
- These churches needed hope, courage, comfort & most needed rebuke-(Acts 14:22; 2 Tim 3:12)
- Instruction needed for all Christians of all ages
 - Was / is being a
 Christian "worth it?" Mat 10:28; 16:24-27;
 Rev 14:12,13






- Jesus is said to be "in the midst" of the seven golden lamp-stands, which are the seven churches (1:13,20).
- The Lord is intimately aware of what transpires within every congregation.
 - He "knows" their situation, works, faithfulness & sins (2:2,9,13,19; 3:1,8,15; Heb 4:13).
- The Lord sees us as we really are (2 Corinthians 5:10).





- ♦ 43 miles southeast of Philadelphia in the Lycos valley, between Hierapolis [6 miles to the north] and Colosse [10 miles to the southeast] on the great Roman road to Syrian Antioch.
- Named by its founder, Antiochus II (261-246 B.C.), after his wife Laodice.
- The city was added to the Roman Empire in 133 B.C.





- Received from Rome the title of "free city."
- Had a large Jewsih population.
 - * Antiochus the Great transported 2,000 Jewish families to Phrygia from Babylonia.
 - * Cicero records that Flaccus confiscated a large sum of gold which was being sent annually to Jerusalem for the Temple (Flacco 28-68).






- ◆ Its wealthy citizens embellished Laodicea with beautiful monuments including three marble theaters.
- Its many buildings include stadium, baths, temples, gymnasium, a bouleuterion, etc..




The city minted its own coins. Inscriptions show evidence of the worship of Zeus, Æsculapius, Apollo, & the emperors.

Destroyed by an earthquake in A.D. 60, but it had the wealth and ability to rebuild without the help of the state [TACITUS, Annals, 14.27].

3:17 Because you say, 'I am rich, have become wealthy, and have need of nothing'--and do not know that you are wretched, miserable, poor, blind, and naked--

- **♦ Three Main Businesses**
 - * Banking center for the region (riches)
 - * Black wool market (provided fine garments)
 - * Ointment for eyes (supposed to help vision)
- All used to emphasize the contrast between things and spiritual things

Colossians 4:12-16 (NKJV)

14 Luke the beloved physician and Demas greet you. 15 Greet the brethren who are in Laodicea, and Nymphas and the church that is in his house. 16 Now when this epistle is read among you, see that it is read also in the church of the Laodiceans, and that you likewise read the epistle from Laodicea.

The last of the seven Asian churches, along with Sardis, the strongest of our Lord's denunciations, there being no compliment of any kind extended to them.

Revelation 3:14 (NKIV)

14 "... 'These things says the Amen, the Faithful and True Witness, the Beginning of the creation of God:

Christ's Self Designation

- * These things says the Amen,
 - The term "amen" means "in truth, most certainly, so be it" (Mounce. 1079; cf. 2 Cor 1:20;
 - As an appellation, refers to His sovereignty as "Deity" (Is 65:16).
 - Jesus is steady, in control and unchangeable in all His purposes and promises. (Jn 7:28,29; Heb 13:8)



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Revelation 3:14 (NKN)

14 "... 'These things says the Amen, the Faithful and True Witness, the Beginning of the creation of God:

Christ's Self Designation

- * "The Faithful & True Witness" He is competent to testify the truth (Jn 8:14-16; Heb 1:1,2)
- * "The Beginning of the creation of God:" Not the first of creatures as the Arians held and J.W.'s do now, but the originating source & cause of ALL creation (Jn 1:1-3; Col 1:16,17; Heb 1:2)

Revelation 3:15 (NKIV)

¹⁵ I know your works, that you are neither cold nor hot. I could wish you were cold or hot.

The Rebuke (vs 15-17)

- * The church was indifferent, apathetic & thought of themselves as self-sufficient -
- General conviction of the truth
 but no zeal or enthusiasm.
 Uncommitted & uninvolved.
- * What virtue is there in being a moderate in religion? (1 Kings 18:21; Mat 6:24; James 1:8)



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Revelation 3:15 (NKIV)

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The Rebuke (vs 15-17)

- * "I could wish you were cold or hot."
- * Not saying that coldness in spirituality is a desired trait, but rather a better trait than the half-hearted apathetic state.

