
DAVID STRENGTHENED HIMSELF Crisis IN THE LORD HIS GOD


We all need encouragement from time to time.



- Times of discouragement, (loss of health, done wrong by a friend etc.)
- Times of uncertainty, (when we lose our sense of control)
- Times of stress, (when our load seems heavier than we can bear).
- Times of crisis & fear. (When all seems lost ...)

Where Do We Turn In Such Times?





I Samuel 30:1-6 (NKJV)

¹ Now it happened, when David and his men came to Ziklag, on the third day, that the Amalekites had invaded the South and Ziklag, attacked Ziklag and burned it with fire, ² and had taken captive the women and those who were there, from small to great; they did not kill anyone, but carried them away and went their way.

I Samuel 30:1-6 (NKJV)

³ So David and his men came to the city, and there it was, burned with fire; and their wives, their sons, and their daughters had been taken captive. 4 Then David and the people who were with him lifted up their voices and wept, until they had no more power to weep. ⁵ And David's two wives, Ahinoam the Jezreelitess, and Abigail the widow of Nabal the Carmelite, had been taken captive.

I Samuel 30:1-6 (NKJV)

⁶ Now David was greatly distressed, for the people spoke of stoning him, because the soul of all the people was grieved, every man for his sons and his daughters. But David strengthened himself in the Lord his God.

Time For A Purposed Godly Perspective

- When it says, David "strengthened himself" the Hebrew verb implies persistent and continuous effort.
 - In times of trouble, David didn't deny the realities around him, but he focused on God's might, faithfulness & promises -

⁶ ... But David strengthened himself in the Lord his God.

(consider the many Psalms written during times of crisis - he praised & worshipped ...)

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Time For A Purposed Godly Perspective

- After being betrayed by Doeg to Saul (Psalm 52, 54),
- After being captured by the Philistines in Gath (Psalm 56),
 - In hiding in caves while running from Saul (Psalm 57),
- ⁶ ... But David strengthened himself in the Lord his God.
- When Saul had staked out his home to betray him (Psalm 59),
- In the desert (Psalm 63).

A Psalm of David When He Was in the Wilderness of Judah. 1 O God, You are my God; Early will I seek You; My soul thirsts for You; My flesh longs for You In a dry and thirsty land Where there is no water.

² So I have looked for You in the sanctuary, To see Your power and Your glory. ³ Because Your lovingkindness is better than life, My lips shall praise You. 4 Thus I will bless You while I live; I will lift up my hands in Your name.

Psalm 63:I-II (NKJV ⁵ My soul shall be satisfied as with marrow and fatness, And my mouth shall praise You with joyful lips. ⁶ When I remember You on my bed, I meditate on You in the night watches.

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⁷ Because You have been my help, Therefore in the shadow of Your wings I will rejoice. 8 My soul follows close behind You; Your right hand upholds me. 9 But those who seek my life, to destroy it, Shall go into the lower parts of the earth.

How will we be able to "STRENGTHEN **OURSELVES IN THE** LORD" in the time of crisis if we have not strengthened ourselves in the Lord in the times of peace? - 2 Tim 2:15

⁶ ... But David strengthened himself in the Lord his God.

DAVID STRENGTHENED HIMSELF In The Time IN THE LORD HIS GO Crisis

Time For Seeking God's Will

The inquiry was made by means of the ephod, the high priest's apron-like garment which contained the Urim and Thummim which Abiathar the son of Ahimelech had - (cf. Ex. 28:30; Num 27:21; 1 Sam 22:20,21).

> Assured of victory (v. 8), David and his 600 men pursued the Amalekites to the Besor Ravine (the Wadi el-Arish, some 20 miles south of Ziklag).

⁸ So David inquired of the Lord, saying, "Shall I pursue this troop? Shall I overtake them?"

