without necessities).
- ◆ The sending churches sent their gifts to the needy church. [12 to 14 years after Acts 11:27-30]





James I:27 (NKJV)

27 Pure and undefiled religion before God and the Father is this: to visit orphans and widows in their trouble, and to keep oneself unspotted from the world.


- → [23] For if <u>anyone</u> is a hearer
- ♦ [24] for he observes himself,
- ♦ [25] But <u>he</u> who looks . . . this <u>one</u> will be blessed in what <u>he</u> does.
- → [27] . . . to keep <u>oneself</u> unspotted from the world.

WHAT ABOUT JAMES 1:27 - (CONGREGATIONAL OR INDIVIDUAL?)



(James 1:27 assigns Christians the obligation of caring for "orphans and widows in their trouble." Brethren often want to shift their responsibilities. Some take the care of these helpless ones away from the individual and burden the church with them. And then the church sends a pittance off to a distant institution where they are shipped. Brethren congratulate themselves on their benevolence, castigate those who personally care for widows and orphans as "anti-orphan," and the helpless widows and orphans languish in institutionalized care.) 2 Corinthians 9:13 (NKJV)

- ◆ [8:14] . . . Supply for their lack may be equality

- [9:12] For the administration of this service not only supplies the needs of the saints, but also is abounding through many thanksgivings to God,