"I could wish you were cold or hot"

- No pretense or hypocrisy
- Ones actual state is readily known (Paul was cold, then hot)
- Demonstrates a more respectable character -(honesty & sincerity)
- Perhaps a better opportunity of conversion

"I could wish you were cold or hot"

- A lukewarm, apathetic, indifferent, lackadaisical, don't care attitude, inoculates one from receiving genuine saving faith.
- In such a state one sees no need to change!

Revelation 3:16 (NKIV)

¹⁶ So then, because you are lukewarm, and neither cold nor hot, I will vomit you out of My mouth.

The Rebuke (vs 15-17)

- * They may have called their lukewarmness charity, meekness, moderation, and a largeness of soul; but it was nauseous to Christ.
- * To reject with abhorrence. God abhors indifference in religion no less than open infidelity or open immorality.

Revelation 3:17 (NKIV)

¹⁷ Because you say, 'I am rich, have become wealthy, and have need of nothing'--and do not know that you are wretched, miserable, poor, blind, and naked--

The Rebuke (vs 15-17)

- * Implies self-praise and self reliance in self-acquired riches (The rich fool Luke 12:17-19; The praying Pharisee Luke 18:11)
- * They allowed their wealth and comfort to become their downfall without even recognizing it.
- * They saw themselves as "in need of nothing," spiritually Like
 Ephraim of old (Hosea 12:7).

"And do not know that you are wretched, miserable, poor, blind, and naked"

~ The Rebuke (vs 15-17)

- * Wretched condemned a state of helplessness Rom 7:24
- * Miserable condition if despair 1 Cor 15:19
- * Poor Spiritual poverty is the greatest poverty Mt 16:26; Lk 12:21
- * Blind Ignorance / He is blindest who will not see 2 Peter 1:9
- * Naked a condition of shame / without Christ 2 Cor 5:2-4

Revelation 3:18 (NKIV)

18 I counsel you to buy from Me gold refined in the fire, that you may be rich; and white garments, that you may be clothed, that the shame of your nakedness may not be revealed; and anoint your eyes with eye salve, that you may see.

Exhortation - (vss 18-19)

- * "Buy" Is 55:1; Prov 23:23
- * They needed to lay up REAL treasure Mat 6:19-21; 13:44-46
- * They needed to be clothed with purity and righteousness Rev 3:4,5; 7:13,14; 16:15; 19:8
- They needed spiritual sight –
 The truth 2 Thes 2:10-12; Col
 1:9,10; Ps 19:8; Jam 1:18-25

Revelation 3:19 (NKIV)

19 As many as I love, I rebuke and chasten.
Therefore be zealous and repent.

 Heb 12:6

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Revelation 3:20 (NKIV)

²⁰ Behold, I stand at the door and knock. If anyone hears My voice and opens the door, I will come in to him and dine with him, and he with Me.

Invitation - (vs 20)

- * The Lord wanted to save them
 - But they had to hear him James 1:21-25
 - They had to open the door James 4:7-10; 5:19;
 - The Lord desired to have fellowship with them 1 Joh 1:3
 - The same is true for us Rev 22:17; Mark 16:16; Gal 3:26,27

The Lord requires fervency -

- * In spirit. Rom 12:11.
- * In well-doing. Gal 4:18; Tit 2:14.
- * In desiring the salvation of others. Acts 26:29; Rom 10:1.
- * Contending for the faith. Jud 1:3
- * Evangelism. Rom 15:19,23.
- * Fighting against sin Num 25:11,13.
- * For the welfare of saints. Col 4:13.

- The lukewarm put forth little effort for the cause of Christ THEREFORE:
 - * Things go undone
- * Work is not completed
- * The tendency to cut back is advanced
- * Lax in preserving the purity of the church
- * Other members in the church Are Discouraged

The Lord knew their true spiritual condition -

- * They lived in physical comfort but spiritually they were wretched.
- * Others envied their luxuries, thinking they were happy but spiritually they were miserable.
- * They were respected by the world because of their wealth but spiritually they were poor.
- * They boasted of their wisdom but yet spiritually they were blind.
- * Their wealth was gained primarily by making clothing but spiritually they were naked.



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hear what the Spirit says to the churches."

- * How different Christ's estimate of them, from their own estimate,
- * Doubtless there will be many in hell that thought themselves to be on their way to heaven.
- * Let us daily beg of God that we may not flatter and deceive ourselves in the concerns of our souls. - 2 Cor 13:5





- * How do we see ourselves?
- * What is our true condition?
- * What is our need?
