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
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
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Thessalonica: Greeting




- ◆ Paul, Silas and Timothy (Act 16:1-3, 11-40; 17:1-2).
- ◆ To the church (ecclesia), i.e., called out assembly, people who were IN God & Christ—(Mat. 28:19,20; Rom. 6:3-6; Gal. 3:26,27).
- ◆ Grace was the common Greek salutation meaning "divine favor" God's grace in Christ was the means of the "peace" they enjoyed in Christ (Eph. 2:16; Phili. 4:6,7,9.

- ◆ Commended for their "work of faith," "labor of love" & "patience of hope" — (1 Thes 1:3)
- ◆ Chosen by God, they were in Christ - they heard, believed and obeyed the gospel -
 - Received the word of God as God's word —(1 Thes 1:4,6;
 2:13; 2 Thes 2:13-15).
 - ◆ They truly repented (1:9)
 - ◆ They were great examples / Evangelistic — (1:7-10)
 - ★ Imitated Judean churches /
 Suffered for Christ (2:14-16)




- ◆ The "Word of God" effectively worked in them (2:13)
