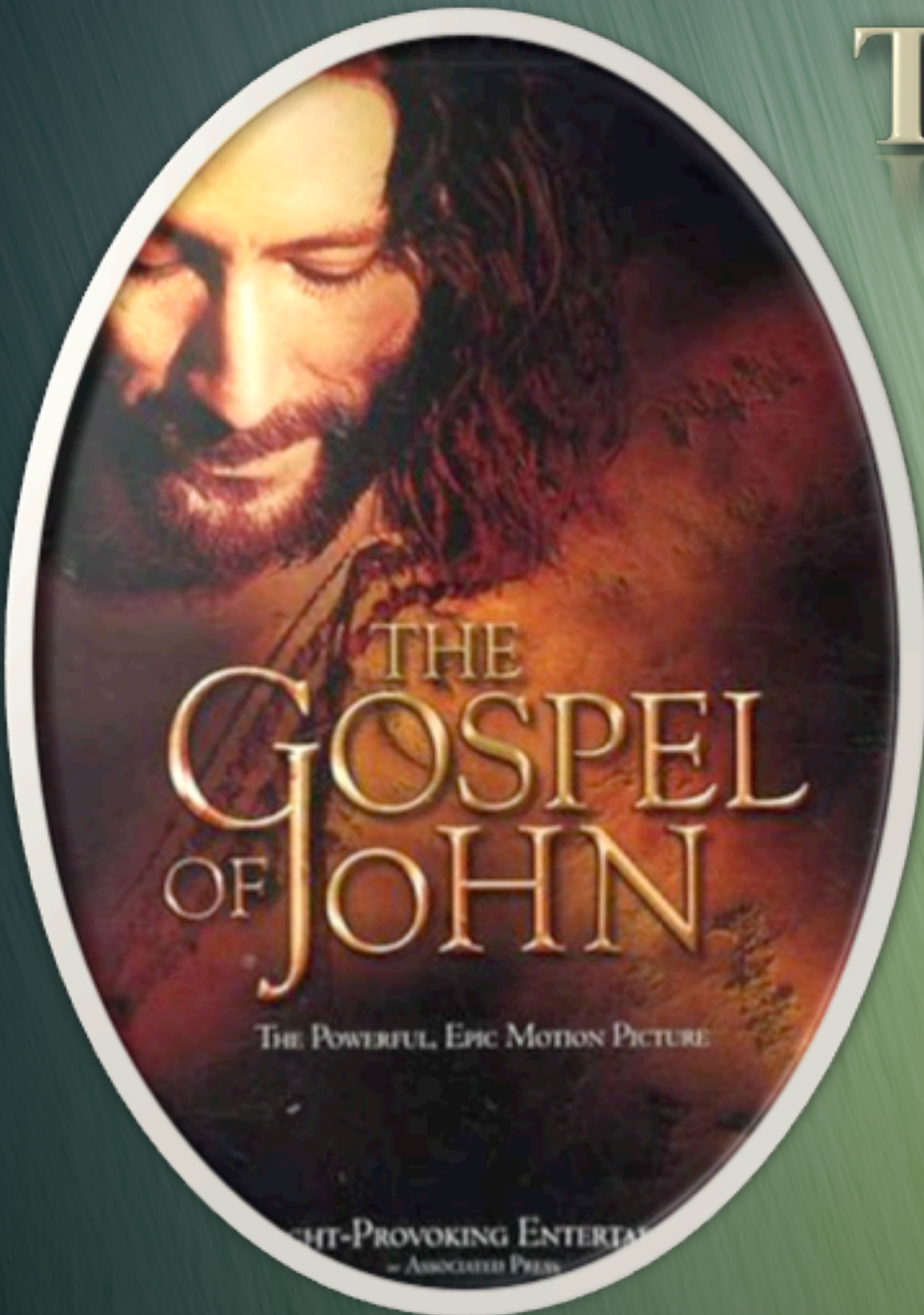

Chapters 13–17 – Jesus privately teaching His apostles, preparing them for His death.

