

³⁰ And truly Jesus did many other signs in the presence of His disciples, which are not written in this book; ³¹ but these are written that you may believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and that believing you may have life in His name.



Jesus does NOT appear in the narrative as a mere victim - nor is he overcome by an external superior power!

His death was entirely voluntary - 10:14-18; 14:30,31

None but Jesus has mastery of the circumstances -

"Just Follow Jesus" THE LORD HE IS RISEN — 20:1-29



- * Things had unfolded just as
 Jesus had foretold (He had
 been put to death, buried and
 arose from the dead 14:29
- * Mary Magdalene saw Him first (20:15-18; Mark 16:9)
- * The women reported to the 11 disciples that they had seen the risen Lord but they did not believe (Mark 16:14; Luke 24:36-43)

THE LORD HE IS RISEN – 20:1-29

Mark 16:14 (NKJV)

¹⁴ Later He appeared to the eleven as they sat at the table; and He rebuked their unbelief and hardness of heart, because they did not believe those who had seen Him after He had risen.



¹ After these things Jesus showed Himself again to the disciples at the Sea of Tiberias, and in this way He showed Himself: ² Simon Peter, Thomas called the Twin, Nathanael of Cana in Galilee, the sons of Zebedee, and two others of His disciples were together. ³ Simon Peter said to them, "I am going fishing." They said to him, "We are going with you also." They went out and immediately got into the boat, and that night they caught nothing.

⁴ But when the morning had now come, Jesus stood on the shore; yet the disciples did not know that it was Jesus. 5 Then Jesus said to them, "Children, have you any food?" They answered Him, "No." 6 And He said to them, "Cast the net on the right side of the boat, and you will find some." So they cast, and now they were not able to draw it in because of the multitude of fish.

⁷ Therefore that disciple whom Jesus loved said to Peter, "It is the Lord!" Now when Simon Peter heard that it was the Lord, he put on his outer garment (for he had removed it), and plunged into the sea. 8 But the other disciples came in the little boat (for they were not far from land, but about two hundred cubits), dragging the net with fish. ⁹ Then, as soon as they had come to land, they saw a fire of coals there, and fish laid on it, and bread.

10 Jesus said to them, "Bring some of the fish which you have just caught." 11 Simon Peter went up and dragged the net to land, full of large fish, one hundred and fifty-three; and although there were so many, the net was not broken. 12 Jesus said to them, "Come and eat breakfast." Yet none of the disciples dared ask Him, "Who are You?"-knowing that it was the Lord. 13 Jesus then came and took the bread and gave it to them, and likewise the fish.

14 This is now the third time Jesus showed Himself to His disciples after He was raised from the dead. 15 So when they had eaten breakfast, Jesus said to Simon Peter, "Simon, son of Jonah, do you love Me more than these?" He said to Him, "Yes, Lord; You know that I love You." He said to him, "Feed My lambs."


16 He said to him again a second time, "Simon, son of Jonah, do you love Me?" He said to Him, "Yes, Lord; You know that I love You." He said to him, "Tend My sheep." 17 He said to him the third time, "Simon, son of Jonah, do you love Me?" Peter was grieved because He said to him the third time, "Do you love Me?" And he said to Him, "Lord, You know all things; You know that I love You." Jesus said to him, "Feed My sheep.

18 Most assuredly, I say to you, when you were younger, you girded yourself and walked where you wished; but when you are old, you will stretch out your hands, and another will gird you and carry you where you do not wish." 19 This He spoke, signifying by what death he would glorify God. And when He had spoken this, He said to him, "Follow Me."

²⁰ Then Peter, turning around, saw the disciple whom Jesus loved following, who also had leaned on His breast at the supper, and said, "Lord, who is the one who betrays You?" 21 Peter, seeing him, said to Jesus, "But Lord, what about this man?" 22 Jesus said to him, "If I will that he remain till I come, what is that to you? You follow Me."


²³ Then this saying went out among the brethren that this disciple would not die. Yet Jesus did not say to him that he would not die, but, "If I will that he remain till I come, what is that to you?" ²⁴ This is the disciple who testifies of these things, and wrote these things; and we know that his testimony is true.

²⁵ And there are also many other things that Jesus did, which if they were written one by one, I suppose that even the world itself could not contain the books that would be written. Amen.



