

Coming With Authority So Prepare - 13:1-6



"the third time I am coming to you" - (1) to one actual visit,; [Acts 18] (2) the purposed visit which had been abandoned; and (3) that which he now has in view. - - This view fits best with the known facts, and is in entire accordance both with his language in 2 Cor 12:14, and with his mode of expressing his intentions, as in 1Cor 16:5.

Coming With Authority So Prepare - 13:1-6

- 2 Corinthians 13:1 (NKJV) ¹ This will be the third time I am coming to you. "By the mouth of two or three witnesses every word shall be established."
 - "... if I come again I will not spare"

 "By the mouth of two or three
 - "By the mouth of two or three witnesses every word shall be established." - A reference to Deuteronomy 19:15 and applies it, as did Jesus, to the errant brethren (Matt. 18:16).
 - Many apply Paul's words to the "visits," but it makes more sense to understand them as Paul examining the evidence in a judicious manner.

Coming With Authority So Prepare - 13:1-6

- "I come again I will not spare""I have told you before" -
 - Paul had warned them in person (Acts 18:1-18) and by epistle, (1 Cor. 4:19-21)
 - "... those who have sinned before, and to all the rest,"-When Paul came, he would use his apostolic authority to discipline any in the fellowship who required correction.
- 2 Corinthians 13:2 (NKJV)
 ² I have told you before, and foretell as if I were present the second time, and now being absent I write to those who have sinned before, and to all the rest, that if I come again I will not spare—

o"... if I come again I will not spare"

- 2 Corinthians 13:3–4 (NKJV) ³ since you seek a proof of Christ speaking in me, who is not weak toward you, but mighty in you. ⁴ For though He was crucified in weakness, yet He lives by the power of God. For we also are weak in Him, but we shall live with Him by the power of God toward you.
- The proof of his apostolic authority, which they wanted, would be given but in terms they would be wise to avoid (cf. 1 Cor. 5:5).
- What many think of as weak, is actually an exertion of God's strength - (cf. 1 Cor 1:18ff; 15:43)
- Though Paul was weak, Christ was not (cf. 2 Cor. 10:4).

- "Do you not know yourselves, that Jesus Christ is in you?"
- They had received the truth from Paul and other evangelists, [Peter, Apollos . . .] - (Acts 18; 1 Cor 1:11,12)
- Not a subjective test (1 Cor 12:13; ch. 2 Cor 6:16. Jno. 14:23; 15:4; 17:23, 26. Ro. 8:10. Ga. 2:20; 4:19. Ep. 2:20–22; 3:17. Col. 1:27; 2:19. 1 Pe. 2:4, 5)

1 Corinthians 9:25-27 (NKJV) And everyone who competes for the prize is temperate in all things. Now they do it to obtain a perishable crown, but we for an imperishable crown. 26 Therefore I run thus: not with uncertainty. Thus I fight: not as one who beats the air. 27 But I discipline my body and bring it into subjection, lest, when I have preached to others, I myself should become disqualified.

Examine yourselves:

- Motives (Love / Faith)
- Attitude (Humility / Meek)
- Thoughts (Holy / Just)
- Behavior (Godly / Influence)
- Service (Obedient / Zealous)

Paul Preferred Gentleness - (13:7-10)

"... And this also we pray, that you may be made complete."

- ² Corinthians 13:7 (NKJV)

 ⁷ Now I pray to God that you do no evil, not that we should appear approved, but that you should do what is honorable, though we may seem disqualified.
- The apostle's greatest desire was the obedience and godliness of his readers. (Phi. 1:9-11; Col. 1:9,10)
- This was more important to him than his own vindication, as important as that was - (v. 6; 1 Cor 14:36-38).

Paul Preferred Gentleness - (13:7-10)

"... And this also we pray, that you may be made complete."

- ⁸ For we can do nothing against the truth, but for the truth. ⁹ For we are glad when we are weak and you are strong. And this also we pray, that you may be made complete.
- Paul's loyalty to the truth was such that he could not act against it - he could not compromise it - he must teach it and abide by it!
- His concern was the Corinthians and their acceptance & growth in and by the truth.

Paul Preferred Gentleness - (13:7-10)


"... And this also we pray, that you may be made complete."

- 2 Corinthians 13:10 (NKJV)

 10 Therefore I write these
 things being absent, lest being
 present I should use
 sharpness, according to the
 authority which the Lord has
 given me for edification and
 not for destruction.
- As a conclusion to this warning (2 Cor. 12:20–21; 13:5–7), Paul desired he be spared the pain of disciplining those he loved (cf. 2:2)
- Instead he wanted to work with them for their joy (1:24) and for building them up (13:10), NOT their destruction.

Closing Exhortations & Greetings - 13:11-14

2 Corinthians 13:11-14 (NKJV) 11 Finally, brethren, farewell. Become complete. Be of good comfort, be of one mind, live in peace; and the God of love and peace will be with you. 12 Greet one another with a holy kiss. 13 All the saints greet you. 14 The grace of the Lord Jesus Christ, and the love of God, and the communion of the Holy Spirit be with you all. Amen.