Let NOT your heart be troubled (14:1)

Heaven is REAL & accessible it is in & through
Jesus Christ – (John 14:5,6)

JESUS PREPARES HIS DISCIPLES FOR HIS IMMINENT DEATH



- ◆ Let NOT your heart be troubled (14:1)
- ◆ Heaven is REAL & accessible in & through Jesus Christ – (John 14:5,6)
- ◆ The true Vine – (15:1–11)
- ◆ Jesus told these things so when they happen they will believe – 16:1–4
- ◆ The Holy Spirit would supply their every need – 14:26; 15:26; 16:8–15
- ◆ No one could take their joy – 16:16–33

- ◆ Relation to previous chapters – 13:1–3,27,31; 17:1,2,4,11,12,15
- ◆ Divided naturally into three parts –
 - ✦ 1) Jesus prays for Himself [1–5]
 - ✦ 2) Jesus prays for His apostles [6–19]
 - ✦ 3) Jesus prays for all disciples who believe on Him through His apostles teaching [20–24]

JOHN 17:6-19 (NKJV)

⁶ “I have manifested Your name to the men whom You have given Me out of the world. They were Yours, You gave them to Me, and they have kept Your word. ⁷ Now they have known that all things which You have given Me are from You.



JOHN 17:6-19 (NKJV)

⁸ For I have given to them the words which You have given Me; and they have received them, and have known surely that I came forth from You; and they have believed that You sent Me. ⁹ “I pray for them. I do not pray for the world but for those whom You have given Me, for they are Yours.

¹⁰ And all Mine are Yours, and Yours are Mine, and I am glorified in them. ¹¹

¹⁴ I have given them Your word; and the world has hated them because they are not of the world, just as I am not of the world.

¹⁵ I do not pray that You should take them out of the world, but that You should keep them from the evil one. ¹⁶ They are not of the world, just as I am not of the world.



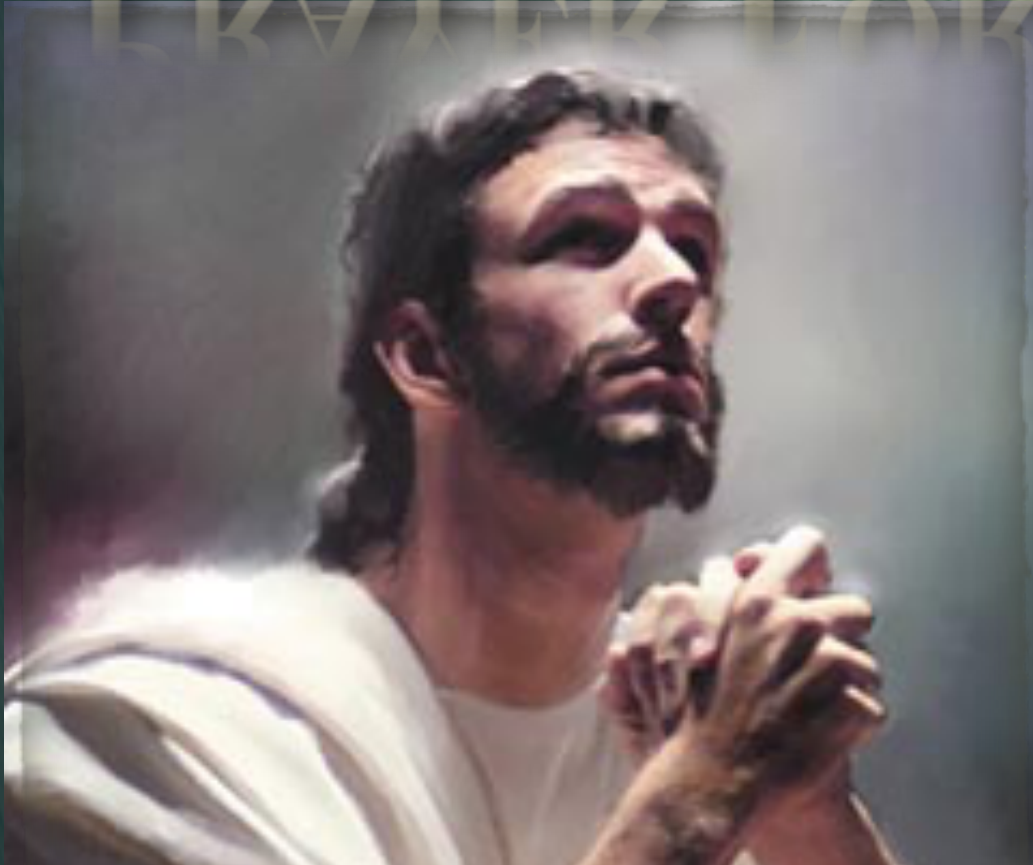

PRAYER FOR APOSTLES – 17:6-19



John 17:9 (NKJV)

⁹ "I pray for them. I do not pray for the world but for those whom You have given Me, for they are Yours.