- * The Sea of Tiberias is another name for the Sea of Galilee 21:1; 6:1
- * An angel had promised that Jesus would meet with His disciples in Galilee ((Mark 16:7; Matt. 28:7, 16).
 - Peter decides he is going fishing six others went with him These seven (Peter, Thomas, Nathanael, the sons of Zebedee, [Matt. 4:21], and two others). We do not know who the "two others of his disciples" were. (21:2,3)

JESUS' APPEARANCE BY THE LAKE (21:1–14)





"Jesus came to the beach and stood there." - They see Him but do not recognize Him - Jesus inquires about their success -


He said to them, "Cast the net on the right side of the boat, and you will find some." - cf (Luke 5:1-11)



- Therefore that disciple whom Jesus loved said to Peter, "It is the Lord!" John quickly recognizes that it is the Lord, (21:7; see on Jn 20:8),
- "when Simon Peter heard that it was the Lord, he put on his outer garment (for he had removed it) ..." Peter immediately puts on his fisher's coat (ἐπενδύτην An upper garment or blouse), jumps into the water, and apparently swims to Jesus.- (21:7)




- But the other disciples came in the little boat (Two hundred cubits. A little over a hundred yards). (8)
- * Mention of the large fish, 153 in all, has given rise to all kinds of allegorical and symbolic interpretations. A lesson here is that great blessing comes to one' when he follows the Lord's will. (11)
- * When Jesus invited them to eat with Him, none of them asked who He was for they knew it was the Lord. (12)



- * "... took the bread and gave it to them, and likewise the fish." (12) Their meal together Years later in his preaching Peter speaks of eating & drinking with Jesus after His resurrection (Acts 10:41).
 - The third time (14) The third appearance to the apostles, which John narrated (cf. John 20:19, 24). [There were 4 other appearances (to Mary Magdalene, to of women, to the two on the way to Emmaus, to Peter).

JESUS' REINSTATING OF PETER (21:15-23).




Earlier Peter had denied Jesus 3 times beside a fire (18:18, 25).

* Simon Son of John, (1:42). – Jesus asked him, Do you truly love Me more than these? (15)

What did Jesus mean by "these"? Jesus probably was referring to the disciples, in light of Peter's proud statement that he never would fall away no matter what others did (Matt. 26:33, 35; Luke 22:33; John 13:37).


JESUS' REINSTATING OF PETER (21:15-23).



Jesus' threefold question and threefold commission of apostolic mission contrast directly with Peter's three denials. Three times Peter said he did not even know the Lord (18:17, 25, 27); now three times he said he loved the Lord (21:15-17).

Three times Jesus tells Peter to care for the flock: Catholics assume this asserts Peter's primacy, but such is foreign to the passage & broader context - (cf. Mat 16:1; 1 Peter 5:2).


JESUS' REINSTATING OF PETER (21:15-23).



In Jesus' three questions of love (agapas, agapas, and phileis) and His three commands of duty (boske, "Feed My lambs; (v. 15);"; poimaine, "Take care of My sheep (v. 16);"; boske - Feed My sheep (v. 17) various Greek synonyms are used.

Since it is difficult to see any consistent distinctions that John intended, most scholars see these as stylistic variations.


JESUS' REINSTATING OF PETER (21:15-23).

"This was the Physician's deepest incision into the wound, bringing up before his view, of his "thrice denying that he knew Him," ... But this accomplished, the painful dialogue concludes with a delightful "Feed My sheep" [JFB]




when ... old thou shalt stretch forth thine hands—to be bound for execution - There is a very early tradition that Peter's death was by crucifixion upside down.

19. This spake he, signifying by what death he should glorify God—this prediction was intended to follow up his triple restoration:
—"Yes, Simon, you shall not only feed My lambs, and feed My sheep, but will be counted worthy to die for Me"

²⁰ Then Peter, turning around, saw the disciple whom Jesus loved following, who also had leaned on His breast at the supper, and said, "Lord, who is the one who betrays You?" 21 Peter, seeing him, said to Jesus, "But Lord, what about this man?" 22 Jesus said to him, "If I will that he remain till I come, what is that to you? 
Peter, having been informed about his life & eventual end, wondered what the future held for his friend John, the disciple whom Jesus loved. (20,21)

Jesus sharply rebuked Peter -He was to mind his own affairs. Accordingly, in "follow thou Me," the word "thou" is emphatic.

Some are easily distracted by their concerns for what others are doing or are not doing ... we need to focus on ourselves!
