

2 CORINTHIANS 6:1-10 (NKJV) 1 We then, as workers together with Him also plead with you not to receive the grace of God in vain. 2 For He says: "In an acceptable time I have heard you, And in the day of salvation I have helped you." Behold, now is the accepted time; behold, now is the day of salvation.

Plea To Receive His Ministry - (6:1-2)

2 Corinthians 6:1–2 (NKJV) ¹ We then, as workers together with Him also plead with you not to receive the grace of God in vain. ² For He says: "In an acceptable time I have heard you, And in the day of salvation I have helped you." Behold, now is the accepted time; behold, now is the day of salvation.

- "as workers together with Him also plead with you"
 - ★ The apostolic ministry is in conjunction with Christ & His work (5:18-21; 1 Cor 3:9; Rom 1:16,17; 5:8,9)
 - ★ For the Corinthians to reject the gospel he preached, they would have received God's grace in vain (11:4; 1 Cor 6:9-11; Ga. 1:6-9; 2:2; 3:4; Phili 2:16; 1 This 3:5; He. 12:15, 25)

"now is the day of salvation"

- → Paul's quotation in vs. 2 is from Isaiah 49:8; (cf Lk 4:18-21)
- ★ The quotation underscores that salvation for all is God's initiative, (I have heard, ... I have helped), i.e., by grace, and not by works of the Law, (cf. 2 Cor. 3:12– 16; Gal. 3:1–6).
- ★ The gospel message presents today as "the day of salvation" and the "acceptable time" — (Is 61:2; Hebrews 3:7,8,13; 4:7)

Marks of His Ministry - (6:3-10)

→ "We give no offense in anything"

Marks of His Ministry - (6:3-10)



- → Paul knew the message of the Cross would offend many (2:16; 1 Cor. 1:18).
- → Paul knew that many considered him a fool (cf. 2 Cor. 11:16).
- → But, Paul did not want to say or do anything that would hinder one's reception of the gospel and bring disrepute upon the gospel of Jesus Christ and those who preached it. (1 Cor. 8:9; 2 Cor. 6:3).

Marks of His Ministry - (6:3-10)

"we commend ourselves ..." - (4)

- → Paul did not need letters of commendation, or even to commend himself again to them the authenticity of his ministry was self evident - (5:12) [unlike the false teachers - (3:1; 10:18; 11:22)]
- ▶ Paul's authenticating marks of the ministry were his sufferings as a servant and the sustaining enablement of God to carry on (cf. 2 Cor. 4:8–10; 6:4; cf. 11:16–12:10; 1 Cor. 4:9–13; Gal. 6:17).

- Nine inner qualities (vv. 6−7),
- Nine pairs of paradoxes (vv. 8−10).


→Nine pairs of paradoxes (vv. 8–10).



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1 Let a man so consider us, as servants of Christ and stewards of the mysteries of God. ² Moreover it is required in stewards that one be found faithful. ³ But with me it is a very small thing that I should be judged by you or by a human court. In fact, I do not even judge myself. 4 For I know of nothing against myself, yet I am not justified by this; but He who judges me is the Lord.

⁵ Therefore judge nothing before the time, until the Lord comes, who will both bring to light the hidden things of darkness and reveal the counsels of the hearts. Then each one's praise will come from God. ⁶ Now these things, brethren, I have figuratively transferred to myself and Apollos for your sakes, that you may learn in us not to think beyond what is written,

that none of you may be puffed up on behalf of one against the other. ⁷

For who makes you differ from another? And what do you have that you did not receive? Now if you did indeed receive it, why do you boast as if you had not received it? 8 You are already full! You are already rich!

You have reigned as kings without us—and indeed I could wish you did reign, that we also might reign with you! 9 For I think that God has displayed us, the apostles, last, as men condemned to death; for we have been made a spectacle to the world, both to angels and to men.