- ◆ Jesus prayed for His disciples before He chose them (Luke 6:12), during His ministry (John 6:15), at the end of His ministry (Luke 22:32), & here (John 17:6–19)
- ◆ This prayer of intercession reveals Jesus' concern and love for His apostles. (13:1)

PRAYER FOR APOSTLES – 17:6-19



John 17:6 (NKJV)

⁶ "I have manifested Your name to the men whom You have given Me out of the world."

- ◆ "I have manifested Your name" – (17:6, 26), Jesus had made known the Father's character, law, will, & His plan of mercy; – i.e., He had revealed the Father to them – Jn 15:21, Mat 10:22, Rom 2:24, 1 Tim 6:1; Col 3:17
- ◆ The Son is uniquely qualified to reveal the Father – for He knew the Father, He had seen the Father – 1:18; 6:46; 14:9; 17:5; Mat 11:27; Phili 2:6

PRAYER FOR APOSTLES – 17:6-19



John 17:6 (NKJV)
6 "I have manifested Your name to the men whom You have given Me out of the world."

- ◆ "The men whom You have given Me out of the world." – (17:6)
- ✳ The apostles – whom Jesus is about to commission into the world – vs. 18; Mat 28:18-20; Mk 16:15-20; Lk 24:47,48
- ✳ Jesus regards the apostles as the Father's gift to him. – 17:2, 9,11,24; 6:37-40; 10:27-29;18:9

PRAYER FOR APOSTLES – 17:6-19



John 17:6 (NKJV)

⁶ "I have manifested Your name to the men whom You have given Me out of the world."

- ◆ "The men whom You have given Me out of the world." – (17:6)
- ✧ God's choosing, (election) of men for service is one thing & choosing men for salvation is another – Eph 1:4-11; 2 Thes 2:13,14
- ✧ They had been separated out of the world ("world" occurs 18 times in this chap.: vv. 5-6, 9, 11 [twice], 13, 14 [thrice], 15, 16 [twice in the Gr.], 18 [twice], 21, 23-25).