Time For Seeking God's Will

- He did not presume and act in the impulse of the moment he waited on the Lord's permission (23:2-9; cf. 2 Sam 5:19,23; 1 Chron 14:10).
 - Many do as they wish or react in the moment then attempt to justify what they have done ...
 - We must ALWAYS act within God's authority (Col. 3:17; 2 Jn 9,10; Eph 5:15-17)

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Time For Courage & Strength To Act

- When he heard from the Lord, he moved swiftly in obedience (9-15)
 - David acted by faith not of his own will, or strength, but of God's instruction thus the victory was the Lord's the reward was of God's grace (20-23)
 - Faith that obeys is the faith that saves, (James 2:14-26), and such a faith does not nullify God's grace, but receives it (Eph 2:8-10; Rom 4:12; Heb 3:12-19; 4:11; 5:8,9)

⁹ So David went, he and the six hundred men ... ¹⁰ But David pursued, he and four hundred men

Time For Courage & Strength To Act

It takes a great deal of courage to live faithfully in today's secular, ungodly world, and to stand for the truth -

Psalm 31:24 (NKJV)

²⁴ Be of good courage, And He shall strengthen your heart, All you who hope in the Lord.

⁹ So David went, he and the six hundred men ... ¹⁰ But David pursued, he and four hundred men

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Time For Courage & Strength To Act

The Christian's courage & strength to obey, even in times of crisis, is NOT derived from our own strength - but from God in whom we fully place our confidence -

⁹ So David went, he and the six hundred men ... ¹⁰ But David pursued, he and four hundred men

(Psalm 27:14; Josh 1:6-9; Daniel 3:16-18; Num 13,14; Eph 6:10-18; Col. 1:11; Phili 4:13)



10 ... for two hundred stayed behind, who were so weary that they could not cross the Brook Besor

Time For Mercy

David did not require more from his men that what they were able to accomplish - He had pity on those exhausted and required rest - (10,23-25)

11 Then they found an Egyptian in the field, and brought him to David; and they gave him bread and he ate, and they let him drink water

David treats an Egyptian, a servant of one of the Amalekites, with kindness - He could have assumed him guilty by association - (11-16)

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Time For Mercy

It is common for hurting people to lash out at others - to be critical, judgmental, hateful and even injurious to others - (Mat 5:38-48; Prov 20:22; Rom 12:17-19; 1 Thes 5:15; 1 Pet 3:9; Prov 3:27; Luke 6:35)

11 Then they found an Egyptian in the field, and brought him to David; and they gave him bread and he ate, and they let him drink water

★It is also common for the weak to be looked down on & judged by the strong - (22; Ro12:3-21; 14:1; 15:1; 1 Cor 12:20-23; Luke 10:29-37)


Time To Encourage Others


- David's 400 men who were rugged enough to stand the rigorous march (vv. 9–10) defeated the Amalekites and retrieved all their families and property intact (vv. 17–20).
 - The 200 who had remained behind by the Besor Ravine (vv. 10, 21) wanted a share of the Amalekite spoils.
 - The 400 resented this request ...

²¹ Now David came to the two hundred men who had been so weary ... And when David came near the people, he greeted them

Time To Encourage Others

- The strong should encourage the weak (Ro14:1; 15:1; Gal 6:1; 1 Thes 4:18; 5:11,14,15; Heb 10:24,25)
- We must be considerate of one another merciful, kind, helpful & forgiving (Ro12:3-21; Col. 3:12-15)
- ²¹ Now David came to the two hundred men who had been so weary ... And when David came near the people, he greeted them
- Every person & task in the kingdom is important we should encourage one another to greater service to do what they can (1 Cor 12:20-26)





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I Peter 5:5-II (NKJV)

⁵ Likewise you younger people, submit yourselves to your elders. Yes, all of you be submissive to one another, and be clothed with humility, for "God resists the proud, But gives grace to the humble."

I Peter 5:5-II (NKJV) ⁶ Therefore humble yourselves under the mighty hand of God, that He may exalt you in due time, ⁷ casting all your care upon Him, for He cares for you.

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


In The Time of Crisis
