

THEME



John 20:30-31 (NKJV)

³⁰ And truly Jesus did many other signs in the presence of His disciples, which are not written in this book; ³¹ but these are written that you may believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and that believing you may have life in His name.

- The true Vine 15:1-11
- Promise of the Holy Spirit 14:26; 15:26
- Jesus told these things so when they happen they will believe 16:1-4
 - The Holy Spirit would supply their every need 16:8-15
- No one could take their joy 16:16-33



- Relation to previouschapters 13:1-3,27,31;17:1,2,4,11,12,15
- Divided naturally into three parts -
 - * 1) Jesus prays for Himself [1-5]
 - * 2) Jesus prays for His apostles [6-19]
 - * 3) Jesus prays for all disciples who believe on Him through His apostles teaching [20-24]

JOHN 17:1-5 (NKJV)

¹ Jesus spoke these words, lifted up His eyes to heaven, and said: "Father, the hour has come. Glorify Your Son, that Your Son also may glorify You, ² as You have given Him authority over all flesh, that He should give eternal life to as many as You have given Him. ³ And this is eternal life, that they may know You, the only true God, and Jesus Christ whom You have sent.

JOHN 17:1-5 (NKJV)

⁴ I have glorified You on the earth. I have finished the work which You have given Me to do. ⁵ And now, O Father, glorify Me together with Yourself, with the glory which I had with You before the world was.

PRAYER FOR HIMSELF – 17:1-5



John 17:1 (NKJV)

¹ Jesus spoke these words, lifted up His eyes to heaven, and said: "Father, the hour has come. Glorify Your Son, that Your Son also may glorify You,

- "These words" refer to His final & farewell discourse to His disciples (13:1-16:33), which He closes in this prayer. (17:1-24)
- Addressed to His "Father" (5,24), later as His "Holy Father" (11) & "Righteous Father" (25) - Mat 6:9
 - "The hour has come" John has mentioned "this hour" at different points of reference throughout the book - (Had not come - 2:4; 7:30; 8:20; Had come - 12:23,27,32; 13:1)

PRAYER FOR HIMSELF – 17:1-5



John 17:1 (NKJV)

¹ Jesus spoke these words, lifted up His eyes to heaven, and said: "Father, the hour has come. Glorify Your Son, that Your Son also may glorify You,

- "Glorify Your Son" was not a selfish request but motivated from a heart set solely on glorifying the Father that God's wisdom, power, and love might be known through Jesus through His humiliation & sacrifice the completion of His mission! (Phili 2:5-10; Heb 5:8,9)
- The Father continues to be glorified through Christ Rom. 11:36; 16:27; 1 Cor. 10:31; Eph. 1:6, 12, 14; 3:10

The Lord's Prayer" PRAYER FOR HIMSELF — 17:1-5



John 17:2,3 (NKJV)
² as You have given Him authority over all flesh, that He should give eternal life to as many as You have given Him. ³ And this is eternal life, that they may know You, the only true God, and

- "You have given Him authority over all flesh," indicate that Jesus' prayer request was in accordance with the Father's plan. ch. 3:35; 5:21-29. Ps. 2:6-12; 110:1. Da. 7:14; Mat. 11:27; 28:18. 1 Co. 15:25. Ep. 1:20. Phi. 2:10; etc.
- Believers are given to Jesus by the Father and have everlasting life (17:2, 6 [twice], 9, 24) ch. 4:14; 6:27, 35-40; 54-57; 10:28; 11:25, 26; etc

PRAYER FOR HIMSELF — 17:1-5



John 17:2,3 (NKJV)
² as You have given Him authority over all flesh, that He should give eternal life to as many as You have given Him. ³ And this is eternal life, that they may know You, the only true God, and Jesus Christ whom You have sent.

- Eternal Life- From and in both the Father and the Son (1 John 5:20,21)
- That They May Know You Life is found in the Father ONLY through Jesus Christ (John 14:6; cf. Matt. 11:27; 1 John 5:20)
- The Only True God An affirmation of His Father's Divine Nature NOT a denial of His own. (17:2, 5; 1:1; Phili 2:6; Heb 1:8)

PRAYER FOR HIMSELF – 17:1-5



John 17:4–5 (NKJV)

⁴ I have glorified You on the earth. I have finished the work which You have given Me to do. ⁵ And now,

O Father, glorify Me together with Yourself, with the glory which I had with You before the world was.

- How had the Son glorified the Father? (vs. 6; cf. Heb 5:8,9; 9:14; Phili 2:6-8)
 - Undeniable truths of verse 5:
 - * Jesus Christ is distinct from His Father & existed in glory WITH His Father in eternity past.
 - * Jesus surrendered, in becoming flesh, the glory He had WITH His Father in eternity past.
 - * Jesus Christ exchanged heavenly glory for earthly suffering and death.

PRAYER FOR HIMSELF — 17:1-5




John 17:4–5 (NKJV)

⁴ I have glorified You on the earth. I have finished the work which You have given Me to do. ⁵ And now,

O Father, glorify Me together with Yourself, with the glory which I had with You before the world was.

- With thine own self (para seaut \bar{o} i). "By the side of thyself."
- Jesus prays for full restoration to the pre-incarnate glory and fellowship (cf. John 1:1) enjoyed before the Incarnation (John 1:14).
- This is actual and conscious existence at the Father's side "before the existence of the world" (cf. John 17:24; 1:1,2; 8:58; Col. 1:15–18; Phili 2:6–8; Heb 1:1,2).