PRAYER FOR APOSTLES – 17:6-19

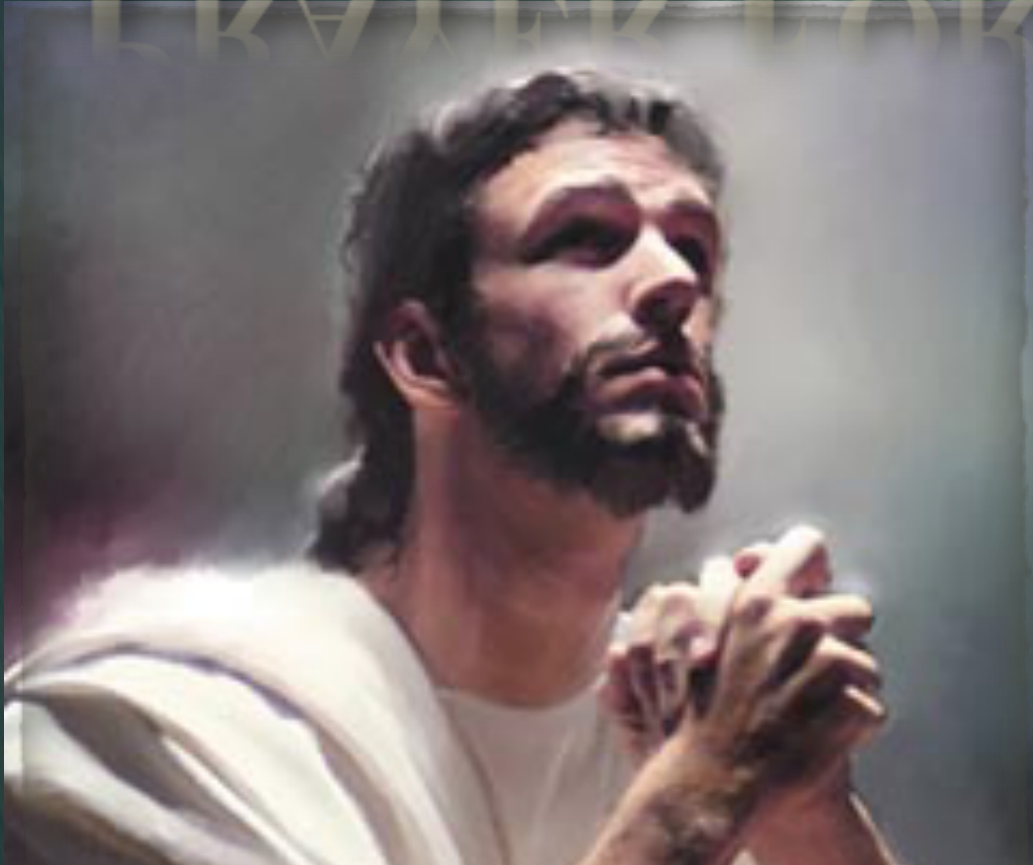


John 17:6 (NKJV)
6 "I have manifested Your name to the men whom You have given Me out of the world."

- ◆ "The men whom You have given Me out of the world." – (17:6)
- ✦ "They have kept your word" – i.e.,
- ✦ **They have kept** (17:6); (τετηρηκαν [tetērēkan]). Perfect active indicative, – Jesus claims continued loyalty and fidelity in these men with the one exception – (verse 12).
- ✦ They believed in His divine mission & His union with the Father (17:7,8). – (cf. 16:27)

PRAYER FOR APOSTLES – 17:6-19



John 17:9 (NKJV)

⁹ "I pray for them. I do not pray for the world but for those whom You have given Me, for they are Yours.

- ◆ Christ's prayer (in vv. 6–19) was particularly for the Eleven, – (a) their preservation ("protect them," v. 11) & (b) their sanctification ("sanctify them," v. 17).
- ◆ At this point He was not praying for the world in its hostility and unbelief – He afterward extends a prayer for all who should become Christians, (17:20) & On the cross he prayed for his crucifiers and murderers – (Luke 23:34).

PRAYER FOR APOSTLES – 17:6-19



John 17:10 (NKJV)
¹⁰ And all Mine are
Yours, and Yours are
Mine, and I am glorified
in them.

- ◆ "All mine are thine" (17:10; ch. 10:30; 16:14, 15; 1 Co. 3:21–23; Col. 1:15–19; 2:9).
- ◆ "I am glorified in them" – (17:10; ch. 5:23; Ac. 19:17; Phi. 1:20; 2:9–11; 2 Th. 1:10, 12).

PRAYER FOR APOSTLES – 17:6-19



John 17:11 (NKJV)

¹¹ Now I am no longer in the world, but these are in the world, and I come to You. Holy Father, keep through Your name those whom You have given Me, that they may be one as We are.

- ◆ Jesus was about to leave this world – ch. 13:1, 3; 14:1–6; 16:28. Ac. 1:9–11; He. 1:3; 9:24.
- ◆ The apostles were to stay in the world to carry out God's plan establishing the kingdom – thus Jesus prays for their protection – (Mat 16:16–18; Acts 1:6–9; 2:1–47).
- ◆ Jesus prays for their unity, patterned after the unity of the Father and the Son: so that they may be one as We are One (cf. vv. 21–22).

PRAYER FOR APOSTLES – 17:6-19



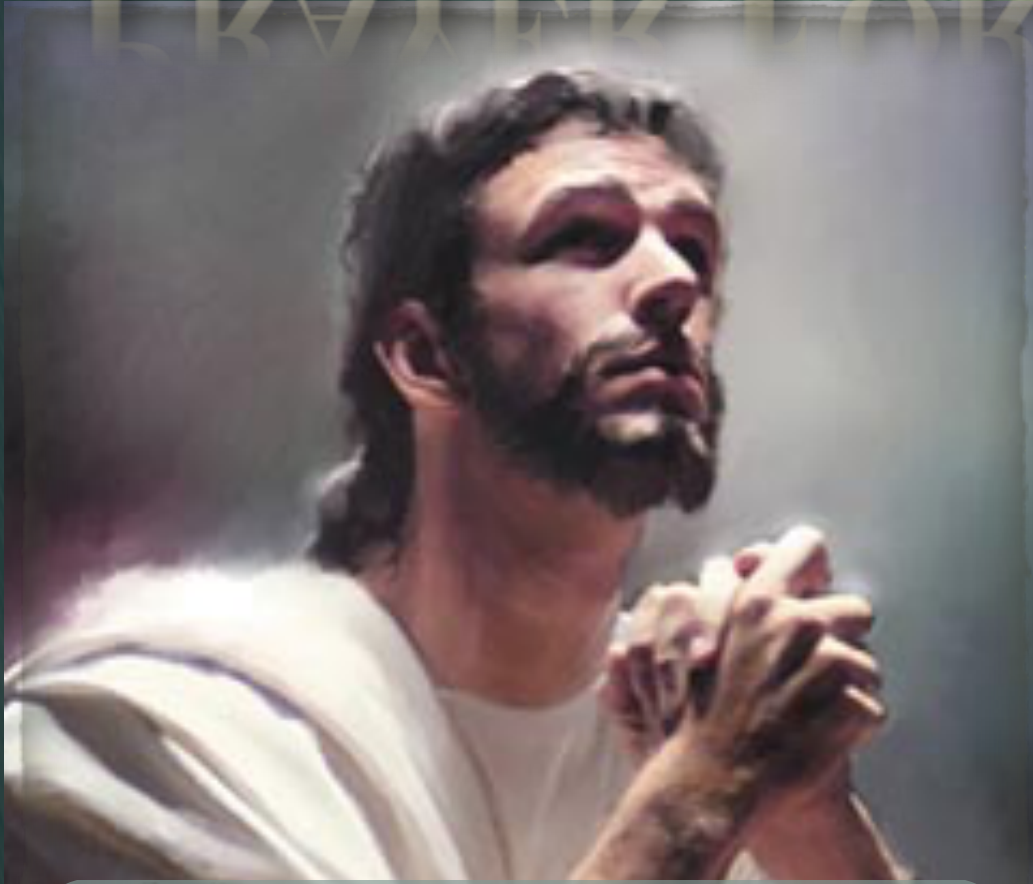
John 17:12 (NKJV)

¹² While I was with them in the world, I kept them in Your name. Those whom You gave Me I have kept; and none of them is lost except the son of perdition, that the Scripture might be fulfilled.

- ◆ God had given him twelve; he had kept them in the name of the Father, and only one was lost, Judas, – ch. 6:70, 71; 13:18.
- ◆ Judas' betrayal of Jesus **fulfilled** (i.e., filled up in a larger sense) the words in Psalm 41:9 about David's betrayal by his friend. –

PRAYER FOR APOSTLES – 17:6-19



John 17:13 (NKJV)
13 But now I come to You, and these things I speak in the world, that they may have My joy fulfilled in themselves.

- ◆ Jesus praying that His joy being fulfilled in them connects well with 15:11 & 16:24
- ◆ The world's animosity towards God & His word is historically & experientially known to all who have indeed received God's word – 17:14; cf. John 15:18–21; Mat. 10:24,25; 2 Tim 3:12; 1 Pe. 4:4, 5; 1 Jno. 3:12.

PRAYER FOR APOSTLES – 17:6-19



- ◆ The apostles were to remain in the world to fulfill their mission – but not be of the world –

John 17:14–15 (NKJV)

¹⁴ I have given them Your word; and the world has hated them because they are not of the world, just as I am not of the world. ¹⁵ I do not pray that You should take them out of the world, but that You should keep them from the evil one.

PRAYER FOR APOSTLES – 17:6-19



- ◆ In order to be effective for God – we MUST be different from the world – Mt 5:13-16

John 17:16-19 (NKJV)

¹⁶ They are not of the world, just as I am not of the world. ¹⁷ Sanctify them by Your truth. Your word is truth. ¹⁸ As You sent Me into the world, I also have sent them into the world. ¹⁹ And for their sakes I sanctify Myself, that they also may be sanctified by the truth

PRAYER FOR APOSTLES – 17:6-19



- ◆ In order to be effective for God – we MUST be changed by His word – Heb 4:12; 1 Pet 1:22,23

John 17:16–19 (NKJV)

¹⁶ They are not of the world, just as I am not of the world. ¹⁷ Sanctify them by Your truth. Your word is truth. ¹⁸ As You sent Me into the world, I also have sent them into the world. ¹⁹ And for their sakes I sanctify Myself, that they also may be sanctified by the truth

John 17:6 (NKJV)

⁶ "I have manifested Your name to the men whom You have given Me out of the world. They were Yours, You gave them to Me, and they have kept Your word.

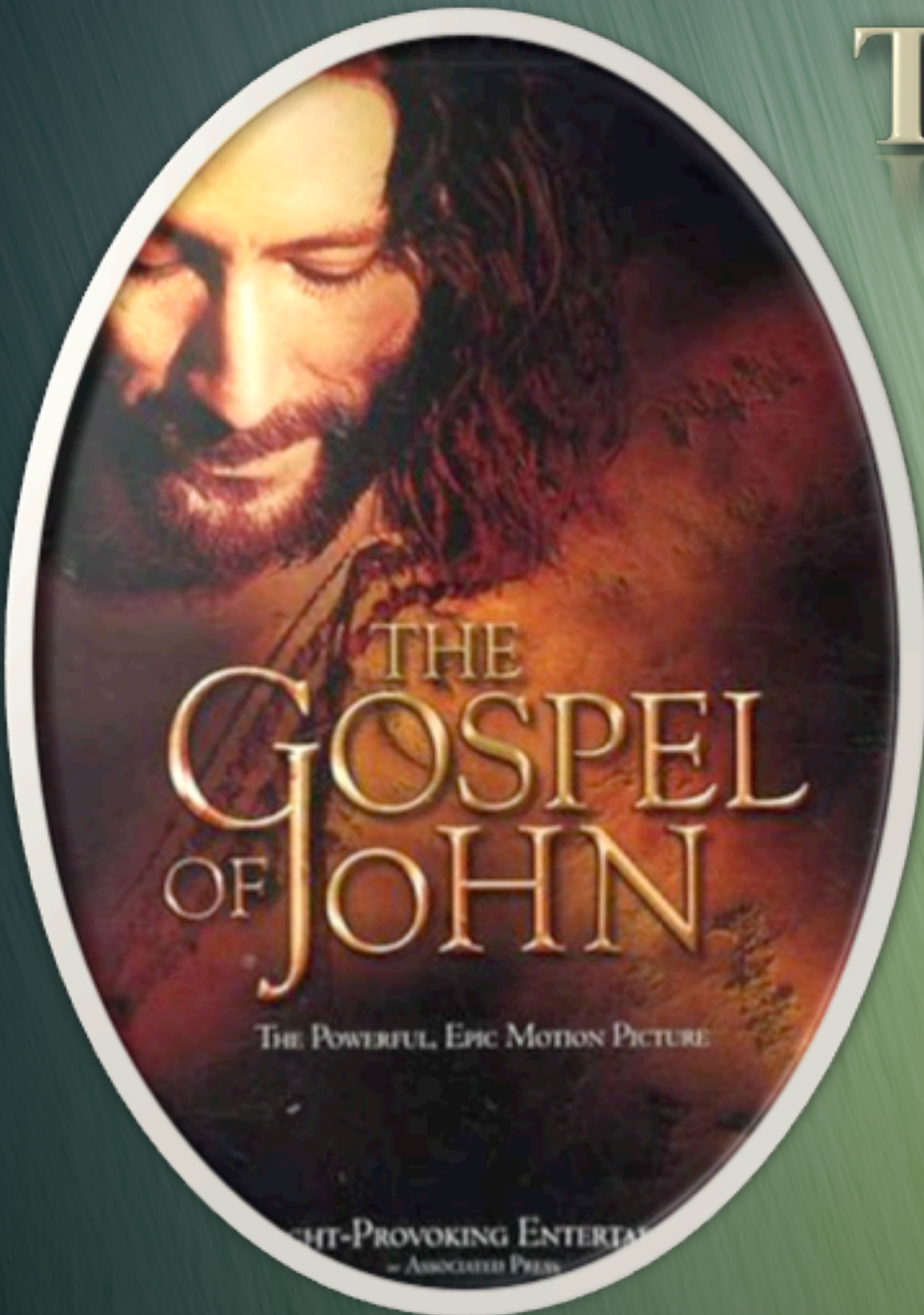
- ◆ This prayer of intercession reveals Jesus' concern and love for His apostles.

 - ◆ Revealed a personal Father

 - ◆ Kept Father's Word

 - ◆ Through the Word
